14	Section 1. Findings				
15	(a)	The Public [Defender's Office applied for funding from the Metta Fund		
16	Foundation and was awarded \$166,981.50 on November 4, 2009. The purpose of the grant				
17	funding is to hire a Social Worker/Employment Specialist to assist Public Defender clients with				
18	mental illness in securing employment through the evidence-based practice of Supported				
19	Employment.				
20	(b)	The goal of	the Supported Employment program is to expedite the process of		
21	securing employment for the mentally ill offender population, expand the network of job				
22	possibilities	, and reach a	wider range of indigent mentally ill people than the Office of the		
23	Public Defender is currently capable of serving. The Supported Employment model has				
24	shown empirical success in other jurisdictions and is a key component of long-term recovery				
25	for mentally ill offenders. A meta-analysis of 11 randomized controlled trial studies for				

Supervisor Mirkarimi BOARD OF SUPERVISORS Supported Employment programs found that the competitive employment rate was 61% for
 those in Supported Employment versus 23% for control groups. Providing Supported
 Employment opportunities to clients of the Public Defender who are diagnosed with a mental
 illness will lead to long term recovery, reduce recidivism, psychiatric hospitalizations, and jail
 bed days.
