12 13	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:		
14	Section 1. The Business and Tax Regulations Code is hereby amended by revising		
15	Section 249.8, to read as follows:		
16	SEC. 249.8. EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES.		
17	(a) Every person, firm, or corporation engaged in operating a private ambulance that		
18	requires a Certificate of Operation shall pay an initial application fee of \$12,193 \$10,000 at the		
19	time of filing the initial application, and an annual renewal fee of $\$6,096$ $\$5,000$ to the		
20	Department of Emergency Management Public Health.		
21	(b) Every person, firm, or corporation holding a Certificate of Operation must also pay		
22	an annual ambulance permit fee of $\$1,950$ $\$1,600$ for each vehicle to the Department of		
23	Emergency Management Public Health.		
24	(c) As authorized by <u>Section 100083 of</u> Title 22 of the California Code of Regulations,		
25	the following fees are due and payable to the Department of Emergency Management Public		

1	Health by every person, firm, or corporation applying for and renewing the certification for an
2	Emergency Medical Services ("EMS") Training Program:
3	(1) EMS Training Program Initial Application: \$2,163 \$1,775 for a Paramedic
4	Program, <u>\$1,445</u> \$1,185 for an Emergency Medical Technician ("EMT") Program, and <u>\$725</u>
5	\$595 for a Continuing Education Program.
6	(2) EMS Training Program Renewal, due every four years from the time of the
7	last renewal: \$1,085 \$890 for a Paramedic Program, \$792 \$650 for an EMT Program, and \$439
8	\$360 for a Continuing Education Program.
9	(d) As authorized by <u>Section 100083 of</u> Title 22 of the California Code of Regulations
10	and Section 1797.212 of the California Health and Safety Code, the following fees are due
11	and payable to the Department of Emergency Management Public Health by persons applying for
12	and renewing EMT Certificates:
13	(1) Application for initial EMT Certificate: \$177 \$145.
14	(2) Renewal of current and valid EMT Certificate, not including EMT-Paramedic
15	<u>\$130</u> \$107 due every two years.
16	(3) Application for initial EMT-Paramedic Accreditation: \$38 \$31.
17	(e) As authorized by Sections 1798, 1798.2, and 1798.164 of the California Health and
18	Safety Code, the following fees are due and payable annually in advance to the Department
19	of Emergency Management Public Health by the following facilities (as defined in Section 901 of
20	the Health Code) that receive patients through Ambulance Service Providers:
21	(1) Receiving Hospital: <u>\$18,596</u> \$10,719 .
22	(2) STEMI (ST segment elevation myocardial infarction) Center: \$22,728
23	<i>\$13,310</i> .
24	(f) The fees in this Section 249.8 shall be retroactive and effective as of <u>July 1, 2020</u>

1	(g) Beginning with fiscal year $\underline{2021-2022}$ $\underline{2009-2010}$ and annually thereafter, the fees set
2	forth in this Section 249.8 may be adjusted each year, without further action by the Board of
3	Supervisors, as set forth in this subsection (g). Not later than April 1, the Director of the
4	Department of Emergency Management Public Health shall report to the Controller the revenues
5	generated by the fees for the prior fiscal year and the prior fiscal year's costs of operation, as
6	well as any other information that the Controller determines appropriate to the performance of
7	the duties set forth in this Article $\underline{2}$. Not later than May 15, the Controller shall determine
8	whether the current fees have produced or are projected to produce revenues sufficient to
9	support the costs of providing the services for which the fee is assessed and that the fees will
10	not produce revenue that is significantly more than the costs of providing the services for
11	which the fee is assessed. The Controller shall, if necessary, adjust the fees upward or
12	downward for the upcoming fiscal year as appropriate to ensure that the program recovers the
13	costs of operation without producing revenue that is significantly more than such costs. The
14	adjusted rates shall become operative on July 1.

(h) For all services and other matters for which a fee is set forth in this Section 249.8, the Department of Emergency Management shall maintain on its website a listing of current fees, and shall make available upon request a copy of the listing of current fees.

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Section 2. The fees stated in Business and Tax Regulations Code Section 249.8 as amended by this ordinance do not constitute an actual increase in fees but rather reflect the fees that are currently in place as a result of the authorized adjustments to those amounts over the years pursuant to the process outlined in subsection (g) of Section 249.8.

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Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the

1	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
2	of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

4	Section 4. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors
5	intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles,
6	numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal
7	Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment
8	additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under
9	the official title of the ordinance.

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LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Business and Tax Regulations Code - Emergency Medical Services Fees]

Ordinance amending the Business and Tax Regulations Code to update emergency medical services fees to reflect amounts currently authorized and charged under annual adjustment provisions, and to require that the fees be paid to the Department of Emergency Management rather than the Department of Public Health.

Existing Law

The City charges a number of fees to operators of private ambulances, emergency medical technicians and paramedics, and emergency medical facilities. The fees are paid to the Department of Public Health, which, as the City's Emergency Medical Services Agency, is responsible for regulating these emergency medical services.

The City is transferring responsibility for emergency medical services from the Department of Public Health to the Department of Emergency Management.

The fees set in this section of the Administrative Code, as well as in some other sections of the Code, are adjusted each year by the Controller, without further action by the Board of Supervisors, to reflect changes in the costs of providing the services for which the fees are charged.


Amendments to Current Law

The proposal is an ordinance that would amend the Administrative Code to make the fees payable to the Department of Emergency Management rather than the Department of Public Health.

In addition, the proposal would amend the fees to reflect intervening administrative adjustments and to show the actual amounts currently authorized and charged. The proposal would not actually increase any fees beyond the amounts already set pursuant to the existing terms of the ordinance.
