15	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:		
16			
17	Section 1. Background, Findings, and Purpose.		
18	(a) On February 25, 2020, Mayor London Breed proclaimed a state of emergency in		
19	response to the COVID-19 pandemic. On March 3, 2020, the Board of Supervisors concurred		
20	in the February 25 Proclamation.		
21	(b) On March 16, 2020, to mitigate the spread of COVID-19, the Local Health Officer		
22	issued Order No. C19-07, which has been amended and replaced by subsequent orders,		
23	directing San Franciscans to "shelter in place" beginning on March 17, 2020. These orders,		
24	which are now known as "stay-safer-at-home" orders, generally require individuals to stay in		
25	their homes to the extent possible, and require businesses to cease all non-essential		

1	operations at physical locations in the City, with some limited exceptions. Over the course of
2	the COVID-19 pandemic, restrictions on the operations of different types of businesses in the
3	City have fluctuated, but unquestionably a large number of businesses, and many types of
4	businesses, have faced and continue to face severe restrictions.

(c) The COVID-19 outbreak has caused significant negative impacts on businesses in the City. While the exact course of the pandemic cannot be predicted, it is expected to continue to pose serious public health concerns in San Francisco for months to come, and will continue to have serious negative impacts on businesses during that time. This ordinance is intended to mitigate those impacts by (1) extending to November 1, 2021 the deadline for most businesses to pay the business registration fee for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022, and (2) temporarily suspending penalties for the late payment of certain weights and measures fees and point of sale station fees through November 1, 2021.

Section 2. Definitions.

For purposes of this ordinance, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

"Applicable Fee" means any fee charged under Section 1.13-5 or Chapter 115 of the Administrative Code, that was billed by the Tax Collector on or after March 17, 2020, and on or before October 1, 2021.

"Business Registration Certificate" means a "registration certificate," as defined in Section 852.2 of Article 12 of the Business and Tax Regulations Code.

"Business Registration Fee" means the tax imposed under Article 12 of the Business and Tax Regulations Code.

"City" means the City and County of San Francisco.

"Combined Group" has the meaning described in Section 956.3 of Article 12-A-1 of the Business and Tax Regulations Code.

"Newly Established Business" has the meaning set forth in Section 852.1 of Article 12 of the Business and Tax Regulations Code.

"Person" has the meaning set forth in Section 6.2-15 of Article 6 of the Business and Tax Regulations Code.

"Registration Year" has the meaning set forth in Section 852.4 of Article 6 of the Business and Tax Regulations Code.

"Tax Collector" has the meaning set forth in Section 6.2-19 of Article 6 of the Business and Tax Regulations Code.

Section 3. Extension of Deadline to Pay Business Registration Fees.

- (a) Business Registration Renewals. The deadline under Articles 6 and 12 of the Business and Tax Regulations Code for a Person or Combined Group with a Business Registration Certificate for the Registration Year ending June 30, 2021 to apply for renewal of its Business Registration Certificate (or Business Registration Certificates, if a Combined Group) and pay the Business Registration Fee for the Registration Year ending June 30, 2022 shall be extended from May 31, 2021 to November 1, 2021, and no penalty shall be assessed if such Person or Combined Group files and pays that Business Registration Fee by November 1, 2021. Business Registration Certificates issued for the Registration Year ending June 30, 2021, shall continue to be valid through November 1, 2021, for all purposes.
- (b) New Businesses Without a Business Registration Certificate Commencing
 Business On or After January 1, 2021 and Before July 1, 2021. For Newly Established
 Businesses commencing business in the City on or before June 30, 2021, that do not yet have
 a Business Registration Certificate for the Registration Year ending June 30, 2021, the
 deadline to pay the Business Registration Fee for the Registration Year ending June 30, 2022
 shall be extended to November 1, 2021, and no penalty shall be assessed if such Newly

Established Business pays that Business Registration Fee by November 1, 2021. This subsection (b) shall not relieve a Newly Established Business from the requirement to timely apply for a Business Registration Certificate (or Business Registration Certificates, if a Combined Group) and timely pay the prorated Business Registration Fee for the Registration Year ending June 30, 2021. A Newly Established Business subject to this subsection (b) that applies for a Business Registration Certificate (or Business Registration Certificates, if a Combined Group) and pays the prorated Business Registration Fee, plus any applicable penalties and interest, for the Registration Year ending June 30, 2021, shall be issued a Business Registration Certificate (or Business Registration Certificates, if a Combined Group) for the Registration Year ending June 30, 2021, which shall continue to be valid through November 1, 2021, for all purposes.

