13	Section 1. The Municipal Elections Code is hereby amended by adding Article XI,
14	consisting of Sections 1101 and 1102, to read as follows:
15	ARTICLE XI: VOTE-BY-MAIL IN MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS
16	SEC. 1101. DEFINITIONS.
17	Whenever the following terms are used in this Article XI, the following definitions shall apply.
18	Other terms shall be defined as set forth in the California Elections Code.
19	"Department" means the San Francisco Department of Elections.
20	"Exclusively Municipal Election" shall mean any election for local officials or measures to be
21	held in the City and County that the City has not consolidated with a Federal Election or State
22	Election, including, but not limited to, municipal elections held on the Tuesday immediately following
23	the first Monday in November in 2023 and in every fourth year following 2023.
24	"Federal Election" shall mean any election for Federal officials held in the City and County.

1 "State Election" shall mean any election for State officials or measures held in the City and 2 County. 3 4 SEC. 1102. EXPANSION OF VOTE-BY-MAIL FOR EXCLUSIVELY MUNICIPAL 5 ELECTIONS. 6 (a) **Purpose.** The Department shall seek to expand the use of vote-by-mail by San Francisco 7 voters to the extent permitted by State law. If any subsequent State or federal law (including, but not 8 limited to, statutes and executive orders) that requires the Department to provide vote-by-mail ballots 9 to all registered voters for all municipal elections is approved, enacted, or issued prior to or after the 10 effective date of the ordinance in Board of Supervisors File No. 210604, this Article XI shall be 11 inoperative and the City Attorney shall cause it to be removed from the Municipal Elections Code. 12 (b) Implementation. 13 (1) To the extent not otherwise rendered inoperative by subsection (a), in Exclusively 14 Municipal Elections, the Department shall begin distributing vote-by-mail ballots to all registered 15 voters, including to voters who have not applied to become vote-by-mail voters, by no later than 29 16 days before the date of the election. 17 (2) The Department shall attempt to inform every San Francisco household regarding 18 the opportunity to register as a vote-by-mail voter, as authorized under the California Elections Code, 19 for all municipal elections held in the City and County. Such attempts to inform San Francisco 20 households may include: mail or postcards sent to San Francisco addresses; advertisements on radio 21 or television; posts on the Department's social media accounts; signs in public locations or on public 22 transit; or flyers distributed through storefronts or at public events and gatherings. 23 24 Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after 25 enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the

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### **LEGISLATIVE DIGEST**

[Municipal Elections Code - Expanded Vote-by-Mail for Exclusively Municipal Elections]

Ordinance amending the Municipal Elections Code to require the Department of Elections to expand use of vote-by-mail ballots at exclusively municipal elections and encourage further use of vote-by-mail ballots in all elections.

### **Existing Law**

The Municipal Elections Code ("MEC") currently does not address the use of vote-by-mail ballots in municipal elections. The MEC generally incorporates the California Elections Code, except as otherwise provided. MEC § 100.

Under State law, for any election held prior to January 1, 2022, all registered voters will be automatically sent a vote-by-mail ballot. Cal. Elec. Code § 3000.5. Under this provision, the Department of Elections ("Department") would have five days to mail a ballot to each person who is registered to vote on or before the 29th day before an election and five days to mail a ballot to each person who subsequently registers to vote.

In future elections, after January 1, 2022, registered voters would need to apply to receive a vote-by-mail ballot or for permanent vote-by-mail status, if they have not done so already. Cal Elec. Code §§ 3001, 3201.

### Amendments to Current Law

For exclusively municipal elections, the proposed ordinance would require Department to begin distributing vote-by-mail ballots to all registered voters, including to voters who have not applied to become vote-by-mail voters, by no later than 29 days before the date of the election. The ordinance defines an exclusively municipal election as any local election that is not consolidated with a State or federal election, including local elections held in November 2023 and in every fourth year following 2023.

In the event a subsequent State or federal law requires the Department to automatically distribute vote-by-mail ballots to registered voters in all elections, these provisions would become inoperative and be removed from the MEC.

In addition, for all elections, the Department would attempt to inform every San Francisco household regarding the opportunity to register as a vote-by-mail voter, such as through mailed notices, advertisements or flyers.

### **Background Information**

The State Legislature is currently considering legislation (AB 37) that would continue the automatic distribution of vote-by-mail ballots to all registered voters beyond January 1, 2022.

For the November 3, 2020 Consolidated General Election, pursuant to State law, the Department distributed vote-by-mail ballots to all registered voters. At that election, approximately 79% of San Francisco registered voters cast their votes through vote-by-mail ballots.
