9	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:		
10	Section 1. Environmental Findings. The Planning Department has determined that the		
11	actions contemplated in this Ordinance are in compliance with the California Environmental		
12	Quality Act (California Public Resources Code sections 21000 et seq.). Said determination is		
13	on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No and is		
14	incorporated herein by reference.		
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16	Section 2. The San Francisco Business and Tax Regulations Code is hereby amended		
17	by amending Section 249.8, to read as follows:		
18	SEC. 249.8. PRIVATE AMBULANCES		
19	(a) Every person, firm or corporation engaged in operating a private ambulance that		
20	requires a Certificate of Operation shall pay an initial application fee of \$10,000 at the time of		
21	filing the initial application, and an annual renewal fee of \$5,000 to the Department of		
22	Emergency Management.		
23	(b) Every person, firm or corporation holding a Certificate of Operation must also pay		
24	an annual ambulance permit fee of \$1,600 for each vehicle to the City Treasurer. Effective		
25	July 1, 2010, this fee must be paid to the Department of Emergency Management.		

1	(c) As authorized by Title 22 of the California Code of Regulations, the following fees				
2	are due and payable to the Department of Emergency Management by every person, firm or				
3	corporation applying for and renewing the certification for an Emergency Medical Services				
4	("EMS") Training Program:				
5	(1) EMS Training Program Initial Application: \$1,775 for a Paramedic Program,				
6	\$1,185 for an Emergency Medical Technician ("EMT") Program, and \$595 for a Continuing				
7	Education Program.				
8	(2) EMS Training Program Renewal, due every four years from the time of the last				
9	renewal: \$890 for a Paramedic Program, \$650 for an EMT Program, and \$360 for a				
10	Continuing Education Program.				
11	(d) As authorized by Title 22 of the California Code of Regulations and Section				
12	1797.212 of the California Health and Safety Code, the following fees are due and payable to				
13	the Department of Emergency Management by persons applying for and renewing EMT				
14	Certificates:				
15	(1) Application for initial EMT Certificate: \$145.				
16	(1)(2) Renewal of current and valid EMT Certificate, not including EMT-Paramedic:				
17	\$34 <u>107</u> due every two years.				
18	(2)(3) Application for initial EMT-Paramedic Accreditation: \$31 for the initial application				
19	only.				
20	(e) As authorized by Sections 1798, 1798.2, and 1798.164 of the California Health				
21	and Safety Code, the following fees are due and payable annually in advance to the				
22	Department of Emergency Management by the following facilities (as defined in Section 901				
23	of the San Francisco Health Code) that receive patients through Ambulance Service				
24	Providers:				

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(1) Receiving Hospital: \$10,719.

1	(2) STEMI (ST segment elevation myocardial infarction) Heart Attack Center:
2	\$13,310.
3	(f) The fees in this section shall be retroactive and effective as of May 1, 2009.
4	(g) Beginning with fiscal year 2009-2010 and annually thereafter, the fees set forth in this
5	section may be adjusted each year, without further action by the Board of Supervisors, as set
6	forth in this subsection. Not later than April 1, the Director of the Department of Emergency
7	Management shall report to the Controller the revenues generated by the fees for the prior
8	fiscal year and the prior fiscal year's costs of operation, as well as any other information that
9	the Controller determines appropriate to the performance of the duties set forth in this Article.
10	Not later than May 15, the Controller shall determine whether the current fees have produced
11	or are projected to produce revenues sufficient to support the costs of providing the services
12	for which the fee is assessed and that the fees will not produce revenue that is significantly
13	more than the costs of providing the services for which the fee is assessed. The Controller
14	shall, if necessary, adjust the fees upward or downward for the upcoming fiscal year as
15	appropriate to ensure that the program recovers the costs of operation without producing
16	revenue that is significantly more than such costs. The adjusted rates shall become operative
17	on July 1.
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19	Section 3: This ordinance shall become operative on its effective date or on July 1,
20	2010, whichever is later.
