7	WHEREAS, Organized labor plays a vital role in creating and defending fair labor
8	standards to prevent unnecessary poverty for working families and the San Francisco Board
9	of Supervisors is a supporter of organized labor both domestically and abroad; and
10	WHEREAS, San Francisco currently and historically has been a union town that stands
11	in solidarity with labor struggles both domestically and abroad and the San Francisco Board of
12	Supervisors is strongly committed to Organized Labor's right to exist and to organize; and,
13	WHEREAS, On October 10, 2009 the Mexican government militarily occupied power
14	plants in central Mexico to lock out 44,000 thousand electrical workers; and
15	WHEREAS, President Felipe Calderon closed the public utility company Luz y Fuerza
16	del Centro in an effort to break the Mexican Electricians Union (SME) and to privatize Mexican
17	energy to sell to transnational corporations; and
18	WHEREAS, The attempt to unilaterally destroy the Mexican Electricians Union,
19	disregarding their legally binding labor contract and labor laws, is an extreme human rights
20	violation and a threat to all organized labor in Mexico and internationally; and,
21	WHEREAS, The San Francisco Labor Council, with support from the South Bay AFL-
22	CIO Labor Council, Santa Clara County Building Trades Council, Plumbers & Fitters Local
23	393, UFCW 5, many other unions and councils, MAIZ Movimiento de Accion Inspirando
24	Servicio and many other community organizations, have sponsored the Mexican Electricians
25	Union's tour seeking solidarity with unions in California; now, therefore, be it

4	Inspirando and condemns the violent aggression that Mexican President Felipe Calderon and

8	Felipe Calderon and the Mexican Federal Government to immediately re-instate the workers
9	of the Mexican Electricians Union and remove all military and police personnel from the
