19	SEC. 2A.22.3. AMERICANS	S WITH DISABILITIES ACT – REASONABLE MODIFICATION
20	<u>POLICY</u>	
21	(a) It is the policy	of the City and County of San Francisco ("City") to provide reasonable
22	modifications in its policies, p	ractices, and procedures for all qualified people with disabilities and to
23	provide these modifications qu	uickly, easily, and with minimum burden to the person with the disability.
24	Denial of a modification shou	ld occur only in situations for which the policy modification would
25		

be granted readily unless a City department or contractor can demonstrate that doing so would constitute a fundamental alteration to the nature of its program or service or an undue financial and/or administrative burden.

Medical or written documentation shall be required only in cases where the reasonable modification request appears unusual given the circumstances, exceeds the level of excellent customer service expected of City staff and contractors or there is no apparent nexus between the disability and the requested modification. Medical inquiries shall be limited to documentation of specific functional limitations, including an explanation of how the functional limitation necessitates the need for the requested modification.

(d) The Mayor's Office on Disability ("MOD") shall maintain on its website a list of City-approved vendors who can provide auxiliary aids and services necessary for effective communication with individuals with disabilities. MOD shall also provide guidance and technical assistance to City departments that have questions about the appropriate response to a request for reasonable modification.

Section 2. Additional Provisions.

- (a) Disclaimer. In adopting and implementing this Ordinance, the City and County of San Francisco is assuming an undertaking only to promote the general welfare. The City is not assuming, nor it is it imposing on its officers and employees, an obligation for breach of which it is liable in money damages to any person who claims that such breach proximately caused injury.
- (b) Best Practices. The City finds that the requirements of this Ordinance reflect best practices regarding reasonable modifications for members of the public. Accordingly, in

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LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) – Reasonable Modification Policy.]

Ordinance adding Administrative Code Section 2A.22.3 to adopt a Citywide ADA Reasonable Modification Policy that requires City departments to (1) provide notice to the public of the right to request reasonable modification, (2) respond promptly to such requests, (3) provide appropriate auxiliary aids and services to people with disabilities to ensure effective communication, and (4) train staff to respond to requests from the public for reasonable modification, and that requires the Mayor's Office on Disability to provide technical assistance to City departments responding to requests from the public for reasonable modifications.

Existing Law

The City does not currently have a Citywide policy regarding how City departments respond to requests from members of the public for reasonable modifications to allow access to City programs, services, or activities.

Amendments to Current Law

The proposed Ordinance would create a Citywide reasonable modification policy "to provide reasonable modifications in [City] policies, practices, and procedures for all qualified people with disabilities and to provide these modifications quickly, easily, and with minimum burden to the person with the disability." The proposed Ordinance would require City departments to take certain steps to implement this policy for the benefit of the public, including (1) providing notice, in accessible formats, to members of the public of their rights to ask for a modification in policies, practices, and procedures or the use of an auxiliary aid or service in order to accommodate a disability (2) responding promptly (within 72 hours if possible) to such requests, (3) providing adequate communication devices for people with disabilities requesting communication assistance, such as qualified interpreters, note-takers, computer-aided transcription services, written materials, audio recordings, computer disks, large print and Brailed materials, and assistive listening systems, (4) providing appropriate training to staff members who respond to requests for reasonable modification and (5) requiring the Mayor's Office on Disability to provide technical assistance to City departments responding to requests from the public for reasonable modifications.

Background Information

The City, following review by the Mayor's Office on Disability, finds that the requirements of this Ordinance reflect best practices regarding reasonable modifications for members of the public. Accordingly, in adopting and implementing this Ordinance, and in following best practices, the City may be doing more than is required by state and federal disability rights laws.
