I first moved to San Francisco in 2004, for law school, and I have made it my home, living in several different neighborhoods, including SOMA, Nob Hill, the Inner Sunset, Lower Pac Heights, and now the Bayview. As a public defender I work with populations that are all too familiar with policing practices, and I am familiar with the courtroom and jail/prison settings in which people interact most frequently with the Sheriff's office. As a straight, white male I have always benefitted from the privilege of being given the benefit of the doubt by government institutions, and I have tried to put that privelege to use in criminal justice reform advocacy, including in support of actions organized and led by groups such as Wealth and Disparities in the Black Community - Justice 4 Mario Woods. My lived experience certainly does not encompass the great diversity of San Francisco, but I have always, and will always, focus on understanding the perspective of others, rather than centering my own, as that understanding makes me a better advocate.

Business and/or professional experience:

I began my career as a research attorney with the California Supreme Court in 2007. After two years I moved to my current office, the Office of the State Public Defender. As a Senior Deputy State Public Defender I work on complex litigation, preparing appeals from capital cases to the California Supreme Court. This work requires continual legal education as to California criminal law, the ability to digest huge case files and records, formulate creative legal arguments and navigate the labyrinthine postconviction systems. I have argued cases before several courts of appeal as well as the California Supreme Court. My work has ingrained in me a deep commitment to the right of due process, the protection of individuals from unfair and arbitrary use of systemic power. My experience has taught me that no one is irredeemable, everyone is more than their worst mistakes. Finally, my long exposure to the criminal justice system, particularly the death penalty system, has made it abundantly clear that our current systems are not adequately serving the goal of advancing public safety and, in some cases, harm the very communities these systems are charged with protecting.

Civic Activities:

I have been a member of California Attorneys for Criminal Justice for over six years, including as a Board member for three years. CACJ provides continuing education for the criminal defense bar and advocates in support of making our criminal justice system more fair. As a member of the legislative committee, I authored letters in support or opposition of proposed state legislation and participated in other advocacy work. I used to volunteer planting trees with Friends of the Urban Forest and in 2015 joined the advocacy team that helped strategize and advocate for a plan for what would eventually become 2016's Proposition E that resulted in the City adopting responsibility naintenance of street trees. In 2016 Lighted the re-formed San Francisco chanter of the Democratic Socialists of America and

I conducted over five hundred investigations, including allegations of unnecessary force, unwarranted detentions, searches and arrests, biased policing (including racial profiling), discourtesy and failure to perform a duty. In additions to volunteering on campaigns to establish, strengthen or defend civilian oversight of the San Francisco Police Department (described above), I also participated in the process of drafting and campaigning for Proposition D, the Charter amendment that established the Sheriff Department Oversight Board and Inspector General. I participated in meetings with Supervisor Walton to discuss the drafting of the Charter Amendment, reviewed and suggested (adopted) changes to its language, and campaigned for its passage, including co-signing a letter with other former DPA employees advocating for its passage. At all of these events, I listened attentively to concerns from community members about law enforcement in San Francisco.

I have played an active role in the law enforcement oversight community at the local and national level. I campaigned for the creation of the Office of Citizen Complaints (now the Department of Police Accountability) when the charter amendment to establish it was on the ballot in 1982. In 2003, I worked on the campaign to pass Proposition H, the police reform and accountability measure which gave the Board of Supervisors the power to appoint three of the 7 Police Commissioners, making that body more representative of San Francisco's diverse communities. In 2018, I volunteered with the campaign against Proposition H, the POAsponsored measure regarding Tasers that would have seriously undermined the authority of the Police Commission and civilian oversight in San Francisco.

As an Investigator at the Public Defender's Office and as a criminal defense investigator, I have been a member of the criminal defense community in San Francisco, serving indigent clients, many of them people of color.

I have a deep commitment and tremendous passion for civilian oversight of law enforcement and am a long-standing and active member of the law enforcement oversight community.

Business and/or professional experience:

(Continuation):

I created a formal training program for new investigators, wrote performance evaluation criteria for investigators and wrote explanations of agency procedures for police officers and complainants. I also served as the SEIU 1021 Shop Steward for the agency.

I also worked for the Office of Citizen Complaints as a supervising investigator during its first year of operation, from 1983 to 1984, where I wrote its first policy recommendation, mandating that SFPD officers wear their star numbers in visible numerals on their helmets.

After leaving DPA in 2017, I worked for three years for East Bay Municipal Utility District as a Senior Human Resources Analyst, investigating EEO complaints of discrimination and harassment. Since retiring from that position, I have been working on a temporary basis for the

Oakland Community Police Review Agency (CPRA) investigating the Oakland Police Department's handling of protests following George Floyd's murder.

