Ordinance suspending provisions of the Graffiti Removal and Abatement Ordinance regarding issuance of certain violations and waiving certain unpaid assessed fees and fines due to the COVID-19 pandemic emergency, subject to specific conditions; and affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act.

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13	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
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15	Section 1. Environmental Findings.
16	The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in this
17	ordinance comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources
18	Code Sections 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of
19	Supervisors in File No and is incorporated herein by reference. The Board affirms this
20	determination.
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22	Section 2. Suspension of Certain Provisions of the Graffiti Removal and Abatement
23	Ordinance.
24	(a) Public Works Code Section 2304(a) is suspended, with the result that Public Works
25	shall not issue any violations under Section 2304(a). This suspension shall not affect Public

Works actions under the authority of Sections 2304(b) or 2304(c), which include, but are not
limited to, abatement of graffiti on public property and performance of immediate abatement
on private property if the amount, frequency, level, type, or scope of graffiti warrants such
action.

- (b) Public Works Code Sections 2305 and 2306 are suspended, but only as those
 sections apply to graffiti on private property. These suspensions shall not affect other Public
 Works actions under the authority of Sections 2305 and 2306.
- 8 (c) The suspensions mandated in subsections (a) and (b) shall remain in place until 90
 9 days after the expiration of the Mayor's Emergency Proclamation regarding the COVID-19
 10 pandemic, issued on February 25, 2020, and amended or supplemented thereafter from time
 11 to time.
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Section 3. Waiver of Certain Unpaid Fees and Fines Assessed under the Graffiti
 Removal and Abatement Ordinance.

(a) On or after January 1, 2021, if there are any pending unpaid fees or fines that
Public Works assessed under Public Works Code Sections 2304(a), 2306, and 2307.5(b),

and, in regard to private property only, under Public Works Code Section 2307.6, such fees
and fines are waived.

(b) After expiration of the Mayor's Emergency Proclamation regarding the COVID-19
pandemic, issued on February 25, 2020, and amended or supplemented thereafter from time
to time, Public Works shall resume the enforcement, issuance, and collection of fees and fines
identified under subsection (a) except for those fees and fines waived under subsection (a).

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Section 4. Notice of Ordinance and Waivers.

(a) Public Works shall notify in writing all persons or entities that have unpaid fees or
fines identified in section 3 of this ordinance as having been waived, to inform them of this
ordinance and the waiver.

5 (b) Public Works shall provide information on its website summarizing the provisions of6 this ordinance.

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Section 5. Effective Date; Retroactivity.

9 (a) This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs
10 when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not
11 sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the
12 Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

13 (b) This ordinance shall be retroactive to March 9, 2021, the date of introduction of the 14 ordinance. The Board of Supervisors intends that Public Works exercise administrative 15 discretion to suspend violations as specified in section 2 of this ordinance before the effective date of the ordinance from March 9, 2021 forward. Otherwise, in light of this retroactivity 16 17 provision, upon the effective date of this ordinance, Public Works shall be obligated, as to 18 violations covered by this ordinance, to rescind those violations issued from March 9, 2021 to the effective date of this ordinance. The Board of Supervisors intends that Public Works 19 20 exercise administrative discretion to waive the pending unpaid fees and fines as specified in 21 section 3 of this ordinance before the effective date of the ordinance from March 9, 2021 22 forward. Also, in light of this retroactivity provision, upon the effective date of this ordinance, 23 Public Works shall be obligated, as to fees and fines, to refund those fees and fines that are /// 24

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LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Public Works Code - Graffiti Abatement - Suspension on Issuance of Certain Violations; Waiver of Certain Unpaid Fees and Fines]

Ordinance suspending provisions of the Graffiti Removal and Abatement Ordinance regarding issuance of certain violations and waiving certain unpaid assessed fees and fines due to the COVID-19 pandemic emergency, subject to specific conditions; and affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act.

Existing Law

The Graffiti Removal and Abatement Ordinance, Public Works Code Article 23, establishes a program for Public Works regulation and enforcement of the removal of graffiti on both private and public property. Enforcement involves the issuance of violations and in some cases imposition of fees and fines for the graffiti and/or failure to abate.

Amendments to Current Law

This ordinance would suspend Public Works' issuance of certain violations of the Graffiti Removal and Abatement Ordinance and primarily would cover violations issued to property owners. The legislation would not affect enforcement against "Offending Parties" (known as taggers) or graffiti on public property. The ordinance would waive any pending unpaid fees or fines as of January 1, 2021. This legislation would apply until 90 days after the Mayoral Proclamation on the COVID-19 pandemic emergency expires and be retroactive to March 9, 2021, its introduction date.
