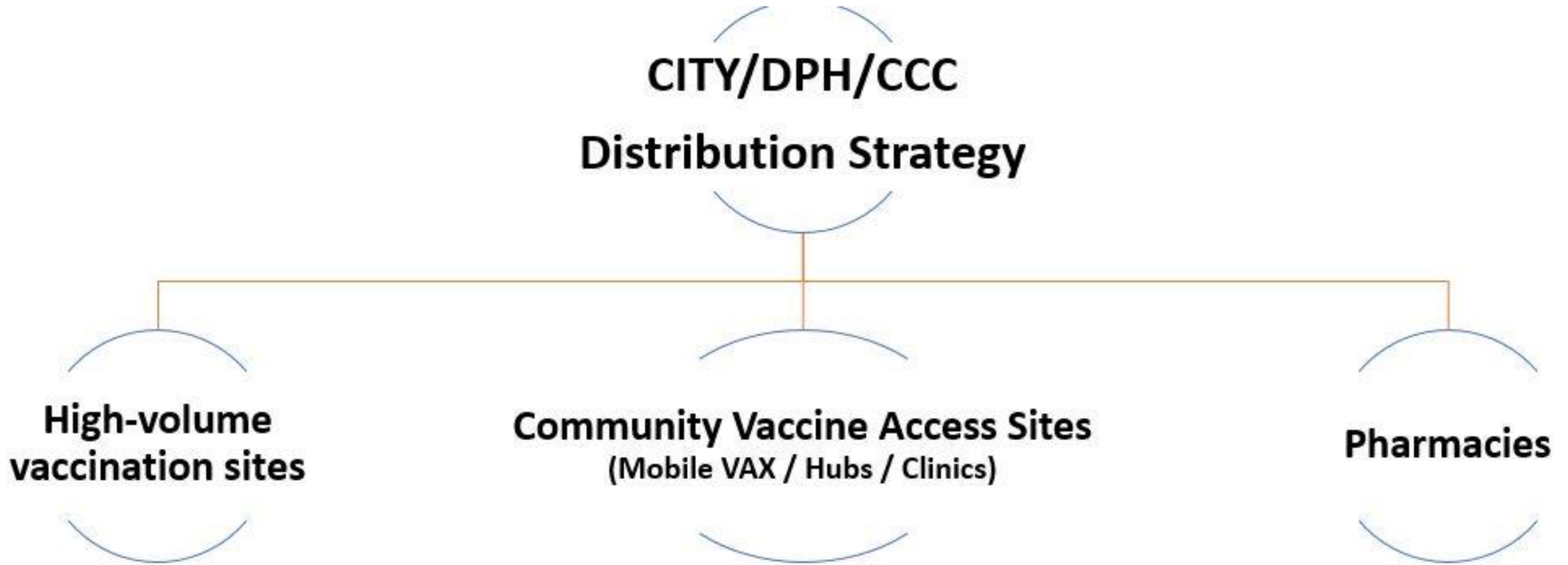
Vaccinating SF: Shots in arms

# vaccines administered by DPH	32,681	24,911	7,770

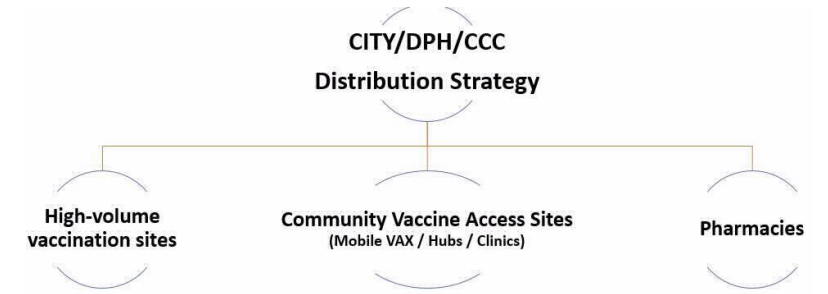

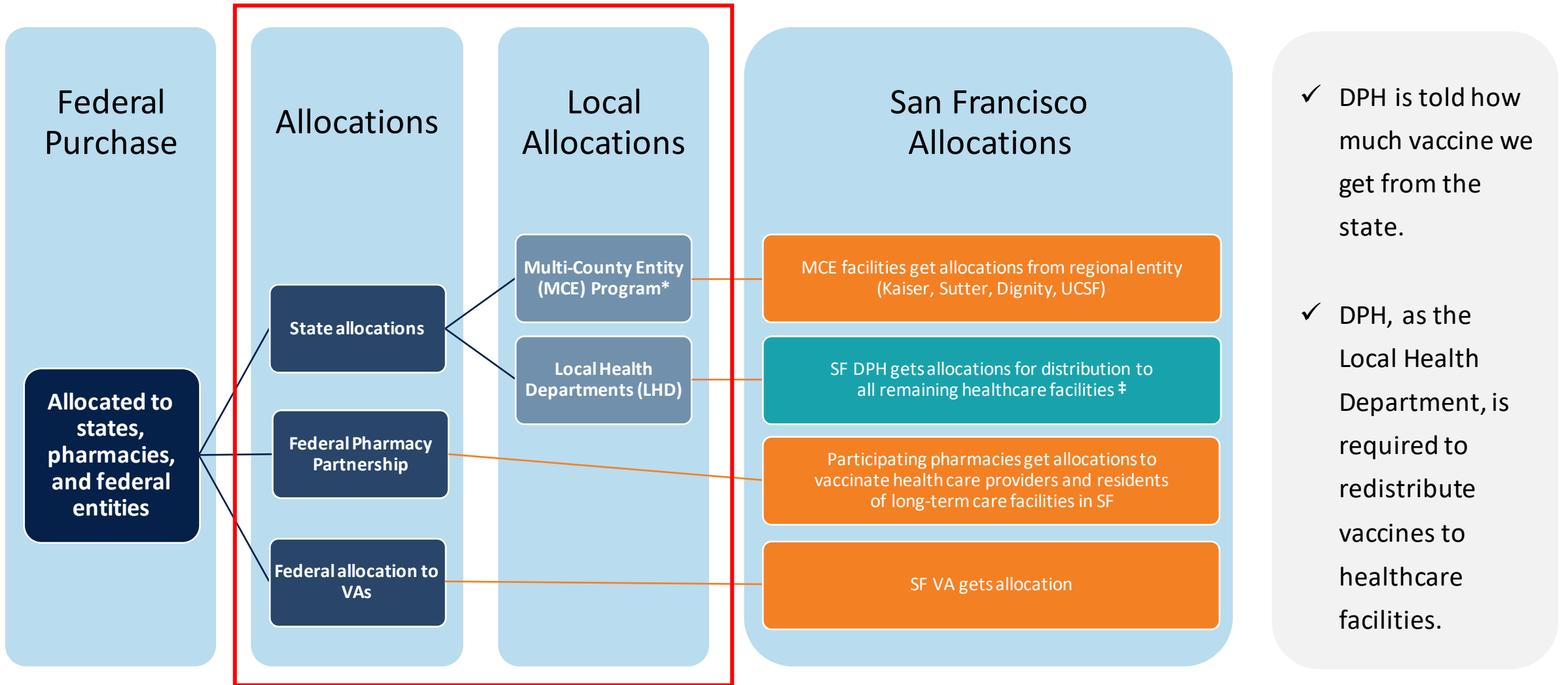

Site Selection Process

- Alignment with DPH vaccine strategy
- Prioritization of highly-impacted SF neighborhoods/populations
- Daily and weekly capacity and outstanding inventory assessment
- Commitment to ongoing, sustainable vaccination
- Ability to vaccinate priority populations other than their patients

