1	[Resolution of Intention - Street Name Change - Donner Avenue to Charlie Way]
2	
3	Resolution declaring the intention of the Board of Supervisors to rename Donner
4	Avenue between Arelious Walker Drive and West Harney Way, which is a street located
5	in Alice Griffith Public Housing, to Charlie Way.
6	
7	WHEREAS, Donner Avenue is the name of the public right-of-way inside of the Alice
8	Griffith Housing Projects; and
9	WHEREAS, Alice Griffith Housing Projects, formerly known, as Double Rock, is where
10	a young ten-year-old Charlie Walker and his family planted their first California roots after
11	leaving Vicksburg, Mississippi in 1943 escaping Jim Crow and massive lynching; and
12	WHEREAS, Charlie Walker like most Black migrants from the deep south, was placed
13	in segregated public housing communities in San Francisco; Charlie's family resided at 211
14	Double Rock Road Building 32-R; and
15	WHEREAS, Charlie Walker at the age of 14 1/2 forged his own birth certificate and
16	entered the US Air Force where he was heavily trained on weaponry and war fighting
17	principles; and
18	WHEREAS, Charlie Walker was one of the first Black employees for the San Francisco
19	Chronicle, under the supervision of Mr. Gilroy, Charlie was able to convince Mr. Gilroy that
20	expanding paper route services in the Fillmore areas would be just as lucrative as it was in the
21	white areas because black people also liked to read the paper; Charlie dispelled the myth that
22	Black residents were less likely to pay for their subscriptions; and
23	WHEREAS, Charlie Walker led protests in the 1960s to open public construction jobs
24	to Black contracts who were being shunned and deliberately passed over for white contractors

and white-dominated unions; Charlie Walker and his team of organizers were able to garner
 huge contracts on the BART construction; and

- WHEREAS, Charlie Walker and five other community men armed with weaponry came to City Hall to secure then-Assembly Member, Willie Brown, to exit out of City Hall after the assassination of Mayor George Moscone and Supervisor Harvey Milk; and
- 6 WHEREAS, In the early 1990s, Charlie wrote an opinion column in the New Bayview 7 Newspaper called "Why Has Nothing Worked?" and he provided the following solution to San 8 Francisco Black Community: "There is but one way to come up from under the madness, we 9 must own and operate the businesses in our community;" and
- 10 WHEREAS, In the late 1990s, Charlie Walker wrote a book called "America is Still the 11 Place" detailing the racism he faced during Standard Oil spill of the 1970s; the Book spun into 12 a decade long public access television show titled after the book and in 2016, the book was 13 turned into a film under the same name that won several awards; and
- WHEREAS, In the late 1990s, Charlie became a school reformer and was instrumental
 in brokering a black-centered parochial school, Muhammad University, to the children of
 Bayview Hunter's Point; Charlie was tired of Black children especially Black boys being
 suspended and expelled out of San Francisco Public Schools and wanted a K-12 alternative;
 and
- WHEREAS, Charlie Walker has inspired multiple generations of community leaders
 including his daughter, Yolanda Jones, who owns and operates Y-CAT Construction; which,
 hires over 30 individuals from District 10 community and his granddaughter, Geoffrea Morris,
 Reentry Advocate and co-founder of Parks 94124, which garnered state funding to restore
 Hunters Point's Hilltop Park which was completed in 2016; and
 WHEREAS, Charlie Walker's grit is embedded in the fabric of Bayview Hunters Point
 activism and politics; and

WHEREAS, Charlie remains a beloved warrior and crusader for the many black and
 minority business owner who have been disenfranchised out of the workforce or business
 opportunities; and

WHEREAS, Charlie Walker is more than a trucker, business owner, social justice icon,
he is the "Mayor of Bayview Hunter's Point," and one of the fathers of Black own businesses
in San Francisco and in June of 2019, he was awarded the Lifetime Achievement Award by
the African American Chamber of Commerce; and

8 WHEREAS, Charlie Walker loves the City and County of San Francisco and remain an 9 outspoken activist in the Bayview Hunters Point Community even at the age of 86; and

WHEREAS, Charlie Walker is integral figure that is woven into fabric of San Francisco
 neighborhood politics with his name being synonymous with words Bayview Hunters Point;
 now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors intends to rename Donner Avenue to
Charlie Way to enshrine his legacy, and to mark his permanent transformation for the fight for
Black and Minority business in City and County of San Francisco, and, be it,

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors directs Public Works to initiate the City's Street renaming procedures, expeditiously process the required actions related to renaming, coordinate with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors' Office regarding posted and published notice for the street renaming, report to the Board on its findings so that the Board may officially rename the street.