I worked as an Investigator for the San Francisco Public Defender's Office for three years, conducting investigations for indigent defendants, most of them people of color. For 13 years, I was in private practice as an investigator, specializing in criminal defense investigation, typically for indigent clients represented by court-appointed attorneys. I also did considerable work on death penalty cases at the trial and appellate level, preparing a detailed and comprehensive life history of an individual charged with a capital offense. This involved conducting interviews with dozens of family members, friends, teachers, employers and institutional personnel, and gathering every relevant public and private document related to the defendant's life, ranging from school to criminal justice to medical to institutional records.

I have been an active member of the National Association for Civilian Oversight of Law Enforcement since 2003. I served on its Board of Directors for seven years, chaired its Professional Standards Committee, drafted its Qualification Standards for Oversight Investigators and Supervising Investigators, and its Recommended Training for Board and Commission Members. I also played a major role in drafting NACOLE's Code of Ethics. I currently serve on NACOLE's Training, Education and Standards Committee, and have conducted three NACOLE webinars since 2017, most recently in August 2021 on Conducting Effective Interviews. I have given training presentations at multiple NACOLE conferences and given presentations about civilian oversight of law enforcement to community groups in San Diego, Sonoma and Napa.

I also operate a small business conducting team-building events which teaches effective collaboration, problem-solving and decision-making skills.

Civic Activities:

(Continuation):

For over 30 years, I have organized the annual Chinese New Year Treasure Hunt, which has benefitted San Francisco-based non-profit agencies including Hamilton Family Center, Riley Center for Battered Women, Bay Area Women's and Children's Center, the San Francisco Food Bank and the San Francisco Circus Center. This event draws hundreds of participants (1800, at its height) who solve clues leading to overlooked treasure spots (many connected with local history and culture) in Chinatown and North Beach on the night of the annual Chinese New Year Parade.

I have also organized similar treasure hunts in Oakland (benefitting Game Theory Academy, an Oakland-based education nonprofit that teaches economic and strategic decision-making skills and creates job opportunities for East Bay youth), Sonoma (benefitting the Sonoma Community Center), and Berkeley (benefitting Berkeley public schools).

As a Muslim, formerly incarcerated and community organizer for all human rights, I am the symbol of the unified voice for freedom and justice from San Francisco and throughout the nation. After being incarcerated for over 31 years, advocating for judical reforms for youth offenders and serving my San Francisco community on the Re-entry Council, I am humbled to have the endoursement of the San Francisco Jail Justice Coalition as an appointee to the Sheriff's Department Oversight Committee.

I have direct professional experience working for nonprofit organizations and civic departments where I directly and personally assist formerly incarcerated individuals, contribute to better policy practices and the passing of reform bills. I believe we must work to reduce recidivism and enact sentencing reform through the appropriate governmental channels to ensure justice and safety for all. As a former youth offender whose length of incarceration was deemed unconstitutional as cruel and unusual by the California Appellate Court and upheld by the California Superior Court, I am especially passionate about justice and equity in sentencing. I bring an essential perspective to the SDOC as an individual was formerly incarcerated and as an individual who personally navigated the struggles of reintegration and works daily to assist others in their transition from the criminal justice system into society.

It is imperative that voices of those that were formerly incarcerated, and a member of the public that is currently working diligently within governmental structures are carefully considered to establish non-bias evaluations of the work of the OIG and review the Inspector General's individual work performance. Furthermore, compile and recommend law enforcement custodial and patrol best practices, after conducting thorough community outreach and receive community input regarding SFSD operations and jail conditions, by holding public meetings and soliciting input from persons incarcerated in the City and County. I am extremely fortunate to have direct experience studying sentencing patterns and working directly with nonprofit organizations (including Legal Services for Prisoners with Childern and Oakland Private Industry Council) that combat recidivism and mass incarceration. It prepared me for my membership on the Subcommittee for Direct Services. We have taken on the task of creating a public education campaign to education the community of San Francisco. The SDOB shall:

- (1) Appoint, and may remove, the Inspector General in the Sheriff's Department Office of Inspector General ("OIG"), established in subsection (d).
- (2) Evaluate the work of the OIG, and may review the Inspector General's individual work performance.

- (3) Compile, evaluate, and recommend law enforcement custodial and patrol best practices.
- (4) Conduct community outreach and receive community input regarding SFSD operations and jail conditions, by holding public meetings and soliciting input from persons incarcerated in the City and County.
- (5) Prepare and submit a quarterly report to the Sheriff and Board of Supervisors regarding the SDOB evaluations and outreach, and OIG reports submitted to SDOB.

