10	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

12	Section 1. Article XIX of Chapter 5 of the Administrative Code is hereby amended by
13	revising Sections 5.19-1, 5.19-2, 5.19-5, and 5.19-8, to read as follows:
14	
15	SEC. 5.19-1. ESTABLISHMENT AND PURPOSE – FAMILY VIOLENCE COUNCIL.
16	(a) Establishment. A Family Violence Council for the City and County of San
17	Francisco (referred to in this Article XIX as "Council") is hereby established as an advisory
18	body to the Board of Supervisors.
19	(b) Purpose. The Council is established to advise and submit recommendations to
20	the Board of Supervisors that address the problems of family violence. Family violence
21	includes child abuse, domestic violence, and elder/dependent adult abuse. The Council may
22	also advise the courts of the City and County and the Mayor by submitting recommendations
23	to improve the response by departments to family violence and abuse. The general purposes
24	of the Council shall be the following:

- (2) Recommend programs and policies that promote communication and coordination of City and community-based organizations' services relating to child abuse, domestic violence, and elder/dependent adult abuse.
- (3) Recommend programs, policies, and coordination of City services to the Board of Supervisors and Mayor that may reduce the incidence of family violence in San Francisco. *and its disproportionate impact on people of color*.

14 SEC. 5.19-2. FAMILY VIOLENCE COUNCIL – DUTIES.

The duties of the Council shall be the following:

* * * *

- (g) Collect, compile, and analyze public information regarding arrest and restraining order enforcement policies; screening and prosecution of cases; issuances of protective orders; identifying family violence in other legal proceedings; and monitoring offenders after judgment; and other relevant data as needed; and to the extent possible, analyze and present such data disaggregated by race, ethnicity, sex, gender identity, age, sexual orientation, and other relevant traits;
- (h) Collect, compile, and analyze public information relating to programs for victims of family violence and services provided for abusers on probation; *and to the extent possible*,

3	(i) Establish a process to solicit and gather feedback and recommendations from the
4	communities most impacted by family violence on policies, services, and programs intended to assist

8	$(j\underline{k})$ Respond to inquiries of the Board of Supervisors made consistent with the duties

11	SEC. 5.19-5. FAMILY VIOLENCE COUNCIL – COMPOSITION – TERMS OF
12	OFFICE.
13	(a) Composition. The composition of the Council shall broadly represent the ethnic
14	racial, <u>sex</u> , gender <u>identity</u> , age, and sexual orientation diversity of the <u>City and Countythe</u>
15	communities most impacted by family violence. The Council shall consist of the following
16	individuals or their respective designees:
17	* * * *
18	(13) Executive Director of Safe & Sound; which operates the San Francisco Child
19	Abuse Prevention Council;
20	* * * *
21	(25) Director of the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing; and
22	(26) Executive Director of First 5 San Francisco-;
23	(27) Director of the Department of Police Accountability; and
24	(28) Executive Director of the Human Rights Commission.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

The Steering Committee shall have the authority to appoint up to three six additional members to the Council. Each such member shall have an interest in professional and/or lived experience in issues of family violence prevention or intervention, and shall represent the diversity of the communities most impacted by family violence and experience working in academia or the non-profit, medical, or business community. Each of these members shall serve for a term of one year at the pleasure of the Steering Committee.

SEC. 5.19-8. FAMILY VIOLENCE COUNCIL - SUNSET.

Unless the Board of Supervisors by ordinance extends the term of the Family Violence Council, this Article XIX shall expire by operation of law, and the *Committee Council* shall terminate, on May 1, 20244. After that date, the City Attorney shall cause this Article to be removed from the Administrative Code.

Section 2. Effective Date; Retroactivity.

- (a) This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
- (b) It is the intent of the Board of Supervisors that the Family Violence Council continue without interruption. Accordingly, in the event the effective date of this ordinance is

1	May 1, 2021 or thereafter, this ordinance shall be retroactive to May 1, 2021, and this Article
2	XIX shall not be deemed to have expired by operation of law on May 1, 2021.

4	Section 3. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors
5	intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles,
6	numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal
7	Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment
8	additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under
9	the official title of the ordinance.

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LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Administrative Code - Composition and Sunset Date of Family Violence Council]

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to change the composition of the Family Violence Council and extend the sunset date for the Council to May 1, 2024.

Existing Law

The Family Violence Council is an advisory body that makes recommendations to the Board of Supervisors, the Mayor, the Superior Court, and City departments regarding prevention and treatment of child abuse, domestic violence, and elder/dependent adult abuse. Among other duties, the Council recommends strategies to serve survivors of family violence, recommends methods of educating the public about family violence, compiles relevant data, and facilitates communication and cooperation between public and private agencies.

The Council has 26 designated seats, including three members representing community-based organizations who serve as the co-chairs of the Council and also serve as the members of the Steering Committee, a three-person committee that sets policy for the Council. The Steering Committee has discretion to appoint three additional members to the Council.

The Council is currently scheduled to terminate on May 1, 2021.

Amendments to Current Law

The proposed ordinance would add seats on the Council for the Director of the Department of Police Accountability and the Executive Director of the Human Rights Commission. The proposed ordinance would also authorize the Steering Committee to appoint up to six additional members to the Council, which members would be required to have professional and/or lived experience in issues of family violence prevention and represent the diversity of the communities most impacted by family violence.

Under Board of Supervisors Rules of Order, Rule 2.21, the ordinance would also provide that the Council will automatically sunset on May 1, 2024 unless extended in a subsequent ordinance.
