

1 [Appointment, Transbay Joint Powers Authority - Alicia John-Baptiste]

3 **Motion appointing Alicia John-Baptiste (residency requirement waived), for an**  
4 **indefinite term, to the Transbay Joint Powers Authority.**

6 MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco does  
7 hereby appoint the following designated person to serve as a member of the Transbay Joint  
8 Powers Authority, pursuant to the provisions of California Government Code, Sections 6502  
9 et. seq., and Board of Supervisors Resolution Nos. 104-01 and 393-17:

10 Alicia John-Baptiste (residency requirement waived), seat 3, succeeding Nadia Sesay,  
11 must have expertise in large, complex infrastructure funding, policy and/or project delivery, for  
12 an indefinite term; and, be it

13 FURTHER MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors makes the following findings:

- 14 1. The membership of the Transbay Joint Powers Authority has a goal to be  
15 representative of the diversity of the City and County of San Francisco.
- 16 2. Applicant Alicia John-Baptiste, who is not a resident of San Francisco, is a person with  
17 experience that uniquely qualifies them to serve on the Transbay Joint Powers  
18 Authority.
- 19 3. The Transbay Joint Powers Authority has attempted to fill the position, for which Alicia  
20 John-Baptiste was nominated, with an individual who is City a resident and who has  
21 the specific experience, skills, and qualifications, but has been unable to do so at this  
22 time. The Rules Committee has certified that Alicia John-Baptiste, is qualified to serve  
23 on the Transbay Joint Powers Authority.
- 24 4. After exercising due diligence, the Board of Supervisors concludes that there is no  
25 other possible representatives, who is a resident of San Francisco, and who has the

1 specific experience, skills, or qualifications possessed by this applicant, and who is  
2 willing to serve on the Transbay Joint Powers Authority at this time; and, be it

3 FURTHER MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors waives the residency requirement  
4 for Alicia John-Baptiste, as allowed in cases where no qualified City resident, willing to serve,  
5 can be found, pursuant to Charter, Section 4.101(a)(2), that requires person(s) appointed to  
6 boards, commissions, and advisory bodies established by legislative act of the Board of  
7 Supervisors to be resident(s) of the City and County of San Francisco.
