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[Accept and Expend Grant - Pedestrian and Bicycle Projects - \$685,000]

Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency and the Department of Public Works to accept and expend state Transportation Development Act Article 3 funds totaling \$685,000 which consists of \$310,000 to the Department of Public Works and \$375,000 to the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency, for various pedestrian and bicycle projects in the City and County of San Francisco in FY2010-2011.

WHEREAS, Article 3 of the Transportation Development Act (TDA), Public Utilities Code (PUC) Section 99200 *et seq.*, authorizes the submission of claims to a regional transportation planning agency for the funding of projects exclusively for the benefit and/or use of pedestrians and bicyclists; and,

WHEREAS, The Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC), as the regional transportation planning agency for the San Francisco Bay region, has adopted MTC Resolution No. 875, Revised, entitled "Transportation Development Act, Article 3, Pedestrian/Bicycle Projects," which delineates procedures and criteria for submission of requests for the allocation of "TDA Article 3" funding; and,

WHEREAS, MTC Resolution No. 875, Revised requires that requests for the allocation of TDA Article 3 funding be submitted as part of a single, countywide coordinated claim from each county in the San Francisco Bay region; and,

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) and the Department of Public Works (DPW) of the City and County of San Francisco desire to submit a request to MTC for the allocation of TDA Article 3 funds to support eligible projects that are for the exclusive benefit and/or use of pedestrians and or bicyclists; and,

WHEREAS, The SFMTA and DPW are eligible to request allocations of TDA Article 3 funds pursuant to Sections 99233.3 and 99234 of the Public Utilities Code to support various pedestrian and bicycle improvements; and,

WHEREAS, The SFMTA has identified \$41,000 in work for various bicycle safety education programs to be funded from Fiscal Year 2010-11 TDA Article 3 funds; and,

WHEREAS, The SFMTA has identified \$334,000 in work for the planning, engineering, implementation, and maintenance of bicycle facility projects at various locations throughout San Francisco to be funded from Fiscal Year 2010-11 TDA Article 3 funds; and,

WHEREAS, There is no legal impediment or pending or threatened litigation that might adversely affect the implementation of bicycle safety education programs or the planning and engineering of bicycle facility projects; and,

WHEREAS, The SFMTA will not implement the bicycle facility projects until after the injunction preventing the City from implementing the San Francisco Bicycle Plan has been lifted by the San Francisco Superior Court; and

WHEREAS, The City's Planning Commission has determined that the SFMTA's actions contemplated in this Resolution are in compliance with the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA, Public Resources Code Sections 21000 *et seq.*), which decision has been upheld by the Board of Supervisors; said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. _____ and is incorporated herein by reference; and,

WHEREAS, The SFMTA Board of Directors adopted Resolution No. 10-072 at its June 1, 2010 meeting, authorizing the Executive Director/CEO of the SFMTA (or his designee) to execute documents necessary to accept and expend \$375,000 of Fiscal Year 2010-11 TDA Article 3 funds for engineering for various bicycle projects and for bicycle safety programs; and,

WHEREAS, DPW has identified \$155,000 in work for the preliminary engineering and design of curb ramps to be constructed at various locations throughout San Francisco as required by the federal Americans with Disabilities Act, to be funded from Fiscal Year 2010-11 TDA Article 3 funds; and,

WHEREAS, DPW has identified \$155,000 in work to repair public sidewalks at various locations throughout San Francisco to be funded from Fiscal Year 2010-11 TDA Article 3 funds; and,

WHEREAS, There is no legal impediment or pending or threatened litigation that might adversely affect DPW's projects described above, or that might impair the ability of DPW to implement the projects; and,

WHEREAS, Environmental and right-of-way issues have been reviewed, and will not jeopardize DPW's ability to meet fund obligations deadlines; and,

WHEREAS, The City's Planning Department has determined that DPW's actions contemplated in this Resolution are in compliance with the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA, Public Resources Code Sections 21000 *et seq.*); said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 100885 and is incorporated herein by reference; and,

WHEREAS, The SFMTA's and DPW's staffing resources are adequate to complete the projects; and,

Transportation Development Act, Article 3 State Grant Funds

Summary

The Municipal Transportation Agency and the Department of Public Works request authorization to accept and expend \$685,000 in Transportation Development Act, Article 3 (TDA 3) state funds available for County bicycle and pedestrian projects. SFMTA will use \$375,000 for bicycle education programs, as well as bicycle facility planning, engineering, implementation and maintenance. DPW will use \$310,000 for planning and design of curb ramps, as well as sidewalk repair at various sites throughout the City.

