LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Budget line item for Police Department dignitary security.]

Motion ordering submitted to the voters an ordinance requiring the City's annual budget to include an appropriation for the Police Department's expenditures on security for City officials and dignitaries at an election to be held on June 8, 2010.

Existing Law

Under the City Charter, the Police Commission must approve the proposed annual budget for the Police Department for submission to the Mayor. The Mayor has final authority to initiate, prepare and submit the annual proposed budget to the Board of Supervisors. Local law does not require that the Police Department's budget include a specific line item for expenditures on security provided by the Department to City officials and dignitaries.

Amendments to Current Law

The motion would place a measure on the ballot at the June 2010 election that would require the annual budget approved by the Police Commission and submitted by the Mayor to include a line item for funds appropriated to provide security to City officials and visiting dignitaries.

Background Information

Under Charter Sections 4.126 and 4.127, the Chief of Police has the responsibility to manage the Police Department and to preserve the public peace, prevent and detect crime, and protect the rights of persons and property. Under this authority, the Chief of Police may deploy Police Department personnel and resources, within the constraints of the Police Department's overall budget, to provide necessary security in the course of the fiscal year.
