I am an immigrant from El Salvador who has lived in the U.S. for over 27 years. I am a proud graduate of SF public schools. I live and work in the Mission District. I am father of two children with special needs who attend public schools. I have seen first hand the extend to which the pandemic and the social isolation has impacted their academic and socio emotional health. Unlilike many families, my wife and I have had the privilege to work from home and support our kids with distance learning. However, despite our efforts we have seen a significant impact in their growth mindset as well as their motivation to complete their school work. My participation in the RISE Working Group will allow me the opportunity to bring the perspective of a father of two children with special needs and advise policy makers on the key strategies and equitable approaches to addressing the learning loss brought on by the pandemic which has exacerbated the opportunity gap for our students of color.

I have worked in the field of education for over 20 years. During the last 13 years I have worked in SF public schools alongside educators, administrators, community partners and families guided by the framework of community schools. As a Community Schools Coordinator in two of our Mission Promise Neighborhood schools I have been responsible for the design, development and implementation of equity-based, school-wide initiatives inclusive of academic, school climate, wellness and support services for students, families and educators. As an Education Manager I facilitate action teams within a collective of community agencies and school teams on aligning services and resources for students and their families around school community needs. I also support with the evaluation components of our federal grant which include data collection, analysis and monitoring of performance measures and neighborhood indicators.

I have worked with parent leaders to promote community awarenes around the census by hosting Loteria Nights across a number of schools in the Mission Neighborhood. I have served in the Board of Directors for Jamestown Community Center. During the pandemic I have volunteered with the Latino Task Force's Mission Resource Hub by providing low income immigrant families with access to critical services such as housing, financial relief assitance and tenants rights. I am an active member of the Close the Gap Coalition Steering Committee which takes an intersectional racial, social and educational justice approach to the work of supporting public schools and closing the opportunity gap for students of color.

We believe that those most affected by inequality should be at the center of designing the solutions. I work at Chinese Progressive Association (CPA), a nearly 50-year old multigenerational, multi-issue organization based in San Francisco Chinatown. CPAs core organizing programs include the Tenant Worker Center and Youth MOJO (Movement of Justice and Organizing), each with their own leadership bodies that make decisions on issue areas, campaigns and our overall strategic directions. We also have intergenerational spaces where we bring the youth and adult leaders together to build working class power. Youth MOJO's leadership is accountable to our base of primarily 2nd generation Chinese American high school students, many of whom are from low-income working families living in Chinatown and Southeast SF. Our leadership is also accountable to our allies organizing other working-class communities of color in San Francisco with whom we are in solidarity.

CPA is deeply committed to listening to the needs of our members and assessing the important shifts and strategies that are needed to address emerging issues. For example, when young people and staff raised concerns about MOJO's limits to meet the needs of Queer and questioning youth, CPA invested in a process to explore ways to support our youth. This led to the founding of Gender, Sexuality, and Diversities (GSD) as a dedicated space to support queer and questioning Asian American high school youth, one of the first queer-centered youth spaces in the Chinese American community. MOJO's focus on mental health has similarly influenced the organization's overall approach to address the traumatic effects of racial and economic oppression on individual members alongside its organizing for systemic change. Young people and adults called for space to explore and unpack their mental health and how it is tied to an understanding of power, health and wellness. These spaces became BREATHE, an internal program creating facilitated, non-clinical space for peer-to-peer counseling around mental health and healing. MOJO engages young people primarily between the ages of 14 and 18 who are typically Chinese immigrants or the children of Chinese immigrant parents. Young people live in the

MOJO engages young people primarily between the ages of 14 and 18 who are typically Chinese immigrants or the children of Chinese immigrant parents. Young people live in the Excelsior, Sunset, and Nob Hill/Chinatown neighborhoods of San Francisco and attend Galileo, Lowell, Washington, Lincoln, and Balboa High Schools. The gender ratio of participants has typically been split evenly between male and female with between 10% and 20% of youth identifying as queer/questioning each year. CPA young people overwhelmingly are in working class families; in the current cohort, for example, 66% of youth qualify for free lunch, and 73% qualify for free public transportation based on their family's financial situation. Applying a tiered-membership model, Youth MOJO is led by a core group of youth leaders, who actively engage in program implementation, support recruitment, and lead peer development. Each year, the general membership base is made up of 20-30 youth from high schools and neighborhoods across San Francisco with approximately 60 who participate over the summer.

