11	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

13	Section 1. The Board of Supervisors hereby adopts the rate determined by the		
14	Controller, pursuant to Business and Tax Regulations Code Article 12B-1, Section 1032, as		
15	the percentage ceiling that a taxpayer may designate for deposit in the Neighborhood		
16	Beautification and Graffiti Clean-up Fund. Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the		
17	Board of Supervisors in File No. 210656, and is incorporated herein by reference. For the		
18	2021 tax year, the designation ceiling shall be 5.9% of a taxpayer's gross receipts tax		
19	liability for the year.		
20	The Treasurer and Tax Collector shall post the designation ceiling to the website of		
21	the Treasurer and Tax Collector.

23	Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after		
24	enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the		
25	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the		
	Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

SUBJECT: Notification of Gross Receipts Tax Designation Ceiling to the Neighborhood Beautification Fund

Article 12B-1 of the Business & Tax Regulations Code establishes the Neighborhood Beautification and Graffiti Clean-Up Fund Option (now known as the Community Challenge Grant Program), under which taxpayers subject to the gross receipts tax may elect to designate a portion of their tax liability to the Fund. Section 1032 requires the Controller to calculate the maximum percentage of their tax liability that taxpayers can elect to contribute to the Fund such that total contributions will be approximately \$1,000,000, adjusted for inflation.

To permit the Office of the Treasurer and Tax Collector to create the online filing forms necessary to collect the gross receipts taxes, our office calculated the tax year 2021 target contribution amount and resultant contribution rate. The inflationary increase for tax year 2021 was calculated with data from the US Department of Labor Bureau of Labor Statistics website using the Consumer Price Index (CPI) – All Urban Consumers for the San Francisco–Oakland–Hayward CA Area, with annual factors from the end of the prior year.

Given tax year 2020 contributions of \$1.50 million, we estimate that a 5.9% contribution ceiling would result in contributions equal to the inflation adjusted target amount of \$2.37 million for tax year 2021. Figures are provided in the table below.
