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[Accept and Expend Gift - Hayes Valley Playground Project - \$1,500,000]

Resolution accepting and expending a gift valued up to \$1,500,000 from The Trust for Public Land to the Recreation and Parks Department for the Hayes Valley Playground project.

WHEREAS, The City owns real property located in Hayes Valley on Block 819, Lot 26 know as Hayes Valley Playground; and

WHEREAS, The City, through the Recreation and Park Department, owns and operates Hayes Valley Playground and has a compelling need to renovate and maintain its facility so that its residents, guest, and especially its children have a safe and aesthetically pleasing environment where they can play and be immersed in culturally enriching programs; and

WHEREAS, The Trust for Public Land, a national, non-profit conservation organization is proposing to partially fund improvements to the Hayes Valley Playground as gift ("Gift"), valued up to \$1,500,000, to the City and County of San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, The terms and conditions of the Gift, including cross-indemnification provisions, are detailed in an Agreement between the City and County of San Francisco and The Trust for Public Land; and

WHEREAS, Through a series of community meetings, conceptual plans for the improvements at Hayes Valley Playground were developed and approved by the Recreation and Park Commission on September 18, 2008, under resolution No. 0809-019 ("Commission Resolution"); and

WHEREAS, Under the aforementioned Commission Resolution, the Recreation and Park Commission recommends to the Board of Supervisors to accept and expend the Gift; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department to accept and expend the Gift valued up to \$1,500,000 from The Trust for Public Land for the renovation of Hayes Valley Playground.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

City and County of San Francisco Recreation and Park Department and Trust for Public Land

RENOVATION OF HAYES VALLEY PLAYGROUND

RECITALS

- A. The City, through the Recreation and Park Department, operates and maintains real property at Block 0819, Lot 026, on Hayes and Buchanan Street in San Francisco that is described on Exhibit A attached hereto, and is commonly referred to as "Hayes Valley Playground" ("Property"). The upper terrace of the Property, that is bound by Hayes Street to the north, Linden Street to the South, and Buchanan Street to the East, which comprises the main entry, a clubhouse building, and a developed children's play area, is referred to as the "Project Site." The property is under the jurisdiction of the Recreation and Park Commission ("Commission"). See Exhibit A Project Location.
- B. In support of the development of the Project Site, TPL co-sponsored a series of public workshops with RPD to develop a community-supported conceptual plan. At a community workshop held on August 14, 2008 TPL and RPD presented the final conceptual improvement plan ("Conceptual Plan") for the renovation of Hayes Valley Playground. At that meeting the Conceptual Plan was supported by the community participants to renovate the Hayes Valley Playground to provide a safe, functional and aesthetically pleasing environment for pre-school and school-age children of all abilities and adults. Components of the plan include two age-specific playgrounds, an adult fitness area, landscaping, garden, and renovation of the clubhouse, which includes restroom facilities. See Exhibit B Conceptual Plan.
- C. In its continued support for the Project Site, TPL is offering to provide a gift-in-place ("Gift"), valued at up to \$1,500,000 towards the planning, management and construction of improvements ("Improvements") to the Project Site based on the Conceptual Plan. This Gift includes funding for (a) plans and specifications for the Improvements based on the Conceptual Plan and in response to City review and project budget, (b) project management and construction management services to implement the Gift, and (c) construction of certain areas of the plans and specifications, as determined in a future Agreement with the City prior to construction, to implement the Gift.
- D. On ______, 2008, Resolution (XXX) the Commission recommended to the Board of Supervisors of the City ("Board") that the City accept the Gift.

E. The primary funding sources for the Project will be both private and public funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, subject to and effective upon the Board's acceptance of the Gift (the "Effective Date"), the Parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. TPL will provide the following:
 - a. Art Commission approval for Civic Design Review.
 - b. Detailed construction documents for the Project, reviewed by and subject to approval by RPD. TPL will provide (3) full size sets and a CD of the final construction documents signed by a licensed landscape architect to RPD.
 - c. TPL shall be responsible for obtaining any permit necessary to construct the Improvements, provided, however, that RPD shall cooperate with TPL to the extent reasonably practical and shall provide TPL with such reasonable assistance as requested by TPL.
- 2. RPD shall provide to TPL the following for the Project:
 - a. Commit \$650,000 from the FY 08-09 General Fund allocation and \$1,000,000 from the FY 09-10 General Fund allocation towards, but not limited to, construction of the Improvements and associated costs subject to the budgetary provisions of the San Francisco Charter. Parties acknowledge that the availability of the General Fund allocation is subject to future action(s) by the Board of Supervisors. Should the FY 09-10 General Fund allocation be reduced in whole or in part, TPL and the City will meet to revisit the scope of the Improvements and prepare a strategy for a mutually agreeable solution to project implementation.
 - b. Conceptual Plan as approved by the Commission.
 - Coordination for Recreation and Park Commission and Board of Supervisors reviews.
- 3. Prior to design development of the Project, TPL and RPD will enter into a separate Agreement specifying the terms under which construction, construction management, and final acceptance will occur thereon, which shall include the necessary protections for the City such as bonds, insurance and indemnification and shall require the payment of prevailing wages for all non-volunteer workers.
- 4. TPL agrees that in any contract(s) it enters into for the construction of the Improvements, the City shall be named as the third party beneficiary of the work.
- 5. RPD will be responsible for the maintenance of the Project after final acceptance of the Improvements in accordance with Proposition C maintenance standards.
- 6. The RPD reserves the right to remove or alter the site improvements at its sole discretion.

