 [Resolution reallocating state grant funds for capital projects in Golden Gate Park.]

Resolution authorizing the reallocation of \$2,067,663 in Proposition 40 grant funds among two capital projects in Golden Gate Park.

WHEREAS, On March 19, 2008, this Board of Supervisors adopted resolution No. 141-08, which is on file with the Clerk of the Board in File No. 080194, authorizing the Recreation and Park Department to reallocate \$11,928,060 of Proposition 40 (AB 716) state grant funds among specified capital improvement projects in Golden Gate Park; and,

WHEREAS, As of November 1, 2009, the Recreation and Park Department has expended or encumbered \$30,605,337 of the total grant amount; and,

WHEREAS, The Recreation and Park Commission has determined that funds allocated to three of the capital projects listed in resolution 141-08 (Children's Quarter Restroom and Birthday Area, General Irrigation Repair, and Stables) should be reallocated for one or more of the following reasons: 1) The project cannot be completed with funds available, 2) the project has alternate funding, or 3) the project cannot be completed prior to the date (December 31, 2010) upon which Proposition 40 funds are no longer available; and, WHEREAS, A total of \$2,067,663 can be re-allocated in designated amounts from Children's Quarter Restroom and Birthday Area: \$778,098; General Irrigation Repair: \$233,650; Stables: \$1,055,915; and,

WHEREAS, The Recreation and Park Commission would like to reallocate the \$2,067,663 to the Golden Gate Park Children's Quarter – Carousel Plaza in Golden Gate Park (\$1,176,775), and Roadway Paving – MLK Drive Repaving (\$890,888); and,

WHEREAS, The Recreation and Park Commission would like to authorize the General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department to reallocate any remaining funds to

Roadway Paving – MLK Drive Repaving, should any of the specified capital improvement projects listed in adopted resolution No. 100-04, which is on file with the Clerk of the Board File No. 040012, or any other capital improvement project receiving Proposition 40 (AB 716) state grant money does not require expenditure of its entire allocated portion that is still unspent and unencumbered; and,

WHEREAS, The Recreation and Park Commission, per resolution No. 0711-008, on November 1, 2007, in order to fully expend grant funds prior to expiration, approved a revised list of projects and reallocation amounts set forth above, including augmenting previously approved budgets and expending funds on alternate projects if necessary; and,

WHEREAS, The California Department of Parks and Recreation has been delegated the responsibility for the administration of the grant project; setting up necessary procedures; and,

WHEREAS, Said procedures established by the California Department of Parks and Recreation require the Grantee to certify by resolution the approval of the application(s) before submission of said application(s) to the State; and,

WHEREAS, The Grantee will enter into a contract with the State of California for subject project(s); and,

WHEREAS, The grant terms prohibit including indirect costs in the grant budget; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Recreation and Park Commission to re-appropriate, accept and expend grant funds in the amount of \$2,067,663 previously appropriated to the following three projects in Golden Gate park: 1) Children's Quarter Restroom and Birthday Area — \$778,098, 2) General Irrigation Repair — \$233,650, 3) Stables — \$1,055,915, and to reallocate those funds to Golden Gate Park Children's Quarter

Carousel Plaza in Golden Gate Park (\$1,176,775), and Roadway Paving – MLK Drive
 Repaving (\$890,888); and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That should the projects receiving Proposition 40 (AB 716) state grant money do not require expenditure of their entire allocated portion that is still unspent and unencumbered, the General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department shall have the authority to expend some or all of the remaining funds, in the amounts he or she deems appropriate, on Roadway Paving – MLK Drive Repaving; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the General Manager of the Recreation and Park

Department shall have the authority to reallocate funds on the above project to expend total

grant funds prior to expiration of the grant funds on December 31, 2010; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby approves the acceptance and expenditure of local assistance funds for the above project(s); and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors waives inclusion of indirect costs in the grant budget; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the General Manager, Recreation and Park Department as agent to conduct all negotiations, execute and submit documents including, but not limited to applications, agreements, payment requests and so on, which may be necessary for the completion of the aforementioned project(s).



RE: Board of Supervisor Resolution to reallocate Proposition 40 State Grant Funds from 3 Golden Gate Park projects to 2 alternative projects.

GGP was awarded \$32,673,000 in Prop 40 funds for 16 GGP Improvement Projects in 2004. In 2008, 4 projects had scopes that exceeded their available funding and could not be completed by the grant deadline. The \$11.9M reallocated from these four projects fortified or created budgets for 14 other GGP improvement projects (8 new projects). When the 2008 reallocation was approved, we had identified alternative projects that could be substituted if any current project had approval, schedule, or budget difficulties. These projects have received approval from the RP Commission and the City's Capital Planning Committee. Please see the page after the resolution for a breakdown of the reallocated projects and alternative projects.

Reallocated Projects: The GGP Stables project never raised the matching funding needed to complete a project as required by the grant. This project will just have a demolition phase which does constitute a complete project, but only uses a portion of the approved funds. The Children's Quarter Restroom is a phase of the approved playground master plan. Due to the historic context of the space and the need for this structure to also house birthday events, the budget was not sufficient. The third reallocated project is for GGP Irrigation Repair. With the upcoming PUC recycled water projects, this scope will be completed by PUC as part of their cross contamination scope.

Alternative Projects: The two projects to receive the funds from these three projects are the Children's Quarter Carousel Plaza and MLK Drive repaving. The Carousel Plaza is another phase of the playground master plan that provides landscape and paving improvements for the area. With the repaving of JFK Drive, MLK Drive now becomes the poorest paving in GGP. This is an ideal project as the grants funding comes to a close since we can easily add scope to this paving project to fully expend all remaining grant funds.
