10	Section 1. Findings.
11	(a) The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in this
12	Ordinance are in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public
13	Resources Code section 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the
14	Board of Supervisors in File No and is incorporated herein by reference.
15	(b) For fiscal year 2010-11, the Recreation and Park Department has had to reduce its
16	general fund support by 30%.

18	Section 2. The San Francisco Park Code is hereby amended by amending Section
19	12.46, to read as follows:
20	SEC. 12.46. COUNTY FAIR BUILDING AND BOTANICAL GARDEN FACILITY RENTAL
21	FEES.
22	(a) Definitions.
23	1. "Corporate Event" means any rental by, on behalf of, or in connection with any
24	corporate entity, except for Garden Clubs or Nonprofit Organizations as defined below.
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- "Garden Club" means any garden club or flower society engaged in horticultural activities in which there are no monetary transactions (admission charge, donation, ticket sales, or product sales) during or in connection with the activity.
 - 3. "Individual or Nonprofit Organization" means <u>(a)</u> any person renting the County Fair Building or Botanical Garden in his or her individual capacity for private use, or <u>(b)</u> any entity qualifying for tax-exempt status under 26 U.S.C. \$ 501(c)(3), <u>engaged in community or social activities in which there are no monetary transactions (admission charge, donation, ticket sales, or product sales) during or in connection with the activity, or <u>(c)</u> any garden club or flower society using the County Fair Building or Botanical Garden for fundraising activities.</u>
 - (b) County Fair Building Facility Rental Fees. All spaces must be rented for a minimum of two hours.