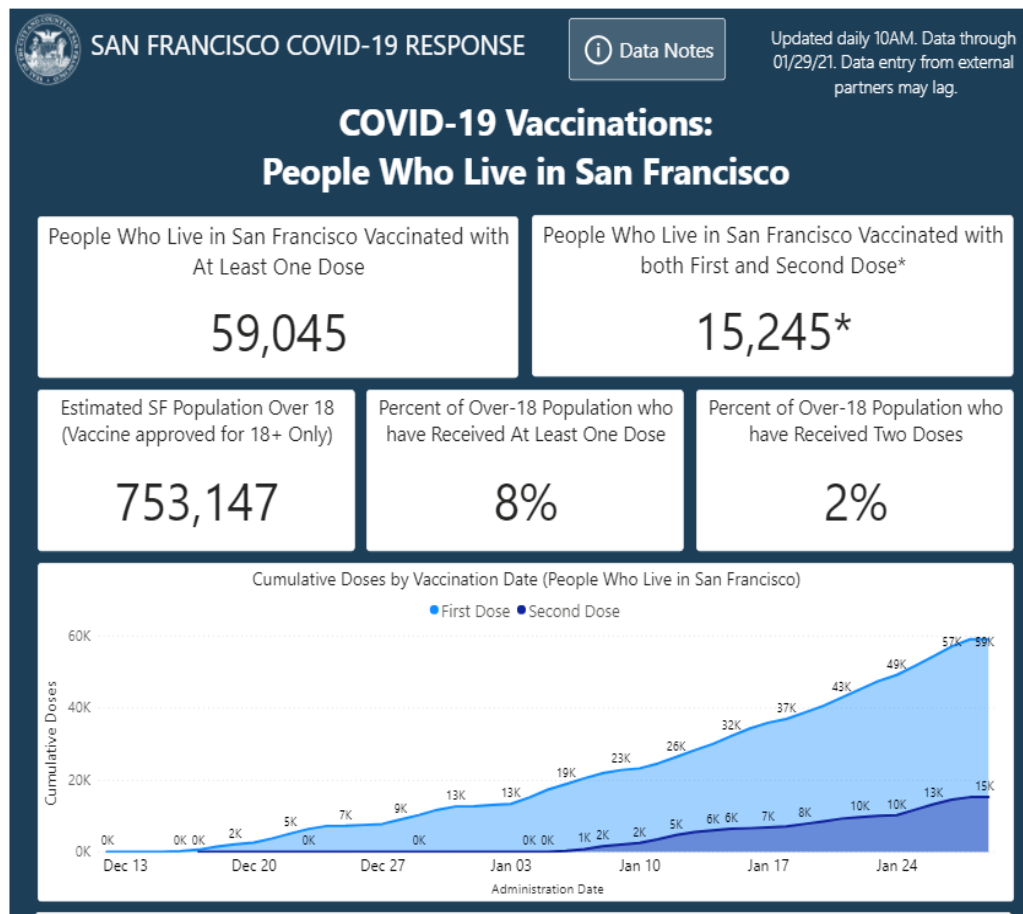
Vaccine Allocation Process

‡ SFDPH currently has visibility into this allocation only.

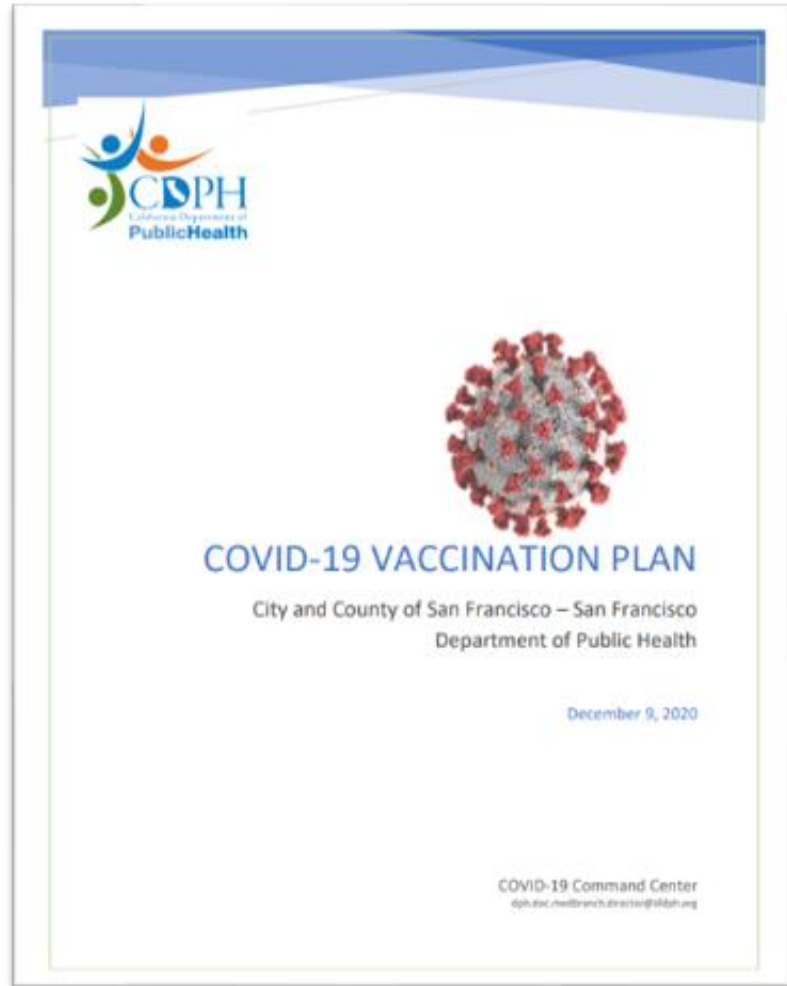
Dashboard Update: Vaccinations in San Francisco

