7	WHEREAS, The Department of Public Works (Public Works) launched a public toilet
8	program known as the Pit Stop Program (herein referred to as program) in 2014; and
9	WHEREAS, Public Works and the San Francisco Bay Area Rapid Transit District
10	(BART) would like to partner regarding the program's operation at the 16th Street Mission,
11	Powell Station, and 24th Street Mission BART stations (herein referred to as stations); and
12	WHEREAS, The stations have no public restrooms available for patrons; and
13	WHEREAS, On February 17, 2016, the City and County of San Francisco, acting by
14	and through Public Works, entered into an agreement with BART for such a partnership and
15	BART's contribution was \$200,000 towards the program at the stations for the period of
16	February 17, 2016, through February 16, 2017; and
17	WHEREAS, On April 1, 2018, the parties executed the first amendment to the
18	agreement and BART's contribution was \$50,000 towards the program at the stations for the
19	period of July 1, 2017, through June 30, 2018; and
20	WHEREAS, On September 30, 2018, the parties executed the second amendment to
21	the agreement and BART's contribution is \$225,000 towards the program at the stations for
22	the period of July 1, 2018, through June 30, 2019; and
23	WHEREAS, On September 27, 2019, the parties executed the third amendment to the
24	agreement and BART's contribution of \$257,500 towards the program at the stations; and

1	WHERAS, On November 16, 2020, the parties executed the fourth amendment to the
2	agreement and BART's contribution of \$250,000 towards the program at the stations; and
3	WHEREAS, The agreement between Public Works and BART, the first amendment to
4	the agreement, and the second amendment to the agreement are on file with the Clerk of the
5	Board of Supervisors in Files No. 160595 and 190168; and
6	WHEREAS, The BART grant does not require an ASO amendment; and
7	WHEREAS, The BART grant requires \$250,000 in matching funds, which will be
8	funded through Public Works' Operating Budget; and
9	WHEREAS, The grant budget includes provision for indirect costs of \$32,609 (15% of
10	total program direct cost); now, therefore, be it

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Legislative Objectives

• The proposed resolution would authorize Public Works to retroactively accept and expend a grant from BART in the amount of \$250,000 to operate three Pit Stop locations, for the period of July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021. The grant requires a minimum match of at least \$250,000 provided by Public Works. Public Works is requesting retroactive approval due to administrative delays for the BART approval by their Board of Directors.

Key Points

- The Pit Stop program provides restrooms, toilet, and handwashing facilities, as well as needle and dog waste receptacles at 36 locations throughout the City. The restrooms are a mix of semi-permanent JCDecaux public toilet facilities and portable toilets owned by Public Works.
- Public Works entered into grant agreements with the nonprofits Hunters Point Family, CIVIC, and Mission Neighborhood Centers for the operation and monitoring of the Pit Stop locations.
- The total cost of the Pit Stop program is approximately \$15.8 million for FY 2020-21.

Fiscal Impact

- Under the grant agreement, BART and Public Works each contribute \$250,000 to the three Pit Stop site operations, totaling \$500,000. Because Public Works is extending the hours of Pit Stop operations beyond the hours in the grant agreement, Public Works total costs for the three Pit Stop sites are \$584,280.
- The source of funding for the Public Works contribution of \$584,280 to the program is the General Fund.

Recommendation

Approve the proposed resolution.

MANDATE STATEMENT

City Administrative Code Section 10.170-1 states that accepting Federal, State or third-party grant funds in the amount of \$100,000 or more, including any City matching funds required by the grant, is subject to Board of Supervisors approval.

BACKGROUND

The City's Pit Stop program, which began in July 2014 and is administered by the Department of Public Works (Public Works), provides restrooms, toilet, and handwashing facilities, as well as needle and dog waste receptacles at 36 locations throughout the City. The restrooms are a mix of semi-permanent JCDecaux public toilet facilities and portable toilets owned by Public Works.

Public Works entered into grant agreements with the nonprofits Hunters Point Family, CIVIC, and Mission Neighborhood Centers for the operation and monitoring of the Pit Stop locations. CIVIC provides staffing for 17 Pit Stop locations, Hunters Point Family provides staffing for 14 Pit Stop locations, and Mission Neighborhood Centers provides staffing for five Pit Stop locations. The Pit Stop location monitoring positions are provided as job training, employment and workforce development opportunities for local residents, especially those who are facing barriers to employment. The total cost of the Pit Stop program is approximately \$15.8 million for FY 2020-21.

In FY 2019-20, Public Works retroactively accepted and expended a previous grant from Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART) in the amount of \$257,500 to operate three Pit Stop Locations¹:

- Powell BART Station, operated by Hunter's Point Family,
- 24th Street Mission BART Station, operated by Mission Neighborhood Centers, and
- 16th Street Mission BART Station, operated by CIVIC.

The total program budget for previous operation of the three Pit Stop locations was \$515,500 for FY 2019-20.

DETAILS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION

The proposed resolution would authorize Public Works to retroactively accept and expend a grant from BART in the amount of \$250,000 to operate three Pit Stop locations, for the period of July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021. The grant requires a minimum match of at least \$250,000 provided by Public Works. According to Department staff, the Department is requesting retroactive approval due to administrative delays for the BART approval by their Board of Directors.

