Additionally, he helps to plan and implement in-country scientific writing workshops. This grant does not require an ASO amendment and partially reimburses DPH for one position: one Supervising Physician Specialist at .10 FTE during the period from July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021.
- Reason for Retroactivity: We are respectfully requesting retroactive approval because this amendment to the original contract has raised the total amount over the \$100k threshold for 2020-2021. DPH received this amendment to the contract on January 4, 2021 retroactive to September 1, 2016. The amended award provided a grant increase of \$29,169 from \$83,041, for a total grant amount of \$112,210.
