14	Section 1. Article XIX of Chapter 2A of the Administrative Code is hereby amended by
15	adding Section 2A.272, to read as follows:
16	SEC. 2A.272. REIMBURSEMENT FOR BROKEN STOREFRONT WINDOWS DUE TO
17	VANDALISM.
18	(a) Reimbursement . Subject to the budgetary and fiscal provisions of the Charter, the Office of
19	Economic and Workforce Development (OEWD) shall reimburse qualifying businesses for the costs of
20	repairing or replacing storefront windows broken due to vandalism or in connection with a break-in at
21	the premises. OEWD shall not reimburse businesses for the cost of repairing or replacing storefront
22	windows determined by OEWD to have been broken due to negligence, unforeseen accidents, acts of
23	nature, the age of the window, or other cause unrelated to vandalism or break-in.
24	(b) Definitions.

1	"Broken" shall mean storefront windows removed, permanently defaced, or otherwise
2	damaged to a significant degree, as determined by OEWD.
3	"Storefront window" shall mean a window located in the façade or street frontage of a
4	retail store, restaurant, or other similar commercial use located on the ground floor or street level of a
5	building, including a display window. "Window" shall include the glass portion of an entry door
6	located in such façade or street frontage.
7	(c) Limitations. A business shall be eligible for reimbursement in an amount up to \$2,000 per
8	incident. A business shall not be eligible for reimbursement for more than two incidents occurring
9	within a 12-month period.
10	(d) Eligibility. To qualify for reimbursement, the incident must have occurred in San Francisco
11	and the business must:
12	(1) Have a total annual revenue of less than \$5 million;
13	(2) Not be a Formula Retail use as defined in Planning Code Section 303.1;
14	(3) Report the incident to the Police Department within 60 days of the occurrence or
15	discovery of the incident; and,
16	(4) Present a claim to the Director of OEWD within 120 days of the incident or within
17	120 days of the start of the program.
18	(e) Rules and Regulations. The Director of OEWD may adopt reasonable rules and
19	regulations to carry out the provisions of this Section 2A.272. A business shall not be required to make
20	an insurance claim before receiving reimbursement under this Section. The Director may provide by
21	regulation for partial or pro rata reimbursement if claims for reimbursement exceed the amount of
22	monies available for this purpose under Administrative Code Section 10.100-65.
23	(f) Graffiti Removal and Abatement Ordinance. Nothing in this Section 2A.272 shall limit or
24	supersede the application or operation of Article 23 of the Public Works Code, the Graffiti Removal

3	(g) Undertaking for the General Welfare. In enacting and implementing this Section 2A.272,
4	the City is assuming an undertaking only to promote the general welfare. It is not assuming, nor is it
5	imposing on its officers and employees, an obligation for breach of which it is liable in money damages
6	to any person who claims that such breach proximately caused injury.
7	(h) Sunset Date. This Section 2A.272, as well as Section 10.100-165 of Article XIII of Chapter
8	10 of the Administrative Code, shall expire by operation of law two years after the date of enactment.
9	Upon expiration of these Sections, the City Attorney shall cause them to be removed from the
10	Administrative Code. Any monies left in the special fund created in Section 10.100-65 after the
11	expiration date shall be transferred to the General Fund, subject to any applicable gift restrictions.
12	
13	Section 2. Article XIII of Chapter 10 of the Administrative Code is hereby amended by
14	adding Section 10.100-65, to read as follows:
15	SEC. 10.100-65. ECONOMIC AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT BROKEN WINDOW

17	(a) Establishment of Fund. The Economic and Workforce Development Broken Window Fund
18	(the "Fund") is hereby established as a category four fund to reimburse qualifying businesses for the

20	break-in at the premises. Any gift or donation of \$50,000 or less in value received by the Fund shall be
21	deemed approved for acceptance and expenditure.
22	(b) Use of Fund. Money appropriated to, or otherwise received by, the Fund shall only be
23	used or expended as provided in Administrative Code Section 2A.272.
24	(c) Administration of Fund. The Director of the Office of Economic and Workforce
25	Development, or the Director's designee, shall administer the Fund.

LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Administrative Code - Reimbursement for Broken Windows Due to Vandalism]

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to provide reimbursement to qualifying businesses for the costs of repairing or replacing storefront windows broken due to vandalism or break-ins, create a special fund for this purpose, and establish a sunset date of two years after enactment.

Existing Law

Current law does not require the City to reimburse businesses for the costs of repairing or replacing storefront windows broken due to vandalism or break-ins.

Amendments to Current Law

The proposed ordinance would amend the Administrative Code to require the City, through the Office of Economic and Workforce Development (OEWD), to reimburse qualifying businesses for costs of repairing or replacing storefront windows broken due to vandalism or in connection with a break-in at the premises. A business could seek reimbursement in an amount of up to \$2,000 per incident, for up to two incidents occurring within a 12 month period. To be eligible for reimbursement, the business would have to have a total annual revenue of less than \$5 million and could not be a Formula Retail use.

The ordinance would also create a special fund to receive monies appropriated for this program.

The ordinance would expire two years after the date of enactment.

Background Information

In September 2020, the San Francisco District Attorney's Office launched a pilot program providing victim assistance program for small businesses impacted by broken windows in Supervisorial District 5. (https://www.sfdistrictattorney.org/victim-services/district-5-business-broken-window-reimbursement) Eligible businesses can be reimbursed up to \$1,000 of the cost of replacing a storefront window with a maximum of two reimbursements per year. (*Id.*)
