I was born and raised in a working-class, Puerto Rican family and community in Springfield, Massachusetts. Growing up, I saw every day the ways our economy failed low-wage workers and the inadequacy of our social safety net. Without enough money, the people I loved had to work twice as hard to make ends meet each month. Many times, they could not. Systemic racism, sexism, and other forms of oppression coupled with economic exclusion denied my family and neighbors the opportunity to become economically secure. These experiences are directly tied to the question of a guaranteed income – how do we design a system that gets money into the hands of the people who need it most, and helps dismantle the systems of exclusion that characterize our economy and plague our city and country? As a resident of the Mission, I also see daily how hard my neighbors work while barely being able to make ends meet in our city. I know that giving them cash would give them some breathing room to focus on the many other important aspects of our lives.

Business and/or professional experience:

I am the economic justice policy director for SPUR, a research nonprofit committed to building a thriving and equitable San Francisco. In this capacity I have researched and assessed various cash transfer and guaranteed income programs with a particular focus on how targeted cash transfers can help close the racial income gap and secure economic stability for low-income people. Prior to joining SPUR, I was the director of policy and research for the Insight Center, a national racial and economic justice public policy organization. At Insight I explored the various ways in which guaranteed income could help provide economic stability to Black workers in the American South. I also co-founded the Economic Justice Project at the Southern Poverty Law Center, where we confronted the systems that punished people because of their economic status. I served 13 years in the military. While in the service I went six months without receiving dependent benefits because I was not married. At the time I only ate top ramen because that is all I could aford. I was a Sergeant at San Quentin for eight years. The salary was decent but I had an up front and personal view of how much poverty effected people and the direct correlation between crime and poverty. In 2012 I was arrested for marijuana, diagnosed with a deadly blood disease and lost my home. I ended up couch surfing, and kicked out of two apartments because I had a dog. During this time I also lived in a renovated garage but had to give that up because I could not afford the rent. I went to a Tech school but they did not offer internships to the women participants. After that I went to Salesforce training but I could not pass the certification. The only jobs that would hire me after being arrested for marijuana were delivery driver jobs which I did up to December of 2019. Even Uber would not hire me. Since the pandemic I have been to scared to deliver packages to people. I periodically apply to jobs, including City jobs, but no one will hire me.

My father's familiy immigrated to San Francisco in 1946, moving to 3rd and Jerrold in Bayview Hunters Point. My mother and I were born in San Francisco. I was born and raised in the Mission, and lived half my life in the Bayview, where I raised my children. We only left the Bayview 6 years ago when we were displaced from our home we rented there. We now live in the barrio of South San Francisco, but still spend most days in the Mission or the Bayview. My father and I graduated from Mission High School and my mother graduated from Galileo HS.

I grew up in poverty, though I have never felt a lack for anything. While I know well the government commodity foods in a can, I have never known hunger. My wife grew up poor inthe Mission; we met at Mission HS. Together, we are the firsts in our families to go to college, firsts to buy a house in our families, first to emerge from poverty. Unfortunately, many of my loved ones and relatives are still poor. My two sisters and brother are all currently surviving on disability checks.

For San Francisco, and for poor folks in SF, I would be willing to serve on this new advisory body. However: if there are strong candidates who have lived in poverty and still live in poverty, I would support their candidacy, first. I know it is a privilege to serve in this way, but I also know it's easier to serve on voluntary bodies when one has privilege, as I currently do. If there is someone currently living in poverty who understands poverty in SF who wants to serve, I think their candidacy should be considered and supported.

Board Qualifications:

The Guaranteed Income Advisory Group (the "Advisory Group") was established to advise the Board of Supervisors, the Mayor, and appropriate City departments, commissions, boards, groups, agencies, and the public regarding the Guaranteed Income (also known as Universal Basic Income) Program. The Guaranteed Income Program is an income-distribution program that provides individuals with a fixed amount of money each month to cover basic living expenses to prevent people from becoming poor or remaining in poverty, and consequently to promote a more just society.

The Advisory Group shall consist of eleven voting members, appointed as follows:

- > Seats 1, 2, and 3 shall each be held by a person with expertise in economics, finance, political science, or public policy, and with experience researching and analyzing Guaranteed Income programs, appointed by the Board of Supervisors.
- > Seat 4 shall be held by a person who has personally experienced poverty while living in San Francisco, appointed by the Board of Supervisors.
- > Seat 5 shall be held by a person under the age of 24 at the time of appointment who has personally experienced poverty, appointed by the Board of Supervisors.
- > Seats 6, 7 and 8 shall each be held by a person with professional experience serving low-income individuals, families, or youth, and with training and expertise in social, racial, or gender equity, intersectional problem-solving, or cultural humility, appointed by the Board of Supervisors.
- > Seat 9 shall be held by an employee of the Office of the Treasurer and Tax Collector,

appointed by the Treasurer.

> Seat 10 shall be held by an employee of the San Francisco Human Rights Commission ("HRC"), appointed by the Executive Director of HRC.

> Seat 11 shall be held by an employee of the Human Services Agency ("HSA"), appointed by the Executive Director of HSA.

Seats 1 through 8 may not be held by employees of the City and County of San Francisco.

Members shall serve indefinite terms unless removed by the appointing authority.

The Office of the Treasurer and Tax Collector shall provide administrative and clerical support for the Advisory Group.

Reports: By no later than December 1, 2021, the Advisory Group shall submit to the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor a final report summarizing its research, findings, and recommendations on the topics set forth in subsection (a), and any additional findings and recommendations that the Advisory Group concludes advances its goals and fulfills its duties.

Sunset: The Advisory Group shall terminate on January 23, 2023, unless extended by ordinance.
