San Francisco City Attorney's Office

Public law office led by independently elected City Attorney Dennis J. Herrera

- Advises the City and County of San Francisco and its boards, commissions, departments, and officials
- Represents the City as civil plaintiff and defendant
- Represents the People of the State of California civilly in Unfair Competition Law and public nuisance cases
- City contracts drafts and approves as to form
- Legislation drafts and approves as to form

City Attorney teams involved in 2861-2899 San Bruno matter

- Public Integrity Team
 - Investigates potential City employee misconduct and pursues remedies, including against private parties
 - Works with Controller on joint corruption investigation
- Labor Team
 - Works with Public Integrity Team and City departments on formal discipline for employee misconduct
- Land Use Team
 - Advises Planning and DBI on legalization issues

City Attorney teams involved in 2861-2899 San Bruno matter

- Code Enforcement Team
 - Investigates properties referred by City departments, officials, employees, and the public
 - Assists City code enforcement staff (e.g., DBI, City Planning, Fire)
 - Uses civil law enforcement powers to...
 - Immediately abate health and safety hazards
 - Permanently abate code violations by legalization
 - Secure monetary penalties to punish violators

City Attorney response to 2861-2899 San Bruno violations Coordinating immediate City response Ensuring relevant City departments are involved Working with City departments to identify and remediate immediate health and safety hazards. Fire Department orders regarding inadequate egress ▶ DBI assessment re: occupancy pending legalization Communicating safety demands to property owners, threatening litigation if there is noncompliance

City Attorney response to 2861-2899 San Bruno violations

- Ensuring long-term abatement of code violations
 - Monitoring owners' progress toward legalization
 - City departments determine substantive policy matters
 - Whether owners' legalization plans comply with codes
 - Discretionary review to approve specific legalization plan
 - Setting deadlines for administrative steps
 - ► As needed, City Attorney advising on legal issues
 - Settlement agreement requires abatement

City Attorney response to 2861-2899 San Bruno violations

- Punishment via monetary penalties
 - City Attorney has authority to obtain civil penalties as punishment for past violations, plus attorney's fees
 - Per settlement, owners must pay \$1.2MM
 - Settlement does not preclude further penalties if owners fail to comply with City department orders regarding legalization
 - City Attorney does not have criminal prosecution authority, and City Attorney settlements cannot preclude criminal prosecution

City Attorney response to 2861-2899 San Bruno violations

- Investigating unethical or illegal conduct
 - Investigation of San Bruno events is part of the City Attorney's ongoing Public Integrity investigation with the Controller, into unethical and illegal conduct
 - Working with Controller and with new DBI leadership to prevent similar failures in the future
 - Identifying and investigating other properties and/or personnel for review, investigation, and response
