FY2021-22 Budget Overview

\$25.9M Increase from FY 2020-21: 95% of Increase Results from Salary COLAs and capital projects

Salaries and Benefits

- FY21-22 increase of \$13.8M
- Virtually all of this increase results from regular salary and benefits increases/COLA
- One new FTE: Civilian analyst to manage body-worn-camera policy/process
- FY21-22 increase offset by reducing/civilianizing DPH staff March 2022; FY22-23 full-year reduction of -\$4.0M

Capital spending

- FY21-22 increase of \$11.0M
- CJ2 elevators, CJ2/CJ3 Fire safety, and CJ3 security electronics.

Professional Services

- FY21-22 increase of \$1.2M
- Free phone calls, Body work cameras, Jail Management System (recommended by Re-Envision Jail work group)

CBOs

- FY21-22 increase of \$0.7M
- Cost of in-custody programing costs moved from now-defunct Inmate Welfare Fund to the General Fund

Redeployment of Staff/Civilianization

Station Transfers

- Assumed responsibility for transporting individuals from arrest site to county jail
- Reduces risk of COVID spread to SFPD stations
- De-escalates by separating individual from arresting officer
- Improves deployment efficiencies for SFPD

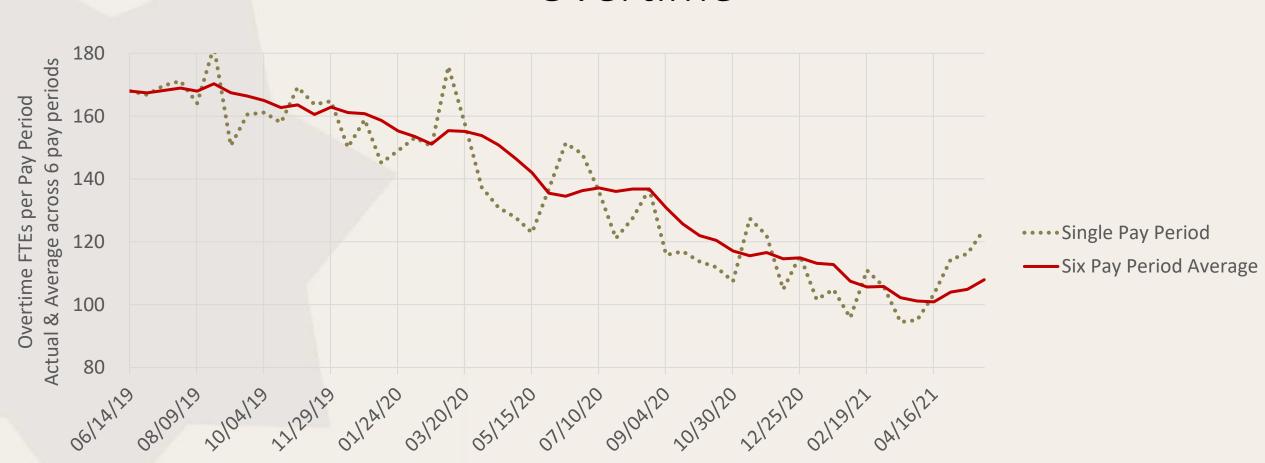
Department of Public Health

- Replace sworn staff with civilian cadets and clinicians
- Reduce sworn deputies at DPH locations by 18 FTE
- Redeployment scheduled for March 2022
- Cost savings: \$1M in FY2021-22, \$4M in FY2022-23

City Services Audit

- 34 positions identified for civilianization
- Central Records and Warrants, Human Resources, Information Technology
- Impacted by slow hiring process
