1	[Accept and Expend Grant – Pedestrian and Bicycle Projects - \$685,000]	
2		
3	Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency and the	
4	Department of Public Works to accept and expend state Transportation Development	
5	Act Article 3 funds totaling \$685,000 which consists of \$310,000 to the Department of	
6	Public Works and \$375,000 to the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency, for	
7	various pedestrian and bicycle projects in the City and County of San Francisco in	
8	FY2010-2011.

10	WHEREAS, Article 3 of the Transportation Development Act (TDA), Public Utilities	
11	Code (PUC) Section 99200 et seq., authorizes the submission of claims to a regional	
12	transportation planning agency for the funding of projects exclusively for the benefit and/or	
13	use of pedestrians and bicyclists; and,	
14	WHEREAS, The Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC), as the regional	
15	transportation planning agency for the San Francisco Bay region, has adopted MTC	
16	Resolution No. 875, Revised, entitled "Transportation Development Act, Article 3,	
17	Pedestrian/Bicycle Projects," which delineates procedures and criteria for submission of	
18	requests for the allocation of "TDA Article 3" funding; and,	
19	WHEREAS, MTC Resolution No. 875, Revised requires that requests for the allocation	
20	of TDA Article 3 funding be submitted as part of a single, countywide coordinated claim from	
21	each county in the San Francisco Bay region; and,	
22	WHEREAS, The San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) and the	
23	Department of Public Works (DPW) of the City and County of San Francisco desire to submit	
24	a request to MTC for the allocation of TDA Article 3 funds to support eligible projects that are	
25	for the exclusive benefit and/or use of pedestrians and or bicyclists; and,	

Supervisor Chu BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WHEREAS, The SFMTA and DPW are eligible to request allocations of TDA Article 3
 funds pursuant to Sections 99233.3 and 99234 of the Public Utilities Code to support various
 pedestrian and bicycle improvements; and,

4 WHEREAS, The SFMTA has identified \$41,000 in work for various bicycle safety 5 education programs to be funded from Fiscal Year 2010-11 TDA Article 3 funds; and,

6 WHEREAS, The SFMTA has identified \$334,000 in work for the planning, engineering,
7 implementation, and maintenance of bicycle facility projects at various locations throughout
8 San Francisco to be funded from Fiscal Year 2010-11 TDA Article 3 funds; and,

9 WHEREAS, There is no legal impediment or pending or threatened litigation that might 10 adversely affect the implementation of bicycle safety education programs or the planning and 11 engineering of bicycle facility projects; and,

WHEREAS, The SFMTA will not implement the bicycle facility projects until after the
 injunction preventing the City from implementing the San Francisco Bicycle Plan has been

14 lifted by the San Francisco Superior Court; and

WHEREAS, The City's Planning Commission has determined that the SFMTA's actions contemplated in this Resolution are in compliance with the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA, Public Resources Code Sections 21000 *et seq.*), which decision has been upheld by the Board of Supervisors; said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No._____ and is incorporated herein by reference; and,

21 WHEREAS, The SFMTA Board of Directors adopted Resolution No. 10-072 at its June 22 1, 2010 meeting, authorizing the Executive Director/CEO of the SFMTA (or his designee) to 23 execute documents necessary to accept and expend \$375,000 of Fiscal Year 2010-11 TDA 24 Article 3 funds for engineering for various bicycle projects and for bicycle safety programs; 25 and,

1 WHEREAS, DPW has identified \$155,000 in work for the preliminary engineering and 2 design of curb ramps to be constructed at various locations throughout San Francisco as 3 required by the federal Americans with Disabilities Act, to be funded from Fiscal Year 2010-11 4 TDA Article 3 funds; and, 5 WHEREAS, DPW has identified \$155,000 in work to repair public sidewalks at various 6 locations throughout San Francisco to be funded from Fiscal Year 2010-11 TDA Article 3 7 funds; and, 8 WHEREAS, There is no legal impediment or pending or threatened litigation that might 9 adversely affect DPW's projects described above, or that might impair the ability of DPW to 10 implement the projects; and, 11 WHEREAS, Environmental and right-of-way issues have been reviewed, and will not 12 jeopardize DPW's ability to meet fund obligations deadlines; and, 13 WHEREAS, The City's Planning Department has determined that DPW's actions 14 contemplated in this Resolution are in compliance with the requirements of the California 15 Environmental Quality Act (CEQA, Public Resources Code Sections 21000 et seq.); said 16 determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 17 and is incorporated herein by reference; and, 18 WHEREAS, The SFMTA's and DPW's staffing resources are adequate to complete the 19 projects; and, 20 WHEREAS, Adequate local funding is available to complete the projects; and, 21 WHEREAS, The projects are ready to commence implementation during the fiscal year 22 of the requested allocation; and, 23 WHEREAS, The SFMTA and DPW agree to maintain, or provide for the maintenance 24 of the projects for the benefit of and use by the public; and, 25

1	WHEREAS, The proposed grant budgets do not include indirect costs; now, therefore,		
2	be it		
3	RESOLVED, That this Board of Supervisors authorizes the San Francisco Municipal		
4	Transportation Agency and the Department of Public Works to accept and expend up to		
5	\$685,000 in state TDA Article 3 funds for FY 2010-11 for the projects described above and to		
6	execute all required documents for receipts of such funds.
