6	WHEREAS, The Electorate of the City and County of San Francisco passed
7	Proposition O in November 2008, establishing an Access Line Tax to be imposed upon
8	every person who subscribes to telephone communication services within the City and
9	County of San Francisco (Business and Tax Regulations Code, Section 782); and,
10	WHEREAS, Sections 782 (b) and 784 state, in part, that the cap and rates
11	established by this subsection shall be adjusted annually in accordance with the increase in
12	the Consumer Price Index; All Urban Consumers for the San Francisco/ Oakland/San Jose
13	Area for all items as reported by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics, or any
14	successor to that index, as of December 31st of each year; and,
15	WHEREAS, Sections 782 and 784 also require that this increase be approved,
16	annually, by the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor; and,
17	WHEREAS, The Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers for the San
18	Francisco/Oakland/Hayward Area for All Items as reported by the United States Bureau of
19	Labor Statistics increased from 297.0 in December 2019 to 302.9 in December 2020, an
20	increase of 2.00%; and,
21	WHEREAS, The monthly rates are currently set at \$3.73 per Access Line, \$28.02 per
22	Trunk Line, and \$504.40 per High Capacity Line and the Annual Cap is \$74,745.76; and,
23	WHEREAS, The new monthly rates will be \$3.80 per Access Line, \$28.58 per Trunk
24	Line, and \$514.49 per High Capacity Line and the new Annual Cap will be \$76,240.89; and,

SUBJECT: Notification of Access Line Tax Annual Rate Adjustment

In November 2008, San Francisco voters approved Proposition O to replace the Emergency Response Fee with the Access Line Tax. Prop. O allows for annual inflationary adjustments to the per line tax rates and the annual payment cap. As codified in San Francisco Business and Tax Regulations Code Section 784:

The amount of the tax shall be \$2.75 per month per access line, \$20.62 per month per trunk line and \$371.15 per month per high capacity line. These amounts shall be adjusted annually in accordance with the increase in the Consumer Price Index: All Urban Consumers for the San Francisco/Oakland/San Jose Area for All Items as reported by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics, or any successor to that index, as of December 31st of each year, beginning with December 31, 2009.

As codified in San Francisco Business and Tax Regulations Code Section 782(b):

The cap established by this subsection shall be adjusted annually in accordance with the increase in the Consumer Price Index; All Urban Consumers for the San Francisco/Oakland/San Jose Area for All Items as reported by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics, or any successor to that index, as of December 31st of each year, beginning with December 31, 2009.

In January 2021, the Controller's Office calculated the inflationary increase on fees to be 2.00%. Source data are from the US Department of Labor Bureau of Labor Statistics website using the "Consumer Price Index (CPI) – All Urban Consumers for the San Francisco—Oakland–Hayward CA Area," using December factors from the end of the prior year. The difference between the inflation index for December 2019 (297.0) and December 2020 (302.9) is 5.9, or 2.00%

When applied to current rates per line, the new rates are as follows:
