3	Resolution commending Speaker of the House of Representatives Nancy Pelosi for her
4	courage as a champion for historic health care reform in the United States.

6	WHEREAS, On March 21, 2010, the House of Representatives passed the Health
7	Care and Education Affordability Reconciliation Act of 2010 in a 219-212 historic victory in the
8	111th Congress to ensure quality, affordable, accessible health care for all Americans; and
9	WHEREAS, Once President Barack Obama signed this Act into law on March 23,
10	2010, over 32 million Americans now will have access to affordable health care for the first
11	time and all Americans will benefit from changes to the health care system; and
12	WHEREAS, It is because of the stewardship and vision of Speaker of the House Nancy
13	Pelosi of San Francisco that this moment was possible; she has made history once again,
14	after being the first woman to serve as Speaker of the House, she has now helped to reform
15	the health care system in America, which takes its place in history beside the passage of
16	Social Security and Medicare and continues the legacy of the late Senator Edward M.
17	Kennedy and his lifelong fight on behalf of uninsured Americans; and
18	WHEREAS, Early in the health care reform debate, Speaker Pelosi praised the
19	success of Healthy San Francisco, the nation's first municipal universal health care plan that
20	allows uninsured San Franciscans access to medical care regardless of pre-existing
21	conditions or ability to pay; San Francisco has been leading the way in health care reform and
22	has begun to do what the nation is now trying to accomplish; and
23	WHEREAS, Speaker Pelosi has proven to be a strong, pragmatic leader, unifying her
24	House Democratic caucus to pass this critical legislation; the health care legislation improves

1 the Senate-passed bill to achieve three key goals - affordability for the middle class,

2 accessibility for all Americans, and accountability for the insurance industry; and

WHEREAS, Speaker Pelosi seized this moment to fix health care in America; her courage of conviction has ensured that almost 95 percent of uninsured Americans now will be insured, coverage will be more affordable for all, Medicare will be strengthened to protect seniors, and new consumer protections will end discriminatory practices by insurance companies, including ending the days of being denied coverage because of a pre-existing conditions; and

9 WHEREAS, This reform will reduce the deficit by more than a trillion dollars over the
10 next two decades; and

WHEREAS, Speaker Pelosi has been a champion for San Francisco and the nation;
now, therefore, be it

 Supervisors commend Speaker of the House of Representatives Nancy Pelosi for her

 Board of Supervisors commends Speaker Pelosi for her commitment to making a positive
