WHEREAS, The Department of Public Works ("DPW") has jurisdiction of a public right-of-way located in Bernal Heights on Ogden Avenue, between Prentiss and Nevada Streets ("ROW"); and

Resolution authorizing the Department of Recreation and Parks to retroactively accept

and expend a gift valued at \$88,000 from the San Francisco Conservation Corps, to

replace landscape retaining walls and steps at Ogden Terrace Community Garden.

San Francisco Conservation Corps is pleased to offer to construct \$88,000 worth of improvements at Ogden Terraces Community Garden. This project is funded by California State Proposition 84. The project is comprised of the following scope of work:

- Removal of (25) creosote steps locate on the southwest fence line.
- SFCC will replace the creosote steps with pressure treated lumber of similar size.
- Removal of (40) creosote timbers
- Installation of (2) 3' x 50' erosion control retaining walls (pressure treated lumber will be used as replacement).
- Back fill with 20 cubic yards of soil as needed.
- CCC requires signage of our work for 4 years (approximate dimension 18" x 20).