(c) New Businesses Commencing Business On or After July 1, 2021. For Newly Established Businesses commencing business in the City on or after July 1, 2021, the deadline for payment of the Business Registration Fee for the Registration Year ending June 30, 2022 shall be extended to November 1, 2021, and no penalty shall be assessed if such Newly Established Business pays that Business Registration Fee by November 1, 2021. This subsection (c) shall not relieve a Newly Established Business from the requirement to timely apply for a Business Registration Certificate (or Business Registration Certificates, if a Combined Group) for the Registration Year ending June 30, 2022. A Newly Established Business subject to this subsection (c) shall not receive a Business Registration Certificate (or Business Registration Certificates, if a Combined Group) until it has paid its Business Registration Fee for the Registration Year ending June 30, 2022, but:

(1) all requirements in the San Francisco Municipal Code that a Business Registration Certificate be posted shall be waived for such Newly Established Business for all purposes through November 1, 2021; and

(or numbers, if a Combined Group) reflecting its registration with the Tax Collector, and shall not be reflected as being delinquent in the records of the Tax Collector until November 2, 2021, on account of not paying its Business Registration Fee for the Registration Year ending June 30, 2022.	(2) such Newly Established Business shall receive a business account number
November 2, 2021, on account of not paying its Business Registration Fee for the Registration	(or numbers, if a Combined Group) reflecting its registration with the Tax Collector, and shall
	not be reflected as being delinquent in the records of the Tax Collector until
Year ending June 30, 2022.	November 2, 2021, on account of not paying its Business Registration Fee for the Registration
	Year ending June 30, 2022.

- (d) A Newly Established Business that does not have a certificate of authority for the collection of third-party taxes under Section 6.6-1 of Article 6 of the Business and Tax Regulations Code, shall not be permitted to obtain such a certificate of authority until it has paid its Business Registration Fee for the Registration Year or Years to which it is subject, and shall not be permitted to engage in any business that requires it to collect the tax on transient occupancy of hotel rooms in Article 7 of the Business and Tax Regulations Code or the tax on occupancy of parking spaces in parking stations in Article 9 of the Business and Tax Regulations Code without first paying its Business Registration Fee for the Registration Year or Years to which it is subject.
- (e) Persons or Combined Groups that cease business between July 1, 2021 and November 1, 2021 shall still pay the Business Registration Fee for the Registration Year ending June 30, 2022 and file any necessary forms to accompany that payment, except that such payment deadline shall be extended to November 1, 2021.
- (f) The Tax Collector shall timely issue Business Registration Certificates to all Persons that choose to pay the Business Registration Fee for the Registration Year ending June 30, 2022 prior to November 1, 2021.

	Section 4.	Temporary Penalty	/ Suspension fo	r Late Payment of	Certain Fees;	Refund

- (a) The penalties under Sections 1.13-5(h) and 115.5 of the Administrative Code shall be suspended with respect to Applicable Fees through November 1, 2021. Penalties suspended under this Section 4 shall recommence for Applicable Fees not paid by November 1, 2021. Solely for purposes of calculating these penalties, the "billing date" under Section 1.13-5(h), and "the last day of the term of registration" and "the original due date" under Section 115.5, shall be deemed to be October 2, 2021.
- (b) Persons who have paid the Tax Collector any penalties suspended under this Section 4 shall be allowed a refund of those penalties, without interest, upon written request to the Tax Collector within the later of (1) one year of payment of the penalty, or (2) December 31, 2021.

Section 5. Effect of Penalty Suspension.

Persons subject to the provisions of Section 1.13-5 and/or Chapter 115 of the Administrative Code shall comply with all of the requirements set forth in those provisions, except as provided in Section 4 of this Ordinance. However, persons that do not pay the Applicable Fees by their original due dates shall not be reflected as being delinquent in the records of the Office of the Treasurer and Tax Collector until November 2, 2021, and the Division of Weights and Measures, including the Sealer of Weights and Measures, shall not withhold the issuance of any applicable certificate, license, or permit solely on the basis that an Applicable Fee was not paid by its original due date.

