1	[Recognizing the Commencement of Ramadan, the Muslim Holy and Blessed Month]

3	Resolution recognizing the commencement of Ramadan, the Muslim Holy and Blessed
4	month of fasting and renewal, and expressing respect for the Muslim communities in
5	the City and County of San Francisco and the United States.
6	
7	WHEREAS, Islam is the world's second-largest and fastest growing religion with
8	approximately 1,900,000,000 Muslims worldwide making up 26% of the world's population;
9	and
10	WHEREAS, There are approximately one million Muslim Americans across the state of
11	California, contributing to its vibrant economy, social fabric, and multicultural traditions; and
12	WHEREAS, The Bay Area has one of the highest concentrations of Muslims in the
13	nation with approximately 250,000 residents from ethnically diverse backgrounds; and
14	WHEREAS, The San Francisco Muslim community has continued to grow and thrive
15	since the establishment of the Islamic Center of San Francisco in 1959, the first mosque
16	located in Bernal Heights which continues to serve as a community and religious hub for
17	Muslims; and
18	WHEREAS, There are five major mosques in San Francisco, including three in the
19	Tenderloin, a neighborhood with a thriving Muslim community (there are approximately 106
20	mosques total in the Bay Area); and
21	WHEREAS, San Francisco Muslims have contributed to critical movements in the City
22	that have advanced racial equity, educational equity, criminal justice reforms, environmental
23	justice, public safety, and increased interfaith engagement; and

WHEREAS, Muslim community organizers, cultural and religious organizations, and
 Small Business Owners and Grocers, the heart and foundation of San Francisco, have
 enriched San Francisco's welcoming, tolerant, and diverse community; and

WHEREAS, Muslims contribute greatly to charitable organizations that help people
from all faiths in the United States and around the world by providing medical assistance,
family services, scholastic supplies, before- and after-school programs, feeding the hungry,

7 and providing recuperation efforts following natural disasters; and

8 WHEREAS, Muslim Public Officials and Leaders, City Departments, and allies, 9 including Department of Public Health, UCSF's EATSF, Human Rights Commission, Small 10 Business Commission, COVID Command Center, Chinatown Community Development 11 Center, and Tenderloin Neighborhood Development Corporation have been helping many 12 Muslim families experiencing hardships due to the COVID-19 pandemic by providing over 13 \$60,000 of food vouchers, Personal Protective Equipment, language translation services, 14 health webinars, testing and vaccination opportunities, public health and safety measures for

- 15 our mosques, and supportive housing; and
- WHEREAS, One of the Bay Area's Muslim-led organizations Support Life Foundation,
 successfully mobilized one of the largest efforts in the Bay Area targeting Food Security for at risk communities during the pandemic; in San Francisco alone, they provided 11.8 tons of
- 19 food since August 2020; and
- 20 WHEREAS, This Ramadan, most Muslims around the world are making every effort to 21 remain safe during the ongoing pandemic and following guidelines advised by local, regional, 22 State, and national public health or government authorities; and
- WHEREAS, Ramadan, the ninth month of the Muslim calendar year, is a time of
 sacrifice, introspection, spiritual renewal, and service for Muslims worldwide; and

WHEREAS, The observance of the Muslim Holy and Blessed month of Ramadan
 commences at dusk on April 12, 2021, and continues for one lunar month, from sunrise to
 sunset each day; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That this Board of Supervisors acknowledges the onset of Ramadan and
expresses its deepest respect to Muslims in San Francisco and throughout the world on this
significant occasion; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Board of Supervisors affirms the commitment to
ensuring that the City values remain welcoming and compassionate and that it pursues
policies that respect the dignity and rights of all working people, regardless of race, religion,

10 immigration status or country of origin; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Board of Supervisors must always recognize and celebrate how successive waves of immigrants and refugees have helped build and enrich our communities, and make nations and communities strong; and, be it

14 FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Board of Supervisors categorically reject policies that

15 criminalize immigrants, refuse refugees fleeing violence and persecution, discriminate against

16 people of Muslim faith and from predominantly Muslim countries, and deny them of their

17 human and civil rights; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Board of Supervisors urges the people of San Francisco to join in celebrating the Holy and Blessed month of Ramadan and taking this month to honor the Muslim community and reflect on the health and wellbeing of family,
