3	Resolution commending businesses in San Francisco that use only cage-free eggs,
4	and encouraging all businesses to join them in going cage-free.

6	WHEREAS, November 2008's Proposition 2—the Prevention of Farm Animal Cruelty
7	Act, which requires a shift to cage-free egg production—is the most popular citizen initiative in
8	California history, garnering more than 8 million votes, or 63.5 percent of the statewide
9	electorate; and
10	WHEREAS, 72.4 percent of San Francisco voters approved Proposition 2; and
11	WHEREAS, San Francisco retailers such as Rainbow Grocery, Andronico's Market,
12	and Whole Foods Market have made a commitment to sell only cage-free eggs; and
13	WHEREAS, Dozens of San Francisco restaurants including the Cliff House, Kuleto's,
14	Postrio, Incanto, Blue Mermaid, San Francisco Soup Co, Delfina, Pacific Catch, La Folie,
15	Mission Pie, The Holding Company, and Triptych use and serve only cage-free eggs; and
16	WHEREAS, San Francisco universities like San Francisco State University and

22	of welfare than battery cage facilities; and
23	WHEREAS, The San Francisco Board of Supervisors unanimously passed resolutions
24	opposing battery cage egg production and supporting Proposition 2; and

5	RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors commends San Francisco
