[Proclaiming World Hepatitis Awareness Day –	May 19, 2010]

Resolution proclaiming May 19, 2010, as World Hepatitis Awareness Day in the City and County of San Francisco.

WHEREAS, over 520 million people worldwide are chronically infected with viral hepatitis, and in the U.S. over 5 million people are infected with hepatitis C and 1.5 million with hepatitis B, and in California 450,000 are chronically infected with hepatitis C and 280,000 with hepatitis B, and in San Francisco there are approximately 25,000 people with hepatitis B; and 12,000 people infected with hepatitis C; and

WHEREAS, hepatitis can lead to liver disease, cirrhosis, liver cancer, liver failure and death, and because liver cancer from hepatitis B & C kills more people in the San Francisco Bay Area than anywhere in the country, according to the Center on Disease Control and Prevention; and

WHEREAS, hepatitis C infects 1 in every 50 people across the socioeconomic spectrum but disproportionately affects African-Americans, Latinos, Veterans, parolees returning to the community, injection drug users, and low-income residents, and is the leading cause of death in people with HIV, with 30% of people living with HIV co-infected with hepatitis C; and hepatitis B infection is present in 1 in 10 of San Francisco's Asian and Pacific Islander residents; and

WHEREAS, many persons at risk or infected by these conditions are neither tested nor treated due to lack of public awareness about hepatitis and lack of access to care, and thus cannot promote their liver's health or prevent the unknowing spread of viral hepatitis; and

1	WHEREAS, hepatitis awareness education campaigns, accessible screening for
2	hepatitis C and hepatitis B, along with appropriate care, can reduce the damage from
3	hepatitis C and B viral infection to individuals and to our community, financially as well as
4	physically and emotionally; and
5	WHEREAS, in recognition of the ongoing work of the Mayor's Hepatitis C Task Force
6	and the San Francisco Hep B Free Campaign to address these public health concerns with
7	recommendations and activities so that San Franciscans can know their viral hepatitis status
8 9	and take appropriate health measures; now
10	THEREFOR BE IT RESOLVED That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby
11	declares May 19, 2010, as World Hepatitis Awareness Day in San Francisco.