1	Section 6. Severability.		
2	If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this ordinance, or any		
3	application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a		
4	decision of a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the		
5	remaining portions or applications of this ordinance. The Board of Supervisors hereby		
6	declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each and every section, subsection,		
7	sentence, clause, phrase, and word not declared invalid or unconstitutional without regard to		
8	whether any other portion of this ordinance or application thereof would be subsequently		
9	declared invalid or unconstitutional.

11	Section 7. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after		
12	enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the		
13	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board		
14	of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

REVISED LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

(Substituted, 3/2/2021)

[Business Registration Fee - Weights and Measures and Point of Sale Station Fees]

Ordinance extending the deadline for certain businesses to pay the business registration fee for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022, to November 1, 2021; temporarily suspending through November 1, 2021, penalties for late payment of certain weights and measures fees and point of sale station fees billed by the Tax Collector on or after March 17, 2020, and on or before October 1, 2021; and refunding suspended penalties paid to the City.

Existing Law

Businesses in the City must obtain a registration certificate from the Tax Collector and pay an annual registration fee on a fiscal year basis. The deadline for businesses to renew and pay their registration fee for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022 is May 31, 2021. Newly commencing businesses in the City must pay their registration fee when they apply for their registration certificate.

Persons using weighing and measuring devices for commercial purposes in the City must register those devices and pay annual registration and other fees, subject to a 100% late payment penalty. Persons using automated point of sale stations (*e.g.*, scanners) for commercial purposes in the City must register those stations and pay annual registration and other fees, subject to late payment penalties of up to 100% of the amount of the fee.

Amendments to Current Law

This ordinance would extend the deadline for businesses to renew and pay their business registration fee for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022 from May 31, 2021 to November 1, 2021. The deadline for new businesses to pay their business registration fee for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022 would be extended to November 1, 2021.

This ordinance also would temporarily suspend through November 1, 2021 penalties for the late payment of certain weights and measures fees and point of sale station fees billed by the Tax Collector on or after March 17, 2020 and on or before October 1, 2021, and would refund suspended penalties paid to the City upon written request made to the Tax Collector within the later of (1) one year of payment of the penalty, or (2) December 31, 2021.

Background Information

On February 9, 2021, proposed legislation was introduced to extend the payment deadline of the business registration fee for certain businesses. This proposed legislation is being introduced as a substitute ordinance to add provisions suspending late payment penalties for certain weights and measures fees and point of sale station fees.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Legislative Objectives

• The proposed ordinance would extend the deadline for most businesses to pay the business registration fee for FY 2021-22 normally due on May 31, 2021 to November 1, 2021. A business registration certificate issued for FY 2020-21 would continue to be valid through November 1, 2021. The proposed ordinance would also temporarily suspend late-payment penalties through November 1, 2021 for certain weights and measures fees and point of sale station fees billed by the Treasurer/Tax Collector from March 17, 2020 through October 1, 2021, and refund any suspended penalty payments within one year or by December 31, 2021

Key Points

• Since the Covid-19 pandemic began, the Board of Supervisors has taken action to waive or delay business registration and license fees due to the Treasurer/Tax Collector. In January, the Board of Supervisors waived business registration fees for certain restaurants, food service businesses, and entertainment venues; the Board also delayed the deadline to pay the business registration fee for FY 2020-21 for most other businesses from May 31, 2020 to April 30, 2021, and delayed the deadline for license fees normally due on March 31, 2020 and March 31, 2021 to November 1, 2021 (File 20-1260). Later, on March 2, 2021, the Board of Supervisors approved a waiver of FY 2020-21 business registration and license fees for certain San Francisco-based businesses impacted by the Shelter-in-Place orders that earned up to \$25 million in San Francisco gross receipts (File 20-1415).

Fiscal Impact

- The Controller's Office estimates that the one-time deferral of business registration fees for most businesses to November 1, 2021 will lead to a one-time loss of \$32 million in revenue in FY 2020-21 that would be received in the subsequent fiscal year. Businesses would still be required to pay business registration fees for FY 2022-23, due on May 31, 2022.
- According to the Controller's Six-Month Budget Status Report, the Controller is projecting a \$125.2 million General Fund Surplus in FY 2020-21. The deferral of business registration fees, resulting in an estimated revenue reduction of \$32 million in FY 2020-21, would be offset by the projected \$125.2 million General Fund Surplus.