The grant allows Public Works to operate the following Pit Stop locations:

- Powell BART Station, operated daily, 24 hours per day, from July 2020 through June 2021;
- 24th Street Mission BART Station, operated daily, 24 hours per day, from July 2020 through June 2021; and

• 16th Street Mission BART Station, operated Monday through Friday from 10:30am – 5:30pm, from July 2020 through June 2021.

The Pit Stop at the 16th Street Mission station was the first to be funded in 2016, and the additional Pit Stops were added in FY 2018-19. Each Pit Stop is located on City Property at the street level. For FY 2019-20, Public Works split the agreement equally with BART for the three locations. Under the FY 2020-21 amendment to the agreement, BART will reimburse Public Works for BART's share of Pit Stop expenditures. ²

FISCAL IMPACT

The grant authorized by the proposed resolution would provide Public Works with \$250,000 to operate three Pit Stop locations. It would also require an equal match of \$250,000 plus an additional \$334,280 to cover remaining costs associated with the grant, for a total cost of \$834,280 for operation of the three Pit Stop sites. The grant budget is shown below in Table 1.

According to Mr. Jeremy Spitz, Special Assistant for Policy and Government Affairs with the Department of Public Works, the total costs for operating the three sites increased by \$319,281 from FY 2019-20 (from \$515,000 to \$834,281) due to the expansion of hours in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Funding Source

According to Mr. Jeremy Spitz, the source of funding for the Public Works contribution of \$584,280 to the program is the General Fund.

RECOMMENDATION

Approve the proposed resolution.

² The Memorandum of Agreement between BART and the City for FY 2019-20 required each party to contribute \$257,500 for actual Pit Stop Program costs, totaling \$515,000, which was reduced in the FY 2020-21 Memorandum of Agreement to \$250,000 for each party, or \$500,000 total. As noted above, the City's actual costs in FY 2020-21 are \$584,280 because the City has chosen to operate the Pit Stops for 24 hours, 7 days week, which exceeds the hours of operation in the Memorandum of Understanding (7 hours per day, Mon – Fri, 16th Street BART station; and 11 hours per day, 7 days per week, 24th Street and Powell Street BART Station).

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

between

SAN FRANCISCO BAY AREA RAPID TRANSIT DISTRICT

and

CITY AND COUNTY OF SAN FRANCISCO, SAN FRANCISCO PUBLIC WORKS

for the

PIT STOP PUBLIC TOILET PROGRAM

This Memorandum of Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into as of the <u>17</u> day of <u>FEBRUALY</u>, 2016 by and between the San Francisco Bay Area Rapid Transit District ("BART") and the City and County of San Francisco ("City"), acting by and through San Francisco Public Works, referred to collectively as "Parties" or individually as "Party."

RECITALS

WHEREAS,

- A. The 16th Street Mission and Civic Center/United Nations Plaza BART stations have no public restrooms available for patrons.
- B. City, through San Francisco Public Works, launched a public toilet program known as the Pit Stop Program ("Program") in 2014.
- C. By strategically placing Pit Stop public toilets near the 16th Street Mission and Civic Center/UN Plaza stations, BART patrons can use the restroom without infringing on the public facilities other patrons also need to utilize.
- D. BART and San Francisco Public Works would like to partner in regards to the operation of Pit Stop public toilets at the two subject BART stations.

AGREEMENT

Now, therefore, in consideration of the foregoing, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. **Agreement Purpose.** The purpose of this Agreement is to outline roles and responsibilities of BART and the City with respect to participation in Program activities.
- 2. **Pit Stop Locations.** Pit Stop public toilets will be located near two BART stations in San Francisco: the 16th Street Mission Station (on the northeast corner of 16th Street and

Mission Street) and the Civic Center/UN Plaza Station (exact location still to be mutually determined). The Pit Stop public toilets are to be located as mutually determined on property belonging only to the City and County of San Francisco, near to the BART station. No toilets are to be located on property belonging to BART.

- 3. Roles and Responsibilities. The Parties agree to the following roles and responsibilities.
 - a. City: The City shall:
 - i. Contribute toward the Program an amount of \$200,000.
 - ii. Pay for all costs associated with Pit Stop public toilet rental such as maintenance, installation and cleaning.
 - iii. Pay for all costs associated with obtaining no parking permits and posting location.
 - iv. Conduct outreach associated with placement of the Pit Stop public toilets.
 - v. Replace broken supplies that are used at the Pit Stop public toilets, such as containers and stands.
 - vi. Supervise, schedule, and coordinate overall operation of the Program.
 - vii. Prepare and submit invoices and appropriate documentation to BART on a quarterly basis for payment for actual costs to perform the scope of work described in this document. Invoices shall be submitted to BART within 30 days of the end of each quarter during which City incurs expenditures for the Program.
 - b. BART: Bart shall:
 - i. Contribute toward the pilot in an equal amount of \$200,000.
 - Provide feedback on the condition and cleanliness of the Pit Stop public toilets located near the 16th Street Mission and Civic Center/UN Plaza stations.
 - iii. Pay City invoices accompanied by appropriate documentation for actual costs associated with performing these services.
- 4. Data collection and sharing: Staff contracted to operate the Pit Stop public toilets will collect data, such as number of users per day, type of user (e.g. BART user / Non BART user) if possible, amount of needle, dog waste disposal, etc. This data will be shared with both Parties.
- 5. **Term.** The term of this Agreement shall be until funding for the program is exhausted, unless earlier terminated by either agency. Time extensions shall be by amendment to this Agreement and by mutual agreement between the parties.
- 6. **Termination.** BART shall have the option, in its sole discretion, to terminate this Agreement, at any time during the term hereof, for convenience and without cause.

