| 7 | WHEREAS, As a result of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, San Francisco public |
| 8 | schools have been closed since March 16, 2020; and |
| 9 | WHEREAS, The San Francisco Unified School District (SFUSD) serves nearly 54,000 |
| 10 | students across 128 school sites, more than half of whom qualify for federal free or reduced- |
| 11 | cost lunch benefits; and |
| 12 | WHEREAS, Educators have had worked tirelessly to bridge learning divides and adapt |
| 13 | to the complexities of delivering curriculum through distance-learning; and |
| 14 | WHEREAS, SFUSD students are struggling academically, emotionally, and physically, |
| 15 | with increasing rates of anxiety and obesity, and |
| 16 | WHEREAS, A group of San Francisco pediatricians warned in an editorial that every |
| 17 | month of inadequate education can have cumulative and long-term health consequences for a |
| 18 | child and will widen racial inequities; and |
| 19 | WHEREAS, The San Francisco Health Officer authorized schools for in-person |
| 20 | learning, on a rolling basis with approved safety plans on September 21, 2020; and |
| 21 | WHEREAS, All San Francisco schools must meet the minimum standards defined in |
| 22 | both state guidance and SFDPH's health directive on school reopening before resuming in- |
| 23 | person learning, including providing detailed plans on how they will ensure adequate testing |
| 24 | and contact tracing for their staff and students; and |
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| 1 | WHEREAS, There is strong consensus amongst public health experts, including Dr. |

| 2 | Fauci and CDC Director Redfield, that schools can operate in person learning in a safe and |
| 3 | responsible way, and opening schools should be the highest priority for any jurisdiction; and |
| 4 | WHEREAS, New recommendations from the Centers for Disease Control place high |
| 5 | priority on keeping schools open, from kindergarten through 12th grade, saying schools |
| 6 | should be both "the last settings to close" and "the first to reopen" because of the critical role |
| 7 | they play in providing meals and support services to children; and |
| 8 | WHEREAS, CDC guidance is clear that school closures take a disproportionate toll on |
| 9 | low-income families; and |
| 10 | WHEREAS, The San Francisco Board of Education passed a resolution directing the |
| 11 | Superintendent to begin reopening in person instruction and services for preschool students, |
| 12 | elementary grade students with moderate to severe disabilities, and all other students in |
| 13 | grades TK-1 including students in general education no later than January 25, 2021, and to |
| 14 | provide a schedule for full elementary reopening by December 8th, 2020; and |
| 15 | WHEREAS, The District's Return Plan 2020-21 would only return a few thousand |
| 16 | children to schools by March 22, 2021, more than an entire year after schools closed; and |
| 17 | WHEREAS, The District's Return Plan does not include any crucial return to school |
| 18 | timetable for third to fifth grade students, or any middle school and high school students; and |
| 19 | WHEREAS, The San Francisco Board of Supervisors is considering a resolution (File |
| 20 | 201335) urging Governor Gavin Newsom and state health officials to prioritize teachers as |
| 21 | essential workers, making them eligible for the first phase of coronavirus vaccines in early |
| 22 | 2021; and |
| 23 | WHEREAS, On December 7, Assemblymember Phil Ting introduced AB10 requiring |
| 24 | public schools to reopen under most circumstances during the pandemic when infection rates |
| 25 | drop; now, therefore, be it |

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| 2 | Unified School District to revise the Return to School Plan in accordance with the public health |
