# Free summer learning programs for our youth

The Summer Together Initiative is a coalition of SFUSD community organizations, nonprofits, businesses, and city departments partnering to offer free inperson and virtual learning experiences for SFUSD students this summer.



#### **Independent Learning** - 50,000 students

All SFUSD students will be eligible for up to ten summer reading books, distributed by the **San Francisco Public Library**.

#### Academic In-Person Learning - ~17,720 Slots

Hosted at public school buildings, community centers, Rec and Park centers & private commercial spaces. Summer programming will be operated either by **DCYF's** community based organizations or **SFUSD's** summer education staff.

#### In-Person Summer Camp - ~8,300 Slots

Free slots will be provided for students to attend summer camp with the SF Recreation & Parks Department, DCYF-funded community-based organizations, & private camps.


## **Virtual Learning Opportunities** - $\sim$ 2,000 students Online programming opportunities from public and private organizations.



- 68 DCYF-funded CBOs
- 31 Rec & Park centers
- 77 SFUSD school sites
- 27 private summer camps
- 4,000 learning experts, youth development professionals and support staff
- 500,000 Summer reading books
- 6,750,000 hours of smiles and fun

# Summer Together Sites



### Registration Process

#### \*Priority Populations:

- Residents of public housing, RVs and SROs
- Families that are experiencing homelessness
- Children and youth in the foster care system
- English language learners
- Low-income families, with a focus on historically impacted communities, including people who identify as African American, Latino/a/x, Native American, Pacific Islander, and/or Asian
- Children with disabilities



### RPD Camp Registration

- Received 5,374 interest forms representing 7,210 children
- Of those 2,924 families with 4,021 children were in the priority population
- Priority families enrolled in 2261 slots
- Non-priority families enrolled in 522 slots
- 217 waitlist slots will be filled for a total of 3,000 slots enrolled
- Priority families that did not get a spot & are not on the waitlist were referred to DCYF for placement.



### Private Camp Registration

- DCYF secured ~2,500 free slots across
   25 private camps throughout the City.
- From May 12-May 16, DCYF will invite up to 500 families per daily to register for a free private camp slot.
- DCYF will prioritize families on RPD's Interest Form who are priority families first. We will open to general SFUSD families who completed the Interest Form, if there are still spaces open.



#### Registration: SFUSD

SFUSD will directly contact families to enroll in one of the following SFUSD administered programs:

- Early Education Pre-K
- TK-5th Out of School Time
- Extended School Year
- Special Education-IEP
- High School Credit Recovery
- Early College Initiative

#### Registration: CBOs

CBO providers who run the following programs will directly outreach to their priority families during the Early Registration period to enroll them:

- Community Hubs Initiative
- ExCEL Afterschool Programs
- Beacon Community Schools Programs
- Community-Based Summer Programs

Families who are not eligible for Early Registration may enroll after May 8<sup>th</sup>
