

1 [Urging the City and County of San Francisco to Support and/or Fund SFUSD Class of 2021  
2 Senior Activities]

4 **Resolution urging the Board of Supervisors to save San Francisco Unified School**  
5 **District (SFUSD) Senior Class of 2021 activities by providing support, funds and/or city**  
6 **resources; and if allowable under current health orders, to be made available to SFUSD**  
7 **Seniors for senior specific activities.**

9 WHEREAS, On March 16, 2020, Six Bay Area counties announced “shelter in place”  
10 orders for all residents in an effort to slow the rapidly spreading coronavirus across the region  
11 that included the closure of all schools; and

12 WHEREAS, San Francisco Unified School District remains in remote-learning while the  
13 City’s two largest parochial high schools, Sacred Heart Cathedral Preparatory and St. Ignatius  
14 Preparatory have resumed in-person classes for many of their students; and

15 WHEREAS, Majority of San Francisco’s private schools have begun to provide their  
16 seniors with opportunities to take senior portraits, purchase announcements, class rings and  
17 letterman jackets, etc.; and

18 WHEREAS, Many of the private schools are being proactive in planning senior events  
19 like prom and graduation around the state and local guidelines; and

20 WHEREAS, This Resolution seeks to provide financial support and city resources to  
21 San Francisco Unified School District (SFUSD) Senior Class of 2021; now, therefore, be it

22 **RESOLVED**, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors, through the Joint City,  
23 School District and City College Select Committee, to coordinate with the Mayor’s Office,  
24 Human Rights Commission, Department of Children, Youth and Their Families, Department of  
25 Public Health, San Francisco School Board and SFUSD Student Advisory Board and Parent  
Advisory Council to create an itemized list of goods and activities that are allowable under

1 current state and local public health guidelines; that would require funding and/or to support  
2 SFUSD Senior Class of 2021 activities; and, be it

3 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisor urges the Department of  
4 Children, Youth, and Their Families, Human Rights Commission, Recreation and Parks  
5 Department, and Department of Public Health to review their current capacity, infrastructure,  
6 and funding, to determine whether or not they could support a City coordinated effort for the  
7 SFUSD Senior Class of 2021; and, be it

8 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco values its students  
9 and believes the SFUSD Senior Class of 2021 needs public funding and support to  
10 adequately conclude their secondary education.