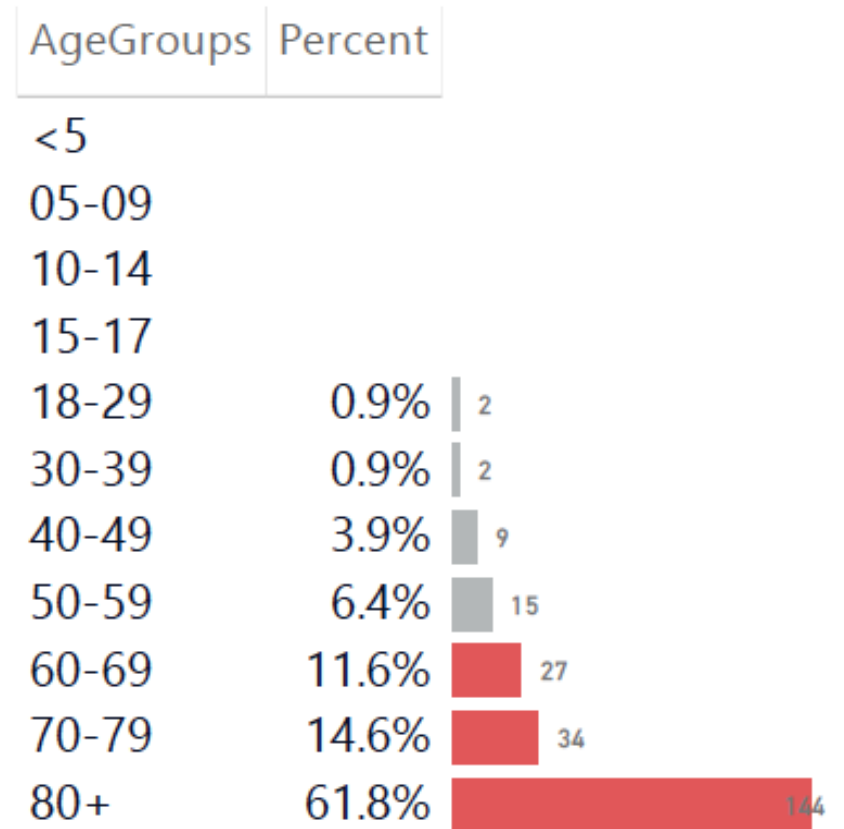
Phases of Vaccine Rollout

California's allocation plan is based on a phased approach while the vaccine is in limited supply.

Distribution will adjust as volume of the vaccine increases

- Current state: Phase 1a — Limited doses available / As of Jan 14.
 - Highly targeted administration to achieve coverage in priority populations
 - 65+, w/ 75+ highest priority.
 - Goal: Reach initial critical populations
- Future state — Large number of doses available
 - Sufficient supply to meet demand; shift to routine strategy
 - Goal: Reach general population and ensure access

Age distribution of those dying of Covid-19 in SF (median age 82)



83% of deaths in those 65 or older

California's Phases 1b and 1c (subject to change)



Phase 1b

Tier 1

- Individuals 75 and older
- Those at risk of exposure at work in the following sectors:
 - education
 - childcare
 - emergency services
 - food and agriculture

State announced individuals 65 and older now eligible to receive vaccines

Tier 2

- Individuals 65-74 years of age
- Those at risk of exposure at work in the following sectors:
 - transportation and logistics
 - industrial, commercial, residential, and sheltering facilities and services
 - critical manufacturing
 - congregate settings with outbreak risk: incarcerated and homeless

Phase 1c

- Individuals 50 -64 years of age
- People 16-49 years of age and have an underlying health condition or disability which increases their risk of severe COVID-19
- Those at risk of exposure at work in the following sectors:
 - water and wastewater
 - defense
 - energy
 - chemical and hazardous materials
 - communications and IT
 - financial services
 - government operations / community-based essential functions
