The mission of the UCSF California Preterm Birth Initiative (PTBi) is to reduce racial disparities in preterm birth. Through our research we have identified housing insecurity, homelessness and structural racism to be a major drivers of preterm birth, low birth weight, maternal mortality and other birth disparities. We know Black women carry the burden of these disparities — we utilize our research to educate policy makers about appropriate interventions that need to be scaled up. We provide training and support to BIPOC parents and birthing people to conduct community based participatory action research. Our cohort of parents know as the Benioff Community Innovators conducted an assessment in San Francisco that highlight how housing insecurity impacts birthing people and families with young children. The assessment report highlights recommendations in policy and practice which have been shared out with a variety of stakeholders in the housing and health field. I have worked with UCSF PTBi for the past 5 years and currently serve as the Director of Community Engagement and Partnerships. I am a Black woman, San Francisco native, have lived experience with housing insecurity and system involvement as a young person. I have engaged with many of the prevention, intervention and crisis response programs in San Francisco.

I am a formerly homeless Latinx teen and mother. I grew up in San Francisco. I live in BMR housing, but before that I was homeless from fifteen as an unaccompanied minor to twenty-one years old as a mother. I lived on the streets, between friend shouses, and then at Star Community Home the Benioff funded shelter in 2011/12 with my oldest daughter. I used local community resources and services to get to where I am today. My family (my two daughters and I) are products of what positive investments in the community can make. I feel an overwhelming sense of responsibility to be on this committee. I want to ensure the needs of San Franciscans are met with these funds. Such as, but not limited to: housing creation through acquiring property, substantial investments in homeless families and senior/disabled single adults, DV survivors, reentry services, mental health services, hygiene services, and outreach and support for homeless or precariously housed youth.

I recently graduated from Haas at UC Berkeley after working as a Peer Organizer at the Coalition on Homelessness to becoming a Shelter Client Advocate under Eviction Defense Collaborative. I have worked closely with City and County of San Francisco government and employees, community organizations, shelter staff and clients, the homeless community, and SFHA. I have the professional and personal experience necessary to be on the oversight committee.

I am a 54 year old white bi female who resides in the Mission District where I raised my two sons. I am a native of the bay area and deeply committed to ensuring equity and systemic change in the city I reside and work. I am very humbled to have had the priviledge of working on ending homelessness side by side with unhoused residents and front line service providers for the past 30 years. I am deeply committed to ensuring that unhoused people themselves are listened to, treated with dignity, and my work is about ensuring their brilliance and self determination is uplifted, prioritized and embraced.

I have been working at the Coalition on Homelessness for the past 26 years, first as a fundraiser, then organizer on substance use and mental health issues, then organizing director and now executive director since 2007. Previously, I was the Director of the Hunger and Homeless Action Coalition of San Mateo County. In that time, working in a collaborative leadership role, I have partaked in many victories for unhoused people including radically expanding substance abuse treatment system, reforming mental health system, crafting accessible systems of care, reallocation of city wealth towards correcting systemic inequities, halting tasers, reducing the criminalization of unhoused people, and securing funding for thousands of housing subsidies and units.

I am a current member of the OCOH oversight body in Seat 8. I am the Immediate Needs Liason, and have worked to ensure the voices of unhoused people are heard and that their needs are prioritized, with a particular focus on ensuring that our dollars spent directly lead to permanent exits off the streets and out of shelters. #### ARTICLE XLI: OUR CITY, OUR HOME OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE

# SEC. 5.41-1. ESTABLISHMENT OF OUR CITY, OUR HOME OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE.

(a) In approving Proposition C in the November 6, 2018 general municipal election, the voters of the City and County of San Francisco adopted the Homelessness Gross Receipts Tax Ordinance, codified in Business and Tax Regulations Code <u>Article 28</u>. One section of that measure, Business and Tax Regulations Code Section <u>2810</u>, sets forth the required and permissible expenditures of monies collected under the Homelessness Gross Receipts Tax Ordinance and deposited to the credit of the Our City, Our Home Fund (the "Fund") established in Administrative Code Section <u>10.100-164</u>. Section 2810 envisions the establishment of the Our City, Our Home Oversight Committee to monitor and provide advice regarding the administration of the Fund.

