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15	Section 1. Environmental Findings.
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16	The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in this
17	ordinance comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources
18	Code Sections 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of
19	Supervisors in File No and is incorporated herein by reference. The Board affirms this
20	determination.
21	
22	Section 2. The Park Code is hereby amended by deleting Section 12.50, as follows:
23	SEC. 12.50. SUNSET PROVISIONS.
24	Unless extended by ordinance, the paragraphs in Sections 12.05(a), 12.06(a), 12.34(a), and
25	12.46(a) that authorize temporary increases and decreases of non-resident Adult fees at certain

1	specialty attractions, adopted via Ordinance No. 194-19, and any such increases or decreases that the
2	Department General Manager may have approved pursuant to those paragraphs, shall expire by
3	operation of law on June 30, 2021. Upon expiration of those paragraphs, the City Attorney shall cause
4	those paragraphs and this Section 12.50 to be removed from the Park Code.
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6	Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
7	enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
8	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
9	of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
