 - Generator fuel and fuel storage; and
 - o Redundant emergency communications (e.g., battery-powered radios).
- Plans

- Must provide two reports on the expenditures of the funds. The first report is

 report shall also identify the specific outcomes achieved by each project

- Must coordinate with their city or county planning agency to ensure that the project is in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (Public Resources Code, Section 21000 et seq.).

Legislation For Approval: The proposed resolution seeks the Board of Supervisors' approval for the acceptance and expenditure of \$378,010 in funds from the California Office of Emergency Services (CalOES) to provide financial assistance to address the unique planning and equipment needs of high-threat, high- density Urban Areas, and assist those areas in building an enhanced and sustainable capacity to prevent, protect against, respond to, and improve from utility-led public safety power shutdown (PSPS) actions.