(b) Consistent with the intent of the voters in adopting Proposition C, the Board of Supervisors hereby establishes the Our City, Our Home Oversight Committee (the "Committee").

(Added by Ord. <u>51-19</u>, File No. 181210, App. 3/22/2019, Eff. 4/22/2019) SEC. 5.41-2. PURPOSES AND DUTIES.

The Committee shall have the following purposes and duties:

(a) All the purposes and duties as set forth in Business and Tax Regulations Code Section 2810(e)(1) and (2).

(b) Identify barriers to safe and successful exits out of homelessness, and propose to the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor ways to reduce those barriers or the impact of those barriers.

(c) Solicit substantive input from people who are Homeless regarding spending priorities. The Committee may seek this input through all appropriate means, including but not limited to conducting surveys and focus groups, and coordinating with community organizations that conduct outreach and/or provide services to Homeless people.

(d) Each needs assessment conducted in accordance with Business and Tax Regulations Code Section  $\underline{2810}(e)(2)(B)$  shall be provided in the form of a written report within the time frames there specified. The needs assessment specified in Section  $\underline{2810}(e)(2)(B)$  shall include an assessment of the needs of Homeless people with disabilities, and the report shall include an assessment of available data regarding the disability status of Homeless people served by the programs and expenditures described in Business and Tax Regulations Code Section  $\underline{2810}(b)(3)$ .

(e) In conjunction with each needs assessment report, at least 60 days before issuing the report, the Committee shall provide a draft of the report to each City department discussed in the report, and allow the department 30 days to provide a written response to the Committee. The

Committee shall include any such responses that it timely receives from departments in the report.

(f) For purposes of this Section 5.41-2, the term "Homeless" has the same meaning as in Business and Tax Regulations Code Section 2810(h)(1).

(Added by Ord. <u>51-19</u>, File No. 181210, App. 3/22/2019, Eff. 4/22/2019) SEC. 5.41-3. MEMBERSHIP AND TERMS OF OFFICE.

(a) The Committee shall have nine voting members, with qualifications and appointing authorities as set forth in Business and Tax Regulations Code Section  $\underline{2810}(e)(3)(A)$  and (B). An appointment to a seat on the Committee may not become effective before the effective date of this Article XLI.

(b) The terms of each seat on the Committee shall commence on the effective date of this Article XLI. Terms of seats shall be for two years, except that the initial terms for odd-numbered seats shall be for three years.

(c) Service on the Committee shall be voluntary and members shall receive no compensation from the City.

(d) Members may be removed by their appointing authorities at any time. Additionally, any member who misses three regular meetings of the Committee within a six-month period without the express approval of the Committee at or before each missed meeting shall be deemed to have resigned from the Committee ten days after the third unapproved absence. The Committee shall inform the member's appointing authority of any such resignation.

(Added by Ord. <u>51-19</u>, File No. 181210, App. 3/22/2019, Eff. 4/22/2019)

SEC. 5.41-4. ORGANIZATION AND SUPPORT.

(a) The Committee shall hold its inaugural meeting not more than 30 days after at least six members have been appointed to the Committee. There shall be at least ten days' notice of the inaugural meeting. Following the inaugural meeting, the Committee shall hold at least one additional meeting before June 30, 2019. Thereafter, the Committee shall hold a regular meeting not less than six times per fiscal year.

(b) The Committee shall elect a Chair, Vice-Chair, and officers for such other positions, if any, it chooses to create. The Chair, or the Vice-Chair if the Chair is unavailable, shall be responsible for developing the Committee's agendas and conducting meetings. The Committee may establish bylaws and rules for its organization and procedures.

(c) All City departments, commissions, boards, and agencies shall cooperate with the Committee in the performance of its functions. At least one representative from each of the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing, the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development, the Office of the Controller, and the Department of Public Health shall attend all regular meetings of the Committee to be available to provide policy support to the Committee.

(d) The Controller shall provide administrative and clerical support for the Committee.

(e) Notwithstanding Rule 2.21 of the Board of Supervisors Rules of Order, which provides that advisory bodies created by the Board of Supervisors should sunset within three years, the Committee shall not expire unless the Board enacts an ordinance terminating the Committee.
