[Fire Department cost recovery for vehicle incidents.]

Ordinance amending the San Francisco Fire Code by adding Section 112.22 to Appendix Chapter 1, to authorize the Fire Department to recover costs incurred removing vehicle contents from City streets and highways after vehicle incidents.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in this Ordinance are in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources Code sections 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 100715 and is incorporated herein by reference.

Section 2. Findings. California Vehicle Code Section 17300(c) provides that a person who willfully or negligently causes or permits the contents of a vehicle to be deposited on a street or highway, or its appurtenances, is liable for the reasonable costs of removing those contents from the street or highway. This ordinance authorizes the Fire Department to submit a claim for reimbursement of recoverable costs for removing vehicle contents from City streets and highways under Section 17300. <u>In adopting this legislation</u>, it is the intention of the Board of Supervisors that only persons found at fault for vehicle incidents be subject to this fee.

Section 3. The San Francisco Fire Code is hereby amended by adding Section 112.22 to Appendix Chapter 1, to read as follows:

SEC. 112.22. COST RECOVERY RELATED TO VEHICLE INCIDENTS.

(a) The Fire Department may submit a claim to recover its reasonable costs incurred responding to a motor vehicle incident in the City and County of San Francisco where a person has willfully or negligently caused or permitted the contents of a motor vehicle to be deposited on a street or highway, or its appurtenances, and the Fire Department removes those vehicle contents from the street or highway, or its appurtenances. Vehicle contents may include gas, oil and vehicle debris. The Fire Department shall submit the claim to the insurance company of the person responsible for willfully or negligently causing or permitting the vehicle contents to be deposited on the street or highway, or its appurtenances.

(b) The Fire Department shall submit claims in the following amounts:

Any incident where the vehicle content removal	An amount based on the reasonable time and

(c) After a noticed hearing, the Chief of the Fire Department may promulgate rules to effectuate the purposes of this Section or to facilitate the claim process.

Section 4. This ordinance shall become operative on its effective date or on July 1, 2010, whichever is later.
