6	WHEREAS, Lyme disease is a serious bacterial infection that is commonly transmitted
7	by infected ticks and is spreading everywhere in the world, including nationally, statewide and
8	locally; and
9	WHEREAS, There is an average of 22,000 new cases of Lyme disease reported in the
10	United States each year; and
11	WHEREAS, The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention indicates that the
12	reported cases of Lyme disease are only 10 percent of the actual cases that meet
13	surveillance criteria; and
14	WHEREAS, The tick that spreads Lyme disease has been found in 56 out of
15	California's 57 counties; and
16	WHEREAS, Three San Franciscans have contracted Lyme disease and co-infections
17	from being bitten by infected ticks in the City in the past three years; and
18	WHEREAS, If treated immediately and appropriately, Lyme disease can usually be
19	cured; and
20	WHEREAS, If untreated or misdiagnosed, Lyme disease can cause long-term health
21	problems, including neurological disorders, memory loss, muscle and joint pain, fatigue,
22	psychological disorders and, in some rare cases, can be fatal; and
23	WHEREAS, In the State of California, ticks are present throughout the year and we
24	must take precautions to protect humans and animals from tick bites all year long; and
