Supervisors Melgar, Peskin, and Preston,

I love Kid Safe JFK, and want it to become permanent without a private car cut-through at 8th Avenue. I support Kid Safe SF's efforts to save this serene, safe, and joyous space in the middle of Golden Gate Park.

Most of Supervisor Chan's resolution is excellent — improving Muni connections and the park shuttle, taking full advantage of the underutilized 836-space Music Concourse Garage, adding more parking for people with disabilities, and providing free garage parking to drivers with disabilities and underserved residents will make the park more accessible and equitable for all.

However, I strongly oppose the section calling for private-car traffic entering JFK Drive at 8th Avenue.

Adding private-car traffic to this busy area at the heart of the park would rip this beach-to-bay car-free connection in half, put children at risk of traffic violence in our pedestrian oasis, slow Muni service, and lead to cut-through traffic.

Muni's 44-O'Shaughnessy, a Muni equity strategy route which connects the southeastern neighborhoods directly to Golden Gate Park, will be slowed by car traffic if the 8th Avenue entrance is opened to cars. Over the last 18 months as 8th avenue has been a transit-only entrance, the 44 has seen 3 minute travel time improvements through the park.

The park and the museums are still just as accessible to all, including people with disabilities, without cars on car-free JFK at 8th Avenue, because drivers can still drive around the Music Concourse and have direct access to the museums through the garage. For museum visitors with disabilities, the closest access to the museums is the garage.

I, along with Kid Safe SF, ask that the resolution be amended to:

- 1) Prohibit private vehicles entering JFK Drive at 8th Avenue. Make this whole entrance a transit-only red lane, which would include access for taxis and paratransit. Those who need to drive to the park already have great access to the Music Concourse via the garage and surrounding streets.
- 2) Include a commitment that all the existing sections of car-free JFK be maintained as-is, without compromises that put cars back on any of this peaceful & safe section of Golden Gate Park. All access issues are being addressed without destroying this peaceful promenade with

the noise, danger and exhaust of cars.

## Dear Chair Melgar, Vice Chair Preston, and Supervisor Peskin:

I strongly support the provisions of the "Beach to Bay" resolution that call for (1) creating a car-free route through Golden Gate Park from Stanyon Street to Ocean Beach for pedestrians and bicyclists; (2) increasing the accessibility of the Park from low-income, historically underserved communities and for low-income households; (3) improving public transit service to the Park from all San Francisco neighborhoods; and (4) enhancing pedestrian and bicycle connections to the Park.

Other elements of the resolution, however, conflict those goals or the Transit First mandates of San Francisco's Charter. Providing free parking to affluent residents of Russian Hill, Telegraph Hill, and Westwood Park and to wealthy retirees from Atherton, Belvedere, and Blackhawk who possess a disabled persons placard does nothing to advance equity and undermines the City's Transit First policies.

I urge the Committee to revise the Resolution in the following respects:

- 1. Limit any reduced-price parking in the Music Concourse garage to low-income households. In particular, allowing all residents of the four specified zip codes to park in the garage for free conflicts with the requirement of the Charter that parking policies for areas well served by transit must encourage travel by transit and alternative transportation. The zip codes are not well-tailored to encompass lower income neighborhoods with poor transit access to the park. At least two of the zip codes include substantial areas that are not remotely lower income. Zip code 94112, where I live, includes Westwood Park, Mission Terrace, and parts of Sunnyside. In addition, Muni routes 29 and 43 both directly connect neighborhoods throughout 94112 to Golden Gate Park in substantially less than one hour. Zip code 94133 includes much of the Telegraph Hill and Russian Hill neighborhoods, while excluding much of Chinatown.
- 2. Possession of a Disabled Person Placard should not by itself entitle a person to park for free within the Concourse garage. Disabled Person Placards are provided to individuals without regard to income or wealth. The placard program is also notoriously subject to abuse.
- 3. The 8th Avenue/Fulton Street entrance should not be reopened to cars. Opening the 8th Avenue entrance is likely to lead to conflicts between cars, bicyclists, and pedestrians. Vehicles with disabled, senior, or limited mobility visitors approaching the Park from the north should instead be encouraged to use the 10th Avenue entrance to the Music Concourse garage. By driving through the garage, they may gain access to the museums, the concourse, and the ADA parking behind the band shell.
