Resolution recognizing the Bay Area Air Quality Management for their support of San Francisco's efforts to promote environmentally preferable garment cleaning technologies among local dry cleaners.

[Resolution Recognizing the Bay Area Air Quality Management District]

WHEREAS, Perchloroethylene (Perc), identified by the California Air Resources Board (CARB) as one of the top ten toxic air contaminants that contribute most to statewide cancer risk, is the most commonly used dry cleaning solvent; and,

WHEREAS, Perc is being phased out in the Bay Area through an air quality regulation adopted by the BAAQMD; and,

WHEREAS, 54 local dry-cleaning facilities currently use Perc based cleaning systems and will need to switch to non-Perc alternatives starting as early as July 2010; and,

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Department of the Environment (Department) completed an extensive assessment of alternatives to Perc and determined that, professional wet cleaning and CO₂ cleaning systems are the least toxic, non-smog forming technologies; and,

WHEREAS, Other available alternatives to Perc cleaning pose variable environmental and human health impacts; and,

WHEREAS, The Department's analysis found that CO₂ cleaning systems are expensive and unavailable for purchase by local businesses, and the Wet Cleaning technology is readily available and at comparable cost to current cleaning systems used by San Francisco businesses; and,

Page 1 3/18/2010 WHEREAS, There is currently only a single exclusive wet cleaning facility in San Francisco; and,

WHEREAS, The Department has been actively promoting professional wet cleaning through multi-lingual outreach and a grant program that offers financial assistance to local cleaners converting to wet cleaning; and,

WHEREAS, The BAAQMD is the public agency entrusted with regulating stationary air pollution sources in the San Francisco bay area region that includes garment cleaners; and,

WHEREAS, The BAAQMD mission is to protect and improve public health, air quality, and the global climate, through regulation, enforcement, incentives and educational programs; and,

WHEREAS, The BAAQMD is supporting the Department's efforts to increase adoption of environmentally preferable garment cleaning in San Francisco: now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Board of Supervisors commends the efforts of the BAAQMD for taking steps to protect public health and air quality in San Francisco through financial and staff support to the City of San Francisco that will help promote and establish wet cleaning options for local residents.
