[Apply for, Accept and Expend Grant - Community Development Block Grant Entitlement, FY2010-2011 - \$22,267,380]

Resolution approving the FY2010-2011 Community Development Block Grant Program; authorizing the Mayor, on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco, to apply for, accept, and expend the City's FY2010-2011 Community Development Block Grant Program entitlement from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development in the amount of \$22,267,380 and to expend Program Income in the amount of \$4,886,000.

WHEREAS, Under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, and related Federal Regulations, the City and County of San Francisco is eligible to apply for and receive a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG); and,

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco anticipates receiving approximately \$22,267,380 in 2010/11 CDBG Program funds from HUD, and currently has approximately \$4,886,000 in Program Income from previous CDBG grants, for a combined total of approximately \$27,153,380; and,

WHEREAS, The Citizen's Committee on Community Development (CCCD) has prepared recommendations for fiscal year 2010/11 CDBG and program income funding as set forth in a proposed Expenditure Schedule, a copy of which is located in Board File No. 100503; and,

WHEREAS, The proposed grant does not require an Annual Salary Ordinance amendment; and,

WHEREAS, The funding agency (HUD) does not allow use of grant on indirect costs; and,

WHEREAS, An Environmental Review Record has been prepared by the Mayor's Office of Housing (MOH) and approved by the Certifying Officer for the proposed projects and activities set forth in the Expenditure Schedule with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and other applicable statutes and authorities, in particular those cited in 24 CFR Part 58 §§5 and 6, a copy of which is located in Board File No. 100503; and,

WHEREAS, The Certifying Officer shall follow the provisions of NEPA to confirm and ensure that all projects funded under the CDBG Program are in compliance with applicable federal regulations and requirements; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Mayor of the City and County of San Francisco is hereby authorized to apply for, accept, and expend the City's 2010 CDBG Program funds from HUD and expend an estimated \$4,886,000 in Program Income, all in accordance with the purposes and goals for the funding as generally set forth in 2010-14 Five Year Consolidated Plan and the Expenditure Schedule; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors does hereby approve the purposes and goals for 2010/11 CDBG Program funding as set forth in the Expenditure Schedule for recipient agencies and departments; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of indirect costs in the grant budget; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into and execute agreements between the City and County of San Francisco and various agencies consistent with the 2010/11 CDBG Program and the Expenditure Schedule; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Mayor is hereby authorized to submit documentation and certifications as may be requested or required by HUD, and to take such additional actions as may be required to apply for, accept and expend the 2010/11 CDBG funds

consistent with this Resolution and the goals of the 2010/11 CDBG Program and all applicable legal requirements; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That all actions heretofore taken by the officers of the City with respect to the application for, or the acceptance or expenditure of, 2010/11 CDBG funds and Program Income are hereby approved, confirmed and ratified.