- 7. TPL shall maintain in force, during the full term of this MOU, insurance in the following amounts of coverage:
 - A. Workers Compensation, with Employer's liability limits no less that \$1,000,000 each accident.
 - B. Comprehensive General Liability Insurance with limits no less than \$1,000,000 each occurrence Combined Single Limit for Bodily Injury and Property Damage.
 - C. Business Automobile Liability Insurance with not less that \$1,000,000 each occurrence Combined Single Limit for Bodily Injury and Property Damage.
 - D. Professional Liability Insurance with limits not less than \$1,000,000 each occurrence with respect to negligent acts and errors and omissions, arising form performance and services under this Agreement.

Insurance companies shall be legally authorized to engage in the business of furnishing insurance in the State of California. All insurance companies shall have a current A.M. Best rating not less than "A-, VIII" and shall be satisfactory to the City.

Comprehensive General Liability and Business Automobile Liability Insurance policies shall be endorsed to provide the following:

- A. Name Additional Insured the City and County of San Francisco, its Officers, Agents, and Employees.
- B. That such policies are primary insurance to any other insurance available to the Additional Insured's, with respect to any claims arising out of the Contract, and that insurance applies separately to each insured against whom claim is made or suit is brought.
- C. Joint Ventures/Partnerships: Each participant in the joint venture/partnership must include the joint venture or partnership as Named Insured on each other of their separate policies, with respect only to the interests and activities of that participant in the joint venture or partnership.
- 8. Any party, upon written notice to the others, may terminate this MOU. Notice of termination shall be provided to each Party at the addresses below. The Parties addresses for purposes of such notices are:

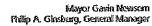

EXHIBIT A: MAP SHOWING PROJECT LOCATION

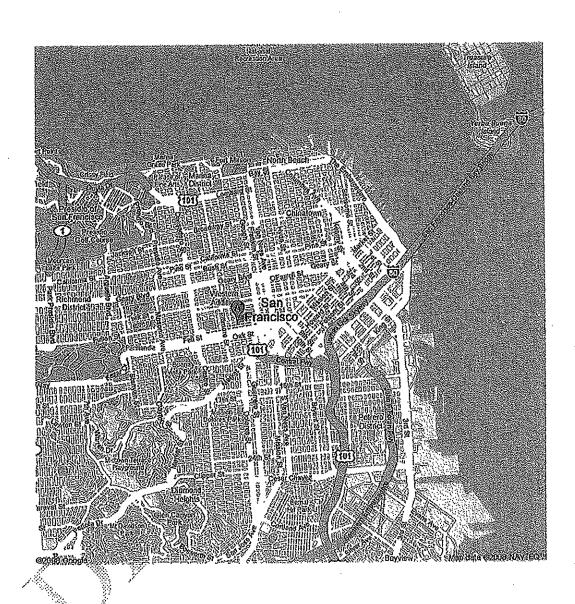
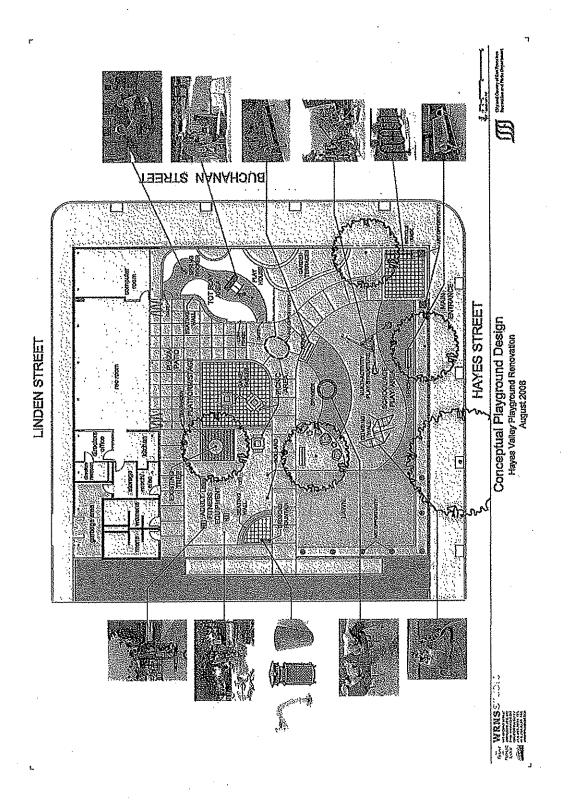
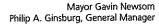


EXHIBIT B: CONCEPTUAL PLAN
