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8	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:		
9	Section 1. The San Francisco Police Code is hereby amended by adding Section 168		
10	to read as follows:		
11	SEC 168: PROHIBITING LYING ON PUBLIC SIDEWALKS.		
12	(a) Definitions. For the purposes of this Section, lying shall be defined as making a false		
13	statement with deliberate intent to deceive.		
14	(b) Findings . The pe	cople of the City and County of San Francisco find that maintaining honest	
15	discourse on public sidewalks is essential not only for a well-informed citizenry but also to maintain		
16	public safety and the encouragement of a vital social fabric in neighborhoods throughout the City.		
17	Persons who are lying also deter residents and visitors from engaging in social discourse, which deters		
18	visitors and residents from using the sidewalks in their neighborhoods. Lying not only affects the way		
19	people relate to one another, it also can negatively impact the local economy and public safety. This		
20	behavior causes a cycle of decline as residents and tourists go elsewhere to meet, shop, dine, and		
21	residents become intimidated from using the public sidewalks in their own neighborhoods. The		
22	prohibition applies Citywide in order to prevent the displacement of lying from one district or		
23	neighborhood to another.		
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1	The prohibition against lying on sidewalks leaves intact the individual's right to speak, protest		
2	or engage in other lawful activity on any sidewalk consistent with any City permitting requirements.		
3	The prohibition applies only to sidewalks.		
4	(c) Prohibition. In the City and County of San Francisco, it is unlawful to be lying on a public		
5	<u>sidewalk.</u>		
6	(d) Warning. No person shall be cited under this Section unless the person engages in		
7	conduct prohibited by this Section after having been notified by a peace officer that the conduct		
8	violates this Section.		
9	(e) Penalties		
10	1. First Offense. Any person violating any provision of this Section shall be guilty of an		
11	infraction. Upon conviction, the violator shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$50 or more than		
12	\$100 and/or community service, for each provision violated.		
13	2. Subsequent Offenses. Any person violating any provision of this Section within 24 hours		
14	after violating and being cited for a violation of this Section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall		
15	be punished by a fine of not less than \$300 and not more than \$500, and/or community service, for each		
16	provision violated, or by imprisonment in the County Jail for a period of not more than ten (10) days,		
17	or by both such fine and imprisonment. Any person violating any provision of this Section within 120		
18	days after the date of conviction of a violation this Section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall		
19	be punished by a fine of not less than \$400 and not more than \$500, and/or community service, for each		
20	provision violated, or by imprisonment in the County Jail for a period of not more than thirty (30) days,		
21	or by both such fine and imprisonment.		
22	(f) Reporting. One year after the effective date of this ordinance, and every two years		
23	thereafter, the Police Department shall make a written report to the Mayor and the Board of		
24	Supervisors that evaluates the effect of enforcement of this ordinance on the City's neighborhoods.		

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ı	(g) Severability. If any subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Section be for any		
2	reason declared unconstitutional or invalid or ineffective by any court of competent jurisdiction, such		
3	decision shall not affect the validity or the effectiveness of the remaining portions of this Section or any		
4	part thereof.
