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Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

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- Section 1. Findings and Convening of the Redistricting Task Force.
- (a) Charter Section 13.110(d) provides that within 60 days of the publication of federal census data, the Director of Elections ("Director") will notify the Board of Supervisors ("Board") whether the existing supervisorial districts continue to meet the requirements of federal and state law and the criteria for drawing districts lines set in the Charter. The Charter further provides that if the Director determines that any of the City's supervisorial districts fails to meet those requirements, the Board shall, by ordinance, fund and convene the Redistricting Task Force ("Task Force"). The Charter also establishes an April 15, 2022 deadline for the completion of the Task Force's redrawing of supervisorial district lines following the 2020 decennial census.
- (b) In January 2021, the U.S. Census Bureau announced that there would be a delay in its release of redistricting data. This January 2021 announcement estimated that redistricting data would be provided to State and local governments around July 31, 2021,

- several months later than when the U.S. Census Bureau has historically published this data.

  - (c) On February 12, 2021, the U.S. Census Bureau announced a further delay regarding the publication of redistricting data. As of that date, the U.S. Census Bureau estimated that it would deliver this data to all states by September 30, 2021. A copy of the U.S. Census Bureau's February 12, 2021 press release regarding this delay is on file with the Clerk of the Board in File No. 210606.
  - (d) In light of the April 15, 2022 deadline for the completion of the redistricting process, the Board of Supervisors hereby convenes the Task Force in advance of receiving the redistricting data from the U.S. Census Bureau due to the anticipated need to redistrict at least one of the City's eleven supervisorial districts following the 2020 census.

Section 2 Membership.

The Task Force shall consist of nine members. The Board of Supervisors, the Mayor, and the Elections Commission shall each appoint three members. The Director of Elections shall serve ex officio as a non-voting member. The Board of Supervisors, the Mayor, and the Elections Commission shall make their appointments by July 31, 2021.

The membership of the Task Force shall be broadly representative of the communities of interest, neighborhoods, and diversity in ethnicity, race, age, gender, and sexual orientation of the City and County of San Francisco.

Members of the Task Force shall serve until the Task Force completes its duties in connection with the 2020 decennial census, as set forth in Charter section 13.110(d). Any

vacancies occurring in the voting membership of the Task Force shall be filled by the appointing authority for the seat which becomes vacant.

Section 4. Staffing.

The Clerk of the Board of Supervisors shall serve as Secretary to the Task Force. The Clerk's duties shall include, but are not limited to, maintaining a Task Force webpage, posting Task Force meeting agendas and minutes, coordinating in-person and virtual meetings, and providing equipment and workspace for the Task Force's members, as needed.

On behalf of the Task Force, the Director of Elections shall, subject to the Charter's budgetary and fiscal provisions, retain any necessary technical consultants to assist the Task Force in its duties.

18	of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

20	Section 7. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors		
21	intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles,		
22	numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal		
23	Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment
