The following activities are **not allowed**:

- Response costs associated with electric disruption events including any staffing or new positions, Emergency Operations Center staffing, security, law or fire response, or other overtime charges.


All activities funded with this allocation must be completed within the period of performance. Additionally, the Subrecipient is subject to the following requirements:

- As a condition of receiving funding, counties will be required to collaborate with cities within their jurisdiction to support critical infrastructure and resiliency county-wide with a particular focus on public safety, vulnerable communities and individuals with access and functional needs.
- Must ensure that they and their principals are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, or declared ineligible.
- Must provide two reports on the expenditures of the funds. The first report is due no later than **November 30, 2020**, and the second no later than **November 30, 2022**. These reports shall identify how the funds have been used, including identifying each project or activity undertaken, local entity that undertook the project or activity, the amount of funding provided to the project or activity, and a description of each project or activity. The report shall also identify the specific outcomes achieved by each project or activity, including whether the project or activity was completed and whether it was used during PSPS events.
- Must coordinate with their city or county planning agency to ensure that the project is in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (Public Resources Code, Section 21000 et seq.).

- Comply with the California Public Records Act, Government Code section 6250 et seq.
- Must procure goods and services in compliance with applicable state and local laws, ordinances, rules, regulations, and policies.

The Department of Emergency Management is pleased to present the following Grant Report in summary of the above-referenced item submitted by the Department of Emergency Management.

Legislation For Approval: The proposed resolution seeks the Board of Supervisors' approval for the acceptance and expenditure of \$378,010 in funds from the California Office of Emergency Services (CalOES) to provide financial assistance to address the unique planning and equipment needs of high-threat, high-density Urban Areas, and assist those areas in building an enhanced and sustainable capacity to prevent, protect against, respond to, and improve from utility-led public safety power shutdown (PSPS) actions.

Departments: **Department of Emergency Management (DEM).** Department acts as the fiscal agent and expenditures benefit the agencies in the City. The City and County of San Francisco is the fiscal agent for the PSPS grant funds. DEM is responsible for administering the grant for the City and County of San Francisco and for ensuring that the grant funds are spent according to the grant and financial guidelines.

Amount: The FY 19 grant award represents funding allocated in \$378,010 for a total of FY 19 award for the purposes of funding PSPS projects by agreement of the DEM Approval Authority which acts as the executive steering committee.

<u>Grant Period:</u>	July1, 2019 through October 31, 2022
<u>Source of funds:</u>	Through the California Governor’s Office of Emergency Services. No match is required.
<u>Indirect Costs:</u>	The proposed resolution waives indirect costs, because the grant program does not allow the charging of indirect costs.
<u>Description:</u>	The proposed resolution authorizes the Department of Emergency Management to accept and expend a total of \$378,010 in grant funding from the FY 2019 Public Safety Public Shutdown (PSPS) Resiliency Allocation (Cal OES # 075-00000), issued by the California Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES).