As a part of, CPA' s Our Healing in Our hands campaign, I led CPA youth leaders in researching broader landscape of district stakeholders, mental health, led advocacy with educators, district administrators, school board and city elected officials, community organizations, and wellness center staff to win our district resolution in June of 2019. Our resolution addressed the immediate needs around mental health outreach and services, and also created opportunities to strengthen staff and student capacity to create schools that are spaces of healing, transformation, and growth. CPA youth leaders presented this data and received 30 stakeholder organizational endorsements with SF Board of Supervisors, Board of Education Commissioners, service-based organizations, networks including API Council, teacher unions and grassroots youth organizations. As a part of this work, we led political education trainings on the state of health care and mental health care, education in SFUSD, led delegations throughout the school year with our team of youth leaders, and identified a circle of champions on the Board of Education who would support our policy. Our leaders also developed and wrote our school policy, successfully won public support for our demands and to be at the table to co-create solutions with Board of Education Commissioners. In addition to the advocacy campaign, we wanted to make interventions in Chinese ethnic media by destignatizing mental health in immigrant communities and in mainsteam English media by inserting the voice of students of color in the youth mental health narrative. Our youth and campaign were featured in a special series on mental health in the Chinese community on KTSF 26. We led a communications strategy plan, tailoring messaging for greater alignment, trained adult and youth membership base to serve as media spokespeople. Finally, we led an external campaign launch and three media events leading up to our policy vote and win. Cultural humility, racial justice, and other forms of social justice are central to all aspects of my work. I have dedicated my 30-year career to healing and social justice for trauma-impacted children, families, schools, youth-serving institutions, and communities.

For the 21 years that I have worked at UCSF-Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital, I have worked with children, youth, and families of color from under-resourced communities in San Francisco: (a) providing mental health services, (b) training and supervising psychology predoctoral and postdoctoral trainees who are providing mental health services, and (c) over the past 13 years providing training, consultation, and support for San Francisco Unified School District (SFUSD) schools largely serving Black, Latinx, Pacific Islander, and Asian students and families from Bayview Hunters Point, Excelsior, Mission, South of Market, and Tenderloin districts.

In terms of lived experience that I bring to my work, I am a Filipina-American woman and the daughter of Filipino immigrants.

* I have been providing mental health services for trauma-impacted children, youth, and families since 1991, largely focusing on culturally-responsive services and supports with under-resourced communities of color.

* I am the co-founder and director of UCSF Healthy Environments and Response to Trauma in Schools (HEARTS). HEARTS promotes school success for students and educators, with anti-racist healing centered approaches at the core of our work. Since 2008 we have partnered with SFUSD and other school districts to create more trauma-informed, safe, supportive, engaging, and equitable learning and teaching environments that foster resilience, wellness, and justice for everyone in the school community. * Since 2014, I have also provided consultation and training on creating trauma-informed, healing-centered systems for judicial, juvenile justice, public health, and child welfare systems across the San Francisco Bay Area and nationally. HEARTS trainings and approach with schools served as a foundation for the San Francisco Department of Public Health Trauma-Informed Systems Initiative (SFDPH TIS), for which I was the Lead Curriculum Developer. SFDPH TIS seeded a federally-funded Bay Area Regional Trauma-Informed Systems Center, "Trauma Transformed," through which I provide training regionally and nationally.

I testified on Trauma-informed Care at a Hearing of the Assembly Select Committee on Delinquency Prevention and Youth Development. I was appointed by the Chief Justice of the California Supreme Court to serve on her Keeping Kids in School and Out of Court Steering Committee, a multi-sector committee of community and government leaders working to end the "school to prison pipeline" in which youth of color are disproportionately pushed out of school (through punitive disciplinary measures) and into the juvenile justice system. I also served on the California ACEs Policy Working Group (California Campaign to Counter Childhood Adversity [4CA]), convened by Center for Youth Wellness, which aims to raise awareness of the impact of childhood adversity on children, youth, families, and communities; address gaps and structural inequities in systems; and build protective factors and resilience. Additionally, I served on the Advisory Committee for the "Recommendations Roadmap for California Proposition 64 Expenditures: Advancing Healing-Centered and Trauma-Informed Approaches to Promote Individual, Family, and Community Resilience."

<u>Report</u>: The Working Group shall advise the Board of Supervisors, Mayor, and SFUSD in the development, adoption, and implementation of a San Francisco Students and Families RISE (Recovery with Inclusive and Successful Enrichment) Plan ("Plan") to coordinate services provided to youth and families by City departments, SFUSD, and community partners, and to maximize support for youth in San Francisco whose academic experience has been hindered by school closures, distance learning, and the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Plan shall include an equity analysis of services and resources for youth and families and a five-year budget estimate of additional revenue needed by SFUSD to remediate learning loss due to the COVID-19 pandemic and expand enrichment and wraparound services consistent with a community schools' model.

By August 1, 2021, the Working Group shall submit the Plan to the Board of Supervisors, the Mayor, and SFUSD. The Plan shall be accompanied by a proposed resolution for the Board of Supervisors to accept the Plan, and the Board may act by resolution to accept or reject the Plan.

<u>Sunset Date:</u> The Working Group shall terminate on April 8, 2022, one year after the effective date of the authorizing Ordinance.
