25	reimburse the City for the costs incurred by the City in engaging in regulatory, inspection, and

2	authorized by each type of permit approved by the San Francisco Police Department or		
3	Entertainment Commission.		
4	(c) Service Fee. A service fee is a fee levied by the Depa	rtment to reimburse it for services	
5	providing in processing or investigating any permit application	or application for amendment to or	
6	renewal of a permit, which amount is not included in the filing fe	ee, and includes fees for fingerprinting,	
7	criminal history background checks, and advertising and notices	<u>.</u>
