Ten Year Capital Expenditure Plan - FYs2011-2020]

Resolution adopting the City's ten year capital expenditure plan for FYs2011-2020.

WHEREAS, This Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of the City and County of San Francisco (the "City") adopted Ordinance No. 216-05 (the "Capital Planning Ordinance") amending San Francisco Administrative Code sections 3.20 and 3.21 to authorize the formation of a Capital Planning Committee (the "Committee") and the annual preparation and adoption of a ten year capital expenditure plan for the City, including an assessment of the City's capital infrastructure needs, investments required to meet the needs identified through this assessment, and a plan of finance to fund these investments; and

WHEREAS. The Capital Planning Ordinance set March 1 as the target date for the City Administrator's submission of the annual ten year capital plan to the Mayor of the City and the Board, and called for the Mayor and the Board to review, update, amend and adopt the ten year capital plan by May 1 of each year; and

WHEREAS, The Committee has held public hearings and worked with City staff to develop a capital expenditure plan meeting the requirements of the Capital Planning Ordinance; and

WHEREAS. The Committee anticipated making its recommendation on the ten year capital plan for fiscal years 2011-2020 at its February 22, 2010 meeting in order to meet the March 1 target date set by the Capital Planning Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, A key component of the capital plan's long-term debt program, the Earthquake Safety and Emergency Response (ESER) General Obligation Bond, was still

subject to review, discussion and possible amendment by this Board subsequent to the February 22 meeting date; and

WHEREAS, On February 23, 2010, this Board placed a final amended ESER bond on the June 8, 2010 ballot; and

WHEREAS, The Committee met on March 1, 2010 to incorporate the amended ESER bond into the ten year capital plan for fiscal years 2011-2020; and

WHEREAS, At this March 1, 2010 meeting the Committee adopted the ten year capital plan for fiscal years 2011-2020 and approved it for submission to the Mayor and the Board (as so adopted, the "Capital Plan"); and

WHEREAS, The Capital Plan and the City Administrator's transmittal letter are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. , which is hereby declared to be a part of this resolution as if set forth fully herein; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the above recitals are true and correct; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Board has reviewed the Capital Plan; and, be it FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Board hereby adopts the Capital Plan, with such amendments and revisions as this Board deems appropriate, as the City's ten year capital expenditure plan for purposes of the Capital Planning Ordinance.

### Dear Supervisors:

Attached for introduction to the Board of Supervisors is a resolution adopting the City and County of San Francisco's Proposed Capital Plan for Fiscal Years 2011-2020.

This plan addresses the City's most critical infrastructure needs over the next 10 years, including upgrading the City's aging Auxiliary Water Supply System for fighting fires, seismically retrofitting neighborhood fire houses, replacing Terminal 2 at San Francisco International Airport, building a new Central Subway for the Municipal Railway, and implementing the Public Utilities Commission's Water System Improvement Program. These projects will provide a much-needed boost to the San Francisco economy and will generate thousands of job opportunities for San Franciscans.

One issue in the Proposed Capital Plan that will require additional discussion before the plan's adoption is the Police Department's Crime Lab. The proposed Capital Plan, as approved by the Capital Planning Committee, includes the relocation of the Crime Lab out of the Hall of Justice and into a new facility as part of a second Earthquake Safety and Emergency Response General Obligation Bond in November 2013. My office is currently working with the SFPD and the Capital Planning Program to explore options for expediting this project to address the critical needs of the Crime Lab. Plook forward to working with you on this issue in the coming weeks.