Dear Supervisor Aaron Peskin, Supervisor Rafael Mandelman, and Supervisor Connie Chan:

I wanted to thank you for the opportunity to discuss my interest in the Sheriff's Department Oversight Board and give you some background on me and my work.

As a lawyer, advocate, and journalist, I have witnessed how mass incarceration is the most pressing problem of our time, impacting families, communities, and governments around the nation, and, particularly, California.

By way of background, I attended Harvard Law School, where I got my JD, and Columbia University, where I received an MFA in writing. Much of my prior work as a lawyer in New York City was representing clients on appeal from death sentences and working with survivors of domestic violence to obtain child custody, protection order, and support.

I lived in San Francisco full time from 2013 through 2019 (Inner Sunset) where I taught at City College and San Quentin in addition to working as a journalist reporting on the criminal legal system. (We have been splitting time between the Bay Area, staying in Marin, and Dallas, where my parents live and have needed assistance. We are actively in the process of moving back to San Francisco.) These experiences taught me the importance of listening to the voices of the incarcerated and the struggles of returning citizens. Much of my advocacy work prior to sheriffs was around the prosecutorial elections and advancing information about the importance of prosecutorial discretion.

When I first began working on sheriff accountability issues, I discovered that there was a lack of information about sheriffs and, as a result, a lack of public awareness about what questions to ask of a sheriff's office and how to begin reform. During a non-resident fellowship at the University of South Carolina School of Law, I worked with experts in policing and gathered information on sheriff requirements, training, and removal procedures in every state. This was the first project to gather this information in one place.

Since then, I have worked with the Justice Collaborative, the ACLU, Campaign Zero, and other local grassroots groups to educate the public on the role of sheriffs and the need for sheriff oversight and accountability. I regularly present information to community groups so people can learn about their sheriff, including issues like LGBTQ concerns, harm reduction, and mental health. I have also done the only scholarship on the role of sheriffs in evictions. During the pandemic, I helped gather a group of sheriffs who signed on in a pledge to decarcerate their jails to reduce the threat of COVID-19 to staff, those incarcerated, and the public at large. I also assisted with policy and testimony for Senator Weiner's SB 271, which would widen the pool for sheriff candidates in California. For many local groups, I have helped design policy platforms for future demands and recruit new candidates to run for sheriff.

This month, I am assisting with the launch of Communities for Sheriff Accountability, which is a coalition of grassroots groups – including Faith in Action, the Advancement

Project, and the Workers' Party – to help create more public awareness of the role of sheriffs.

As you know, California is on the vanguard for sheriff oversight, and this is both exciting and overdue. For a long time, sheriffs have operated their offices in the shadow, even though what they do is immensely important. For one thing, sheriffs operate jails, which are mass incarceration's front door. So many more people will experience the inside of a jail cell than they will state prison. Substantial research shows that jails are incredibly dangerous and the site of a great deal of trauma – more people will commit suicide within the first few days of arrest – in addition to the prevalence of individuals with mental health challenges, those experiencing poverty and houselessness, and those in withdrawal. And, because of realignment and other California policies, jails in California hold more people, who have greater needs, for longer periods of time.

Second, sheriffs are important in many civil and criminal enforcement matters. Sheriffs oversee weapons permits and protective orders. They also carry out evictions. These are matters that impact so many people, but especially those already experiencing trauma and who have been neglected by other systems.

My vision for the San Francisco Sheriff Department – and the Civilian Oversight Committee – is to align on goals for accountability and transparency. While the San Francisco Sheriff has already done a great deal to improve the availability of data to the people of the country, it is important to do more, both to help people in the community understand what happens inside jails and to help the office improve. Tracking who is in jail, for how long, and what happens once they see a judge, are vital to helping out community.

Of immense importance – critical to the health of the entire community – is to think about the conditions of the San Francisco jail system and how to alleviate the trauma for those who are incarcerated and who work there. Indeed, jails are dangerous for everyone; the pandemic has made this very clear. And, for those who are already experiencing disproportionate harm, jails compound the concerns. LGBTQ individuals, for example, experience great violence in society and even more so inside jails, where they are more likely to be assaulted or have traumatic experiences that make returning to the community so difficult. People with long-term mental health diagnoses and substance use disorder often end up in jail, are unable to pay bail, and may stay for longer periods of time.

Jails are, in fact, a vital part of the community. It may seem strange to put it this way, but society as a whole cannot tackle challenges rooted in racism and inequity without examining its jail and policing systems. COVID-19 had made it plain that communities are interconnected. We are none of us an island, and we must all work together to achieve the vision that I, you, and so many San Francisco residents want for our children.

I look forward to working with you, discussing my vision for the sheriff's office, and sharing in the important work you do to improve out community. Thank you for the time, and please reach out if you have questions or want to discuss.
