3	Resolution honoring Martha Ryan, Executive Director of the Homeless Prenatal
4	Program, on the 20th anniversary of the Homeless Prenatal Program and declaring May
5 6	22, 2010 as Martha Ryan Day in the City and County of San Francisco.
7	
.' 8	WHEREAS, Martha Ryan has offered generations of women and children a way out of
9	poverty; and
10	WHEREAS, In the 1980s, Ms. Ryan worked alongside doctors and nurses in the war-
11	torn refugee camps of Somalia and the Sudan, treating epidemics of measles, meningococcal
12	meningitis, hepatitis and cholera; and,
13	WHEREAS, Ms. Ryan invited local women to be a part of relief efforts; by training
14	female health workers to bring fellow refuges in for vaccinations, prophylactic treatments and
15	education, Ms. Ryan blended culturally appropriate outreach efforts with western medicine in
16	a sensitive and effective manner; and,
17	WHEREAS, As a result, the health workers earned respect and validation that their
18	culture had previously denied them, having considered women "second class citizens,"; and,
19	WHEREAS, After returning to the Bay Area, Ms. Ryan became a volunteer with the
20	Hamilton Family Center, a San Francisco shelter; and,
21	WHEREAS, Ms. Ryan worked as a volunteer nurse practitioner providing prenatal care
22	for poor and homeless pregnant women who did not receive necessary care during their
23	pregnancies, placing their health and the health of their babies at risk; and,
24	WHEREAS, Out of this experience, the Homeless Prenatal Program (HPP) was born;
25	and,

1	WHEREAS, Ms. Ryan started HPP in 1989 with a part-time staff of three to ensure
2	women had prenatal care to deliver healthy, normal weight and drug free babies; and,
3	WHEREAS, Seventy-two women received prenatal care in the first year; and,
4	WHEREAS, Ms. Ryan quickly realized that prenatal care alone could not ensure a
5	lifetime of health for mothers and babies; and,
6	WHEREAS, The women who came to HPP experienced obstacles to personal and
7	family stability that locked them in an intergenerational cycle of poverty and homelessness;
8	barriers including domestic violence, substance abuse, mental illness, child abuse, child
9	custody issues, incarceration, and inadequate education, language, technology and job skills;
10	and,
11	WHEREAS, Despite these obstacles and motivated by their pregnancies, HPP clients
12	wanted to deliver a healthy baby and raise a healthy child; and,
13	WHEREAS, Because of Martha Ryan, for two decades now, she has made this
14	possible; and,
15	WHEREAS, Over the past 20 years, HPP evolved from focusing solely on prenatal
16	care for mothers into a Family Resource Center with a broader, more holistic mission –
17	breaking the cycle of childhood poverty; and,
18	WHEREAS, More than 3,000 families access HPP's services each year, with nearly
19	200 families coming to HPP for the first time every month; and,
20	WHEREAS, Today, HPP offers services focused on housing, prenatal and parenting
21	support, child development, family finances and stability, access to technology, domestic
22	violence and substance abuse, family unifications, and emergency support of basic needs;
23	now, therefore, be it