BART shall exercise this option by giving the Parties written notice of termination. The notice shall specify the date on which termination shall become effective, which in no event shall be less than 10 days from the date of the notice. If terminated, the Parties shall be entitled to be reimbursed for services properly performed up to the effective date of termination of the Agreement.

7. Notices: Unless otherwise indicated elsewhere in this Agreement, all written communications sent by the Parties may be by U.S. mail or by e-mail and shall be addressed as follows:

Any notice of default must be sent by registered mail or hand-delivered to each Party.

8. Mutual Indemnification: City shall defend, indemnify, and hold BART and its officers, directors, employees, and agents harmless from any and all claims, demands, suits, loss, damages, injury, and liabilities, direct or indirect (including reasonable attorney's fees and any and all costs and expenses in connection therewith), related to or as a result of City's performance of this Agreement to the extent caused, in whole or in part, by the negligence, recklessness, or willful misconduct of City, its employees, or subcontractors. City agrees at its own cost, expense and risk to defend any and all claims, actions, suits, or other legal proceedings brought or instituted against BART, its directors, officers, agents and employees, or any of them, arising out of City services, and to pay and satisfy any resulting judgments. Such indemnification includes without limitation any violation of proprietary rights, copyrights, rights of privacy, arising out of the publication, translation, reproduction, delivery, use or disposition of any data

furnished under this Program. BART shall indemnify and defend City and any of its employees performing services for BART from all suits, actions, and legal proceedings against City, resulting from the willful misconduct, recklessness or negligent acts or omissions of BART or of an employee of BART if the employee is acting in the employee's official capacity as an officer of BART. BART agrees at its own cost, expense and risk to defend any and all claims, actions, suits, or other legal proceedings brought or instituted against City, its directors, officers, agents and employees, or any of them, arising out of BART services, and to pay and satisfy any resulting judgments. Such indemnification includes without limitation any violation of proprietary rights, copyrights, rights of privacy, arising out of the publication, translation, reproduction, delivery, use or disposition of any data furnished under this Program.

- 9. **Insurance:** City will require that any contractor performing Project activities will comply with the City insurance requirements as provided in <u>Exhibit A</u>.
- 10. **Modification of Agreement.** This Agreement may not be modified, nor may compliance with any of its terms be waived, except by written instrument executed and approved in the same manner as this Agreement.
- 11. Agreement Made in California; Venue. The formation, interpretation and performance of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California. Venue for all litigation relative to the formation, interpretation and performance of this Agreement shall be in San Francisco.
- 12. Audit and Inspection of Records. The Parties agree to maintain and make available to each other, during regular business hours, accurate books and accounting records relating to their work under this Agreement and the work of any third parties performing work on the Project. The Parties will permit each other to audit, examine and make excerpts and transcripts from such books and records, and to make audits of all invoices, materials, payrolls, records or personnel and other data related to all other matters covered by this Agreement, whether funded in whole or in part under this Agreements. The Parties shall maintain such data and records in an accessible location and condition for a period of not less than three years after final audit has been resolved, whichever is later. The State of California or any federal agency having an interest in the subject matter of this Agreement shall have the same rights conferred upon the Parties by this Section. Pursuant to California Government Code Section 8546.7, the Parties shall be subject to the examination and audit of the State Auditor, at the request of BART or as part of any audit of BART by the State Auditor, for a period of three years after final payment under this Agreement. The examination and audit shall be confined to those matters connected with the performance of this Agreement including, but not limited to, the cost of administering the Agreement.

A. City Insurance Requirements

EXHIBIT -A-

CITY INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

- Insurance required shall be placed in Company or Companies having policyholders' surplus of at least 10 times the amount or limit of liability afforded by the insurance company.
- Insurance companies shall be legally authorized and licensed through the California Department of Insurance to engage in the business of furnishing insurance in the State of California. All insurance companies shall have a current A.M. Best Rating not less than "A-, VIII" and shall be satisfactory to the City.
- Insurance coverage with limits not less than:
 - \$1,000,000 Commercial General Liability
 - \$1,000,000 Commercial Auto Liability
 - \$1,000,000 Worker's Compensation Insurance
- Attach all policy endorsements to certificates of insurance (see below). Physical endorsements required. Endorsement language stated on the Description of Operations will NOT suffice.
- Additional endorsements required:
 - General Liability:
 - Name as Additional Insured the City and County of San Francisco, its Officers, Agents and Employees