Background

The TDA of 1971 earmarked ¼ percent of the general state sales tax for transit and created a Local Transportation Fund (LTF) in each county to receive the funds. The State Board of Equalization returns the general sales tax revenues to each county's Local Transportation Fund according to the sales tax collected in each county.

Article 3 of the TDA apportions 2% of the ¼ cent sales tax for the purpose of funding bicycle facility, education and safety projects as well as pedestrian, and street & road development projects. The funds are allocated by the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) annually and disbursed under TDA Article 3 to the nine Bay Area counties. The grant does not have a matching fund requirement.

MTC's FY 10-11 revenue estimate for San Francisco is \$653,499, which SFMTA and DPW plan to split equally. Given concerns that this estimate assumes more aggressive sales growth than the county will realize, DPW is requesting \$310,000 (rather than \$326,750). SFMTA has a prior year carryover that allows an application for \$375,000.

Project Selection

MTA proposes to use:

- \$334,000 for the planning, engineering, implementation, and maintenance of various bicycle facilities, such as: striping and signing Class II bikeways (bike lanes); improving Class III bikeways (bike routes) by widening curb lanes and installing shared lane bicycle pavement symbols ("sharrows"), especially on roadways with heavy traffic volumes and narrow lanes; bicycle parking (bike racks, lockers and other materials & measures to facilitate bicycle parking); and implementing a bicycle sharing program. The choice of projects is based on input SFMTA received from various community groups, such as the San Francisco Bicycle Coalition and the Board of Supervisors' Bicycle Advisory Committee.
- \$41,000 for various bicycle safety programs such as educational events, safety brochures, flyers, maps, public outreach campaigns to promote safe bicycling, outdoor media and advertising, purchase and distribution of bicycle safety equipment and materials, and staff attendance at bicycle safety-related conferences and trainings.

DPW proposes to use:

- \$155,000 to repair public sidewalks at various locations in San Francisco. Sites for repair will be selected from DPW's list of public requests and prioritized based on condition of sidewalk, extent of damage, level of pedestrian use, accidents and complaints.
- \$155,000 for preliminary engineering (planning and design) of curb ramps at various sites throughout the City. Locations will be selected from a list developed by DPW and the Mayor's Office of Disability (MOD). The city prioritizes curb ramp locations using guidelines established under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and the City's ADA Transition Plan for curb ramps and sidewalks. The top priorities are locations that residents with disabilities have identified as ramps they need in order to safely get to transit stops, civic buildings, and to and from work. Additionally, DPW prioritizes public requests from areas with higher populations of people with disabilities and low numbers of usable curb ramps.

The project encompasses various locations within San Francisco city limits primarily within the public right-of-way, 34 miles of bicycle lanes and 75 miles of sharrows (shared roadway bicycle markings intended to alert drivers that bicyclists share the traffic lane). The locations include some areas within the jurisdiction of the Port of San Francisco and the Recreation and Parks Department. The project area is generally bounded by: North Point Street to the north; Geneva Avenue to the south; The Embarcadero to the east; and The Great Highway to the west.

The San Francisco County Superior Court issued a peremptory writ of mandate on November 7, 2006 preventing the City and County of San Francisco from implementing portions of the San Francisco Bicycle Plan until environmental review has been completed on the entire plan. On June 25, 2009 the final environmental impact report for the 2009 San Francisco Bicycle Plan was approved and the plan was adopted by the San Francisco Planning Commission. On June 26, 2009, the SFMTA Board adopted the CEQA findings and the Bicycle Plan. The San Francisco Planning Department issued its notice of determination for the San Francisco Bicycle Plan on August 12, 2009 and it was filed by the county clerk on August 14, 2009.

This request will fund planning and engineering work, physical changes that are permitted by the court (maintenance, specific projects cleared for implementation, minor improvements such as sharrows, bike racks, innovative projects and spot improvements) prior to the full lifting of the injunction, and then the implementation of additional projects once the injunction is fully lifted (est. July 2010). For projects that are still subject to the injunction, we are doing engineering work so that implementation can start as soon after the lifting of the injunction as possible. The injunction expressly permits "approving, funding or continuing with any studies, engineering, planning or other administrative work on any item in the 2005 San Francisco Bike Plan or any proposed improvement to any bicycle route, including work up to and including adoption or any motion or resolution or ordinance by the appropriate public agency body."