Recommendation

Approval of the proposed ordinance is a policy matter for the Board of Supervisors

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MANDATE STATEMENT

City Charter Section 2.105 states that the Board of Supervisors shall act only by written ordinance or resolution.

BACKGROUND

Since the Covid-19 pandemic began, the Board of Supervisors has taken action to waive or delay business registration and license fees due to the Treasurer/Tax Collector. In January, the Board of Supervisors waived business registration fees for certain restaurants, food service businesses, and entertainment venues; the Board also delayed the deadline to pay the business registration fee for FY 2020-21 for most other businesses from May 31, 2020 to April 30, 2021, and delayed the deadline for license fees normally due on March 31, 2020 and March 31, 2021 to November 1, 2021 (File 20-1260). Later, on March 2, 2021, the Board of Supervisors approved a waiver of FY 2020-21 business registration and license fees for certain San Francisco-based businesses impacted by the Shelter-in-Place orders that earned up to \$25 million in San Francisco gross receipts (File 20-1415).

In addition to collecting business registration and license fees, the Treasurer/Tax Collector collects fees on behalf of the Weights and Measures Program (administered by the Department of Public Health); the program is intended to protect consumers by ensuring the accuracy of any scales, taximeters, or other measuring devices used by businesses, according to the Treasurer/Tax Collector. This program levies two weights and measures fees on about 1,700 businesses:

- Registration Fee for Weighing and Measuring Devices. Businesses that use weighing and
 measuring devices for commercial purposes in the City must register those devices and
 pay annual registration and other fees, subject to a 100 percent late-payment penalty.
- Registration Fee for Automated Point of Sale Stations. Businesses that use so-called automated point of sale stations, such as scanners, for commercial purposes in the City must register those stations and pay annual registration and other fees, also subject to late-payment penalties of up to 100 percent of the amount of the fee.

DETAILS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION

The proposed ordinance would:

- Further extend the deadline for most businesses to pay the business registration fee for FY 2021-22 normally due on May 31, 2021 to November 1, 2021. A business registration certificate issued for FY 2020-21 would continue to be valid through November 1, 2021.
- Temporarily suspend late-payment penalties through November 1, 2021 for certain weights and measures fees and point of sale station fees billed by the Treasurer/Tax Collector from March 17, 2020 through October 1, 2021, and refund any suspended penalty payments within one year or by December 31, 2021.

FISCAL IMPACT

The Controller's Office estimates that the one-time deferral of business registration fees for most businesses to November 1, 2021 will lead to a one-time loss of \$32 million in revenue in FY 2020-21 that would be received in the subsequent fiscal year. Businesses would still be required to pay business registration fees for FY 2022-23, due on May 31, 2022.

Businesses pay the weights and measures fees and point of sale fees by December 31, and late-payment penalties are assessed with the unified licensed fee bill. License fees have been waived for FY 2020-21 for certain San Francisco-based businesses impacted by the Shelter-in-Place orders earning up to \$25 million in San Francisco gross receipts (File 20-1415) and deferred for FY 2021-22 to November 1, 2021 (File 20-1260). The late-payment penalties for weights and measures fees and point of sale fees have historically been a negligible amount and would be suspended through November 1, 2021 as a result of the proposed ordinance.

POLICY CONSIDERATION

According to the Controller's Six-Month Budget Status Report, the Controller is projecting a \$125.2 million General Fund Surplus in FY 2020-21. Although certain General Fund revenues, such as business taxes, sales tax, and hotel room tax, are projected to be lower than originally budgeted, these are more than offset by higher than budgeted property taxes, excess Education Revenue Augmentation Fund receipts, and transfer taxes.

The deferral of business registration fees, resulting in an estimated revenue reduction of \$32 million in FY 2020-21, would be offset by the projected \$125.2 million General Fund Surplus. As noted above, businesses located in San Francisco would pay business registration fees in FY 2021-22 on November 1, 2021 and May 31, 2022.

RECOMMENDATION

Approval of the proposed ordinance is a policy matter for the Board of Supervisors.

¹ This estimate reflects the fiscal impact of Proposition F, a ballot measure approved by San Francisco voters in November 2020, which lowered business registration fees for small businesses earning up to \$1 million in San Francisco gross receipts, among other tax changes.
